## APPENDIX: Curling Alberta Mixed Provincial Championships 2018-19

See below for competition specific details. The rules and details contained in the main body of the Competitor's Guide apply to this competition. In the event there is a perceived conflict between the Competitor's Guide and this appendix, this appendix is considered to take priority.

This appendix is subject to further review and evaluation on, at minimum, an annual basis.

An eligibility change effective 2018-2019, applies to competitors with a potential date conflict. See Curling Alberta's Competitor's Guide for complete detail; the changes relevant to mixed are summarized below:

- Teams competing in a Curling Alberta Provincial Qualifier do so with the knowledge that they must continue to play at all levels, up to and including the Provincial Championships, until they are eliminated. Teams will not be given the opportunity to replace team members unless it is due to any of the circumstances listed in section 13(a) of the Competitor's Guide.
- In effect, this means a competitor may enter the Mixed category and another category as long as there is no date conflict up to and including the Provincial Championship.

## A. PROVINCIAL QUALIFIERS:

- 1. The details and format are as described in section 1 of the Curling Alberta Provincial Berth Policy.
- 2. Eight provincial berths are awarded in total, all through results at the Provincial Qualifiers. There are no pre-qualifying berths in the Mixed category.
- 3. All games are 8 ends.
- 4. There are no "free agents" or 5th players in any Curling Alberta Mixed competition.
- 5. Teams MUST play with 4 players, 2 men and 2 women alternating delivery of stones.
- 6. The deadline for entry, for the 2018/19 season, is noon on February 13, 2019.

## **B. PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP**

- 1. The Provincial Championship is an 8 team full round-robin with playoffs.
- 2. All games are 8 ends and are timed.
- 3. Playoffs
  - a. After the round-robin, the first place team will advance to the finals.
  - b. The second and third place teams will play in a semi-final with the winner advancing to the finals (see Playoffs section C (8) in the Competitor's Guide for complete details, including the procedure in the event of a tie for a playoff position).
- 4. The draw and schedule for the 2019 Provincial Championships will be supplied to all teams and posted on the Curling Alberta website.
- 5. Teams will draw for hammer (LSD) in pre-game practice (broom holder and deliverer must be opposite gender)
