

Hockey Edmonton NOVICE Program – 2018 Summer Update

August 21, 2018

The Hockey Edmonton Novice Committee has met several times throughout the Spring and Summer to develop the 2018-19 Hockey Edmonton Novice Transition Program. <u>The Committee will meet a few</u> <u>more times before the start of the season, to sort out the final operational and logistical items.</u> Please recognize the most current and relevant program adjustments and updates before the 2018-19 season:

NOVICE PROGRAM OPERATIONS:

- All Hockey Edmonton DOA's MUST utilize **blue pucks** for Novice practices and games;
 - **Please note:** Hockey Edmonton will be providing DOA's with the appropriate amounts of blue pucks. DOA's will be provided with these pucks before the start of the 2018-19 season;
- Regulation sized nets will be used for both Novice practices and games;
- <u>Minor Novice:</u> half-ice practices, half-ice games;
 - No scorekeeping, no standings;
 - No full-time goaltenders;
 - Minor Novice half-ice game rules will be supplied by Hockey Canada/Alberta with some small modifications made by the Hockey Edmonton Novice Committee;
 - Major Novice: half-ice practices, full-ice games;
 - Scorekeeping, hidden standings;
 - No full-time goaltenders;
 - Major Novice full-ice game rules will remain the same.

NOVICE PROGRAM COACH EDUCATION:

- DOA's should make note of the following NCCP Coach education components for Minor Novice and Major Novice level coaches:
 - Hockey Canada Coach 1 (One Team Official per 10 Players);
 - Hockey Canada Safety (One Team Official);
 - Respect in Sport (all Team Officials);
 - Hockey Edmonton Minor Novice Coach Meetings (all Team Officials);
 - Hockey Edmonton Major Novice Coaches Meeting (with Atom) (all Team Officials);
- Hockey Edmonton Minor Novice Coach Meetings have been posted on the Hockey Edmonton website. Registration will commence on September 1, 2018. Meetings will be 2-hours in length and are mandatory for ALL Hockey Edmonton Minor Novice Team Officials. Please <u>CLICK HERE</u> for further information;

NOVICE PROGRAM TEAM STRUCTURE:

- Both Minor Novice and Major Novice DOA's will follow the new Alberta One Standardized Tiering Model, when creating their respective Novice teams. Please <u>CLICK HERE</u> for further information;
 - <u>Minor Novice roster size:</u> 18 minima, 20 maximum (mandatory);
 - Major Novice roster size: 15 minima, 16 maximum (mandatory).

NOVICE PROGRAM SCHEDULE:

Please note the following scheduling logistics and dates of significance for the 2018-19 Hockey Edmonton Novice Program:

- Consistent times and locations for Novice ice-sessions were desired;
- **MOST** half-ice practices will be scheduled at the pre-identified "practice facilities";
- ALL half-ice games will be scheduled at one of the pre-identified "game/board facilities";
- Full-ice games will be located across the city, with geographic advantages;
 - <u>2019 Quickcard Edmonton Minor Hockey Week:</u> BOTH Minor Novice and Major Novice will participate in mid-January 2019;
 - <u>Playoffs</u>: Major Novice teams will participate in the same Novice playoff format as last season;
 - Minor Novice Winter Jamboree: March 9-10, 2019 <u>CLICK HERE</u>. All Minor Novice teams will end the season with two-games at the Minor Novice Winter Jamboree.

ATHLETE ACCELERATION & DECELERATION

- During the Spring of 2017, The Hockey Edmonton Board of Directors voted to NOT allow any underage/accelerated player applications from Initiation Program (TIMBITS) to Novice;
- During the Spring of 2018, The Hockey Edmonton Board of Directors voted to NOT allow any underage/accelerated player applications from the Novice Program to Atom;
- Deceleration is possible for 7-year-old Minor Novice athletes;
- Deceleration is possible for 8-year-old Major Novice athletes;
 - There will be no players affiliations from Timbits to Minor Novice, and Minor Novice to Major Novice.
