Hockey Regina Inc U13 Hockey Program

<u>Overview</u>

- For U13, the City will be a divided into one (1) zone.
- For U13 there will be 4 tiers; AA, A, B and C. A player will have the ability to register to try out for AA, A, B or C. It is the understanding that registering for AA, A or B does not guarantee a placement on a AA, A or B team.
- To be eligible for the AA, A or B team selection draft, all players must be registered for and attend the evaluations of that particular Tier. Late registrations and transfers for AA, A and B will be accepted up to the final evaluation session of that particular Tier.

Team Concept

1. Team formation

Teams will be formed based on the leveling principle. The purpose of this leveling formulation is to provide more enjoyment by practicing, learning and playing with players of similar skills, abilities and desires.

2. All players will be evaluated as per the U13 Evaluation Procedure document. The number of teams in AA/A/B will be based on the above grid system. Any deviation from this prescribed leveling regulation shall require permission of the HRI Board.

Preferable team numbers for U13 are 15 skaters and 2 goalies per team. The exact roster size to be approved by the Division Director.

3. Team playing rules

- AA
- Teams will play in the Regina Division of the Sask AA Hockey League (SAAHL)
- Each team will play 24 league games
- Each team will receive approximately 45 HRI assigned practices
- Game length will be 120 minutes: 5 minute warm-up, 3-20 minute stop time periods; ice cleaned every two periods
- A
- Each team will play approximately 24 league games
- Each team will receive approximately 40 HRI assigned practices
- $\circ\,$ Game length will be 120 minutes: 5 minute warm-up, 3-20 minute
- stop time periods; ice cleaned every two periods
- B
- Each team will play approximately 24 league games
- Each team will receive approximately 35 HRI assigned practices
- Game length will be 120 minutes: 5 minute warm-up, 3-20 minute stop time periods; ice cleaned every two periods
- C
- o Each team will play approximately 24 league games
- $\,\circ\,$ Each team will receive approximately 30 HRI assigned practices
- Game length will be 90 minutes: 5 minute warm-up, 1st period 15 minutes, 2nd and 3rd periods 20 minutes; all periods stop time

4. Playoffs

- All teams shall make the playoffs
- Teams must be available for all scheduled playoff games. Teams forfeiting playoff games will be subject for disqualification from the remainder of the playoffs.
- The playoffs shall be a double knockout format for A, B and C. For AA, they will follow the rules of the SAAHL

5. **Provincials**

- For AA, the playoff champion of the Regina Division will be the HRI provincial rep.
- For A+B, the top four Regina teams will be eligible for the HRI provincial playoff round.
- The top four teams are determined by league standings for all league games

played up to and including January 31 based on the best point percentage.

• The 1st place team will play the 4th place team and the 2nd place team will play the 3rd place team in a two-game-total goal series.

• The winners of the 1v 4 and the 2 v 3 series will play in a Modified best of three series to determine HRI's provincial representative. Modified Best of three rules:

- If the first game is tied, it will remain tied
- If one team wins game 1 and ties game 2, the team with the win will be the series winner
- If the teams split the two games, then a 10-minute Mini-Game will be played. The Mini-game will not be sudden death; it will be played in a 5 v 5 format.
