In addition to Association activities, Mr. Boykiw coached a lacrosse team in the Calgary Willow Ridge Community from 1974 to 1982, with the Pee Wee team winning the gold medal in the B Division at the Pee Wee Nationals in 1982. Two of the players from the team, John Kilbride and Jason Wulder, went on to play professional lacrosse, most recently for the Calgary Roughnecks.

Mr. Boykiw was the leader for CDLA and ALA use of bingos and casinos for fundraising. Mr. Boykiw is particularly proud of his efforts as President of the ALA in starting the free back pad program for new clubs, which together with his many trips to Red Deer resulted in the establishment of lacrosse in Red Deer. The vision was to have lacrosse established well enough in Alberta to have it as an Alberta Games sport.
