INTRODUCTION

Harris Toth's association with minor sport in the Province of Alberta began in 1974.

Prior to Harris beginning his outstanding service to the sport of lacrosse in Alberta, he honed his volunteering skills in sports such as softball, baseball, bantam football and hockey. His duties were varied and included that of coach, manager, umpire, treasurer, president and director.

Harris' career in lacrosse began in 1982 when his two sons, Joseph and Kaleb, began playing the sport in the community of Willowridge. Harris' involvement continues today, 22 years after he first fell in love with the game of lacrosse. It is this long-standing service for which I am nominating him for election to the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame in the Builder Category for the Sport of Lacrosse.

- One of the first Calgary area coaches to take teams into British Columbia. Main purpose was to introduce Alberta players to a higher level of competition, making them better players. As a result of this initiative, it provided Alberta players the opportunity to go play in leagues that would help to increase their level of play and skills.

- Founded the Rocky Mountain Challenge Tournament (1993) for post-midget lacrosse players to coincide with the Canada Day Lacrosse Tournament.
