ARENAS

The 2018 Ice Melter Tournament will be played out of the following 3 arenas, with 4 surfaces:

- 1) Cold Lake Energy Centre
 - 7825 51 St, Cold Lake, T9M 0B6
 - Two pads are located here, Imperial Oil Place, and Reid Field House
 - This is the tournaments "Home Base", where you will find vendors, our awesome raffle table, as well as committee members, for any questions you may have. All draws will also be carried out at this location.
- 2) Cold Lake North Arena
 - 1703 6 St, Cold Lake, T9M 1L5
 - There will be a concession available on site.
- 3) JJ Parr Sports Centre
 - Kingsway Rd, 4 Wing Cold Lake, T0A 0T0
 - All lacrosse games will take place at the red rink.

TOURNAMENT RULES:

- 1) The Alberta Lacrosse Association (ALA) Rules will be in effect unless otherwise noted.
- 2) Game sheets must be prepared a minimum of 15 minutes prior to scheduled game time. They will be available at the host table at the Energy Centre, and the raffle table for Cold Lake North and JJParr. The winning team is responsible for uploading the results to the website, or texting an image of the results to 780-545-9044, and for returning the completed game sheet to the table immediately following the game for verification.
- 3) If team colors are similar, the home team shall be required to change jerseys. All teams must have two sets of jerseys, with the home team wearing light, and away wearing dark.
- 4) Each team will supply two volunteers to work the box during the game. (Timekeeper, Shot Clock, Score-sheet and Penalty door). These people will remain neutral during the course of the game.
- 5) The 30-second clock will be in effect for all levels.
- 6) Each participating team must provide proof of age for all players listed on the roster.
- 7) There will be no affiliations. Any changes to the roster (i.e. player absence) must be made prior to the start of the first game.
- 8) All games must begin and end on time. On the floor warm-ups and rest periods may be restricted or eliminated if games fall behind schedule.
- 9) Game times are as follows;
 - Tyke three (3) fifteen runtime periods, no clock stoppage (1 hr time allowance).
 - Novice three (3) fifteen runtime periods, no clock stoppage (1 hr time allowance).
 - Peewee two (2) fifteen and one (1) twenty minute stop time periods (1.5 hr time allowance).
 - Bantam three (3) twenty minute stop time periods (2 hr time allowance).
 - Midget three (3) twenty minute stop time periods (2 hr time allowance).

10) Point allocation in the round robin games will be as follows;

• Win - 2 Points, Loss - 0 Points

11) Overtime: All games will be played out (including round robin).

- In Round Robin there will be five (5) minute sudden victory periods until a goal is scored. There will be one (1) minute rest period between each five (5) minute period.
- In Medal games only as per CLA. Rule 20: exception is made to rest time between periods, which will be (5) minutes. A one-minute rest period will be granted before the overtime period.

- 12) All referee decisions during the course of the tournament, are final. Abuse in any manner of referees, officials, or volunteers, will not be tolerated and may be grounds for expulsion of the individual or team at the discretion of the tournament committee.
- 13) The tournament committee will follow ALA rules in addressing any and all misconduct. These decisions will be final.
 - Please refer to regulation 17 for all automatic and other suspensions, as these will be adhered to throughout our tournament (attached).
- 14) Teams and/or individuals will be responsible for any damage done to any of the facilities use for this tournament. Those causing the damage will be expelled from the tournament and billed for damages.
- 15) Coaches and players are responsible for cleaning the bench and dressing room at the end of each game.
- 16) Mercy Rule Any game that has a goal differential of six (6) goals or more shall be played at run time from that point forward. Only if the goal differential becomes four (4) goals or less, does the game revert back to stop time. At no time shall a goal differential of more than six (6) goals be displayed on the scoreboard, but all goals will still continue to be recorded on the score sheet.
- 17) 1st and 2nd place teams will receive medals. In divisions with multiple pools, this will be determined by a cross-over game between the 1st place team in each pool. 1st place for each division will also be awarded the applicable banner.

If two or more teams are tied after the round robin, the following rules will be used to determine placement;

- If two teams are tied, the winner of the game or games between the two teams advances. If a tie still exists, the goal average formula listed below will be used.
- If three or more teams are tied, and if one team has defeated the other teams with which it is tied after round robin play, the team shall advance. Otherwise the team with the best goal average shall advance.
- The goal average is calculated by dividing the total goals for, by the total goals for plus the total goals against. Only the goals scored in games between the tied teams is used in the goal average formula for tie breaking. The team with the greater resultant number shall advance.

The formula is applied once to rank all tied teams.

• If a tie still exists between teams, the winner of the game(s) between the two teams advances.

SAFETY AND INJURY MANAGEMENT

We strongly encourage all teams visiting the tournament to have an emergency measures plan in place, i.e. Alberta/Sask health care information. Each team should have with them a medical history card for each player.

Serious or potentially serious injuries are to be reported to a committee member or the rink boss. Incident report forms can be found at the host table for each rink. First aid kits, ice and other basic injury care tools will be available at each rink.
