- I recognize officials are being developed in the same manner as players, and will be supportive of their decisions during games.

#### Officials corner

#### A reminder...

another new hockey season is underway and with that there will be a number of new first year officials starting to officiate. As with any new skill, it takes time to learn so please realize and be respectful of that. Hockey should be fun for all participants including the on-ice officials. Our referees should want to return to the rink to officiate and not to feel intimidated or endure abusive comments that discourage or prevent their wanting to participate. On-ice officials are there to enforce the rules of hockey and keep the game as safe as possible for all players. FMHA / ORA (Okotoks Referee Association) takes a zero tolerance stance against any referee abuse. I would ask that you treat all on ice officials with respect and as if it was one of your family members out there on the ice. Please think twice before you make any abusive comments. There are officials that will not be returning this year because of abusive comments.

#### General information...

Some general information regarding officiating: you must be minimum of 13 years of age before Dec.31 for that hockey season before you can start officiating. The FMHA would encourage both girls and boys to get involved with being an onice official. You have to attend a referee clinic each year. If you live within the FMHA boundaries and want to be a referee, you would be a member of the Okotoks Referee Association - they do all the assigning of games and are responsible for mentorship and supervisions of referees. Also, if you live within the FMHA boundaries, FMHA will help cover the costs (\$100 to help cover clinic fee and related equipment required to officiate) for first year officials. (note: there is a minimum requirement to officiate at least 3 games to qualify for the \$100 reimbursement from FMHA). Being an on-ice official is a great way to make some money, learn the rules of hockey, learn new skills and have some fun.
