The Peewee AA Braves were named League Champions of the Hockey Edmonton Clagget Division which earned them a spot at the Peewee AA Provincial Championship held in Edmonton on March 30-April 2, 2017. The Beaumont Peewee AA Braves maintained a 0-1-3 record in the round robin games, securing a place in the Bronze medal game but they were unable to clinch the win.

The Peewee 1 Braves secured a spot at the Peewee A Provincial Championship to represent Zone 4 after defeating Devon, Sylvan Lake, and Red Deer in provincial playdowns. Provincials were held in Lloydminster on March 23-26, 2017. The Beaumont Peewee 1 Braves finished with a 2-2-0 record in the provincial tournament.

The Bantam 1 Braves defeated Red Deer and Wetaskiwin to earn their spot as Zone 4 Champions at the Bantam A Provincial Championship in Grande Prairie on March 16-19, 2017. The Beaumont Bantam 1 Braves went 0-3-1 in the provincial tournament.
