Volunteer Activities

The success of Fort Saskatchewan Soccer and the subsequent development and enjoyment of our members depends on volunteers. There are many positions, which if volunteers did not fill, would result in children not being able to play soccer.

It takes over 25,000 volunteer hours each year to provide soccer programs to the over 1,000 children which register each year.

The Fort Saskatchewan Soccer Executive Committee accepts the need to promote 'volunteerism' and a more active participation of our Members. The aim of our Volunteer Deposit Policy (see "Policies" tab) is to develop volunteer involvement in support of the Fort Saskatchewan Soccer programs.
