

The 6th Annual Valley First Indoor Soccer Tournament Frequently Asked Questions and Answers

What is the number of games we get to play?

Each team will play 3 round robin games against teams in their division. The U14 and U16 divisions will have the top two teams will then play for 1st and the two bottom teams for 3rd; resulting in 4 games total. The U8, U10 and U12 divisions will only play round robin games.

Do I have to register with a team?

You may register as an individual, or with your current indoor soccer team. You may not create your own team with players from various indoor soccer teams. Additional players needed will be added by the organization.

What if my entire indoor team can't register?

You may still enter as a team and then other individuals will be placed on your team.

When are the games?

The game will be held from March 17th – 19th, 2017 at the Capital News Center.

How many players can be on the roster?

First players that are on the current 2016/2017 Indoor Soccer Team will be placed together, if extra are needed, then the Tournament Organizers will add more if other Registered Individuals are without a team.

What do coaches need to supply?

Coaches do not need to provide anything unless they wish to bring warm up balls but there rarely is time for warm up. Game balls will be provided by the Tournament organizers.

What are you supplying for the tournament?

We supply fields, pinnies, referees, chief referee, game balls, and medals for the top three teams in each division.

How do you resolve a tie between teams?

If a tie exists between potential finalists at the end of round robin play, a winner shall be declared as follows:

- Goals For (Max 3 Per Game); Goals Against (Max 3 per game); Penalty Kicks
- Example: If Team A has 3 goals against and 5 goals for and Team B has 3 goals against and 4 goals for; Team A would be placed ahead of Team B because they have more goals for than Team B. If both teams had the same amount for both, then Penalty Kicks would determine the superior team.

No score will be held for the U8, U10, and U12 divisions.

What is the process of appeal for calls during games?

There is no appeal process – the referee's decisions stand on all matters.

When do I have to register by?

Registration will close on March 5th, 2017
