# 5. SAMBA Executive and Directors Reports

- a. President (report attached)
  - Thanks to volunteers of community and support of the City of St. Albert. "Can't do it without the community". Rick spoke to conditions of the clubhouse, thanks to Rod Beck for excellent work he's done
  - Rick spoke about initiatives of the Board over the past year (preferred vendors, coach selection committee, inventory purging)
  - 2008 Business Objectives 3 year vision- To see what we hope for the association to look like in the next 3-5 years. Who are the partners going to be?
  - Rep & House program review what works? What doesn't work? Defining what success means- Player retention & recruitment
  - Umpire retention and recruitment was a challenge over the past year. There are definite opportunities to improve

- Finance Treasurer manages MANY transactions, looking at enhancing what our financial statements look like. Separating House & Rep programs
- Facilities improvements over the next 3-5 years
- Rick spoke of potential new initiatives and committees we will be working on for the next year
- Rick thanks Bob C. for his excellent work on the winter & spring camps this past year
- b. Vice President
  - John spoke about our commitment to hold 6 (or more) World Juniors games here July 25-Aug 3. We are going to partner with City of St. Albert – it's a World Class Event. Hopefully other partners of the community to help out with this event
  - Umpires very challenging to have umpires for each game but it was managed. We will NEED to have more umpires this year, and we're looking at ways of attracting more umpires & retaining them. Increase fees? Pay more regularly (rather than once per month)? Hoping parents from each team will come out to a clinic so they can cover 2<sup>nd</sup> umpire position in a pinch. 21" plate.
  - Coaches we are working on having all head coaches to be nonparents (senior rep teams). We do possibly have some positions filled already
  - Accounting from some rep & competitive teams regarding year-end financial reports
  - John spoke about what "the situation of baseball" is now
  - John offered "Kudos" to league directors Ed, Cam and Bob K.

  - Lori presented financial statements
  - We have until June 30<sup>th</sup> to spend the grant money on batting cage improvements
  - Lori explained 07/08 budget that she worked on with Rick. (aside: Rick explained SAMBA's decision to not spend the money on pants this next season, and how we are looking at donating pants to somewhere it's needed)..
  - Lori explained that we're raising groundskeeper wages in order to keep the positions filled. (*Rick explained the reasoning behind this decision: recruitment and retention*)

  - Bob reports on the Bantam and Midget competitive and rep teams
  - 'Push' to go with Non-parent coaching. Options are looking pretty good right now

- f. Junior Rep Director
  - Cam gave overview
  - Evaluations at Servus Place worked out very well
  - Coaches were in place before evaluations which was very advantageous all had mandated coach certification
  - Evaluations on coaches was done to help give feedback to coaches
  - Recommendations/changes for 2008 need to change focus for younger players – more on development!!
  - Pitch count worked very well for Peewee and Mosquito
  - Want to try and support SAMBA players to higher levels in our own association
  - Push for non-parent coaches at Peewee level, may have to offer honorariums
- g. Facilities Director (Report attached)
  - Rod presented his report on the facilities
  - Need to have dependable staff for grounds and building maintenance, hopefully the increased funding will help alleviate these challenges
  - Thanks mentioned to Kelly Cruthers and Traci Chies on their work on the clubhouse
  - City of St. Albert (Anna Royer) really came through with respect to major repair expenditures (waterlines)
  - Recommendations: need to look into proper irrigation nozzle system, need to look into what to do with the trees
  - Batting cage next Priority for SAMBA, Bleachers need some repairs and replacing, paint/stain
  - "Like to see that Pride thing come back for players and coaches!"
- h. <u>Registrar</u>
  - Lindsay reported on how registration went this year highest enrolment since 1996
  - Largest increase was in Tball, then Peewee and Bantam
  - Female registration was UP, majority chose to play on All Girl Teams

- Servus Place worked out incredibly well for registrations during camps
- Recommends NO late registration fee, just a final date with a waiting list
- i. <u>Technical Director(Report attached)</u>

  - Set up and take down was "a bit of a pain" and there were some other issues at Servus Place, but basically worked ok
  - Recommends use of both Athlete's Nation and Servus Place, recommends technical director is not a coach

# **2008 House League Directors Report**

# House League Overview:

Overall, the 2008 House League Program was once again a great success. We realized for the second straight year an increase of more than 10% in registrations for a total of 552 players competing in 5 divisions, compared to 488 in 2007. All divisions with the exception of Bantam played either a Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday schedule.

- 1. **T-Ball** consisted of 14 teams, 153 players in total (117 males & 36 females)
- 2. **Rookie** consisted of 12 teams, 141 players in total, (110 males & 31 females)
- 3. **Mosquito** consisted of 10 teams, 8 teams from St. Albert and 2 teams from Morinville. 95 players in total from St. Albert (79 males & 16 females)
- 4. **PeeWee** consisted of 10 teams, 8 teams from St. Albert and 2 teams from Morinville. 95 players in total from St. Albert (82 males & 13 females)
- 5. **Bantam** consisted of 5 teams, 56 players in total (51 males & 5 females). 2008 was the third straight year our Bantam division teams played in the Edmonton & Rural Recreational Baseball League (ERRBL). A total of 20 teams this year from Edmonton and surrounding communities played in the league, compared to 14 teams last year

# **General Comments:**

- Player Evaluations took place at Servus Credit Union Place for the second straight year, we realized greater than 89% average participation for the 4 divisions. Thanks to Danny Mikitka and the Senior Tigers for participating and assessing the player's this year, their contribution provided S.A.M.B.A. with more consistent ratings in order that we could comprise teams to a higher level of balance within the divisions
  - Rookie 94%
  - Mosquito 89%
  - PeeWee 88%
  - Bantam 86%
- Amyotte's Advantage Program benefits attributed to S.A.M.B.A.'s negotiated 3 year term with Amyotte's to provide House League apparel and related awards/trophies, etc. included:
  - Reduced pricing on all products to the entire S.A.M.B.A. membership
  - Additional 5% discount to the entire membership and accumulative 5% standing credit for S.A.M.B.A. to utilize for successive season purchases
  - Advanced and consistent apparel ordering/branding. Maintaining the Major League team theme and player hall of fame numbering scheme
  - Additional apparel sponsorship for S.A.M.B.A. teams this year Amyotte's sponsored new jersey's for the Midget AAA team

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- "SAMBA Gear" program included a range of apparel (Wind Jackets, T-Shirts, Hoodies, etc.) with the St. Albert Cardinals Logo embroidery that could be ordered on-line at specific intervals through the season.
- Player pant purchase program
- Division Coordinators coordinators for all divisions were identified prior to the start of season. Sean McDaniel (T-Ball), Don Karall (Rookie), Ed Karl (Mosquito), Patrick Sullivan (PeeWee) and Ed Ewasiuk (Bantam) volunteered a significant amount of their time and efforts to ensure all the objectives of our program were well executed/fulfilled, the outcome was successful and very enjoyable for all players and their families. On behalf of myself and the Board of Director's, a huge note of appreciation and thanks goes out to all of them!
- Player / Team Pictures this year's photo sessions at SDI Digital Imaging were scheduled for the second week of regular season play (as per 2007 recommendations for improvement). Deferring the sessions by a week proved to be much more effective and accommodating for the coaches and families, ensuring any rooster changes, uniform requirements, etc. were completed and at the same time maintained delivery of all packages by the mid-season tournament. As always, SDI provided exceptional service and high quality of product
- League / Tournament Play the 2008 season was scheduled to commence on April 28<sup>th</sup> and conclude on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Due to a late snowfall in April the season start was delayed by a week (May 5<sup>th</sup>), all games missed during that week were to be rescheduled by the coaches through the course of the remaining 7 week schedule. Unfortunately many teams failed to do so.
  - Over the originally planned 8 week period, 563 league and tournament games were scheduled. 463 in St. Albert, 25 in Morinville, 25 in Rundle Park and 50 out of the 62 scheduled Bantam division games were played in other surrounding communities. Overall, 98 games were affected by the delay plus 5 rain-out days we experienced through the course of our season, efforts by the coaches to reschedule make-up games did not materialize as we had originally hoped for
  - Coach meetings to review and discuss the 2008 program, distribute information packages, schedules, uniforms & equipment took place at the clubhouse 2 weeks prior to the start of season
  - Practice facilities and schedules were established for all divisions/teams once again this season, including access to the batting cage's
  - All divisions/teams participated in a mid-season tournament. T-Ball (1 day event) included lunch, Rookie (3 day event) included lunch and a skill's competition, Mosquito (3 day event), all PeeWee teams for the third straight year participated in the NEZ tournament (3 day event @ Rundle Park) which included teams from Edmonton and surrounding communities. S.A.M.B.A. subsidized 75% of the \$200 entry fee for each of our 8 team's, the remainder was collected from the team families. All S.A.M.B.A. players received medals regardless of how they placed in their respective mid-season tournament. The Bantam division team's had an opportunity to participate in a mid-season tournament hosted by Sherwood Park, only 1 of the 5 teams registered and finished the tournament with a gold medal.
  - All divisions/teams participated in a year end tournament, 1 day event for T-Ball, 3 day event for Rookie, Mosquito and PeeWee divisions. 1 Bantam division team finished league play in first place overall and won Silver in the 'A' division final, 2 of

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> the remaining 4 Bantam teams finished with Gold and Silver in the 'C division final. Well done coaches and players! All S.A.M.B.A. House League players received trophies at season's end regardless of how they placed in their respective year end tournament

- Umpires 2008 continued to be a very difficult year relative to the number of available umpires (consistent across Alberta). Considering more than 200 house league games in St. Albert required umpires, John Bresler St. Albert District Umpire Coordinator, all his local umpires and a few parents/coaches need to be commended for their efforts and exceptional job of coordinating and communicating amongst themselves to ensure the games were played as scheduled. Kelly Symon President of Morinville Minor Baseball Association, also needs to be commended for assuming her role part way through the season and coordinating the umpire requirements to the same set of standard's
- **Facilities** overall, the City of St. Albert ball fields were well maintained, grass cut and shale raked on a regular bases. In addition, fields were groomed for the mid-season and year end tournaments. This year, we were also very pleased to see the field's in Morinville were maintained regularly and to a higher standard, well done!
- Equipment Deposit Program introduced for the 2007 season, S.A.M.B.A. once again collected a \$150 deposit from each House League coach prior to distribution of equipment. The result at season's end was 100% return of all equipment. Thanks to Gary Bokenfohr Equipment Coordinator and the Coaches for their coordination efforts and participation, the level of success we are realizing will continue to reduce the impact on following year's equipment replacement requirements and registration fee's

# Key Highlights:

- Winter / Spring Camp for the second straight year S.A.M.B.A.'s winter/spring camp was held at Servus Credit Union Place, twice weekly for 3 hrs from February 12<sup>th</sup> through to March 26<sup>th</sup>. More than 85 T-Ball to Bantam level players attended the camp. Thanks to Cam Houston, Danny Mikitka and a number of Tiger's for leading the sessions to ensure all players involved had a great deal of fun, received the very best instruction/workout and were able to enhance their basic skill set in preparation for the season. The Tiger's leadership and commitment to deliver this program can certainly be attributed to the successful outcome we realized. This year unfortunately due to late facility bookings, notifications and issues with the flooring we did face certain challenges of not being able to provide consistency in the schedules, breaking the levels of players into specific groups offset by times and the overall program agenda, the 3 hour sessions each night for the players also proved to be a bit much. For next season with hopefully more resources, we will be in a better position to coordinate the facilities well in advance, developed a better tiered/ consistent program, and provide earlier notification to accommodate our membership
- Tiger's Camp as per 2007 recommendations, scheduling and coordination efforts were well underway prior to the start of season, this provided our membership an extended notification period which resulted in a terrific turn out. More than 75 boys and girls from T-Ball to PeeWee attended the camp on Saturday, May 31<sup>st</sup> to take part in a full day of fundamentals instruction and drills, receive a Tiger's T-Shirt, compete for awards and have lunch with their favorite Tiger. Thanks to Danny Mikitka and the rest of the Tiger's for hosting this event and the included House League Coaches mini camp. Many families

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commented on how excited their kids were and what a great job you all did to keep them interested and active for the entire day, not to mention what they learned, the new friendships/mentorships formed and overall awareness of who the Tiger's are....we certainly look forward to seeing all of you out there again next season!

- **Community Division Provincial Play** comprised of House League players, 2 Mosquito division team's (one of which was comprised of mainly Rookie level players) and 1 Bantam division team competed during the month of July. The extended season and tournament activities were very much enjoyed by the players and their families, S.A.M.B.A. was the host site for one of the Mosquito division's first round of play. As per 2007 recommendations, coaches were selected by the mid-season tournament which proved to be very beneficial from a team selection and practice perspective, the one month lead time to work with the players prior to tournament play improved the overall performance of our teams
- Girl's Baseball (S.A.M.B.A.'s Angels) / S.A.M.B.A. Girls Skill's Camp S.A.M.B.A.'s continuing initiative to promote Girls Baseball resulted in 2 T-Ball teams, 2 Rookie teams, 1 Mosquito team and 1 PeeWee team, an 18% increase in registrations from the previous year. All teams were represented in the Angel uniforms c/w "Girl Power" silk screened on the jerseys for the second straight year. S.A.M.B.A. also hosted it's second consecutive "All Girls Baseball Skills Camp", over 40 girls from T-Ball to Bantam attended the Friday, June 6<sup>th</sup> event on our Bantam diamond coordinated by Byron Nicholson, S.A.M.B.A. Director, Girls Baseball and lead by Chris James, Director of Girls Baseball for Baseball Alberta and members of the 2008 Alberta Bantam Girls Provincial Team / S.A.M.B.A. Bantam AA & AAA Rep Teams. 2008 also represented a break through at the Rep level, 5 girls played with the Bantam AA Cardinals and 1 girl played with the Bantam AAA Cardinals...way to go girls!
- Girl's National's as a note of interest, 3 girl's from S.A.M.B.A.'s Bantam AA team (Rachelia Pawluk, Morgan Watchorn & Melissa Woolley) and 1 girl from the Bantam AAA team (Paige Wakefield) along with coach Dalin Woolley competed with Team Alberta Bantam Girls at the Nationals, unfortunately this year they placed out of the medal round. The Nationals were scheduled during mid August in Mascouche, Quebec
- Apparel part of our two year program to firstly promote girl's baseball by enhancing/consolidating the appearance of their uniform ("S.A.M.B.A. Angles" cap embroidery and Angels jerseys), this year we introduced the "Cardinals" logo embroidered on all House League caps, aligning them closer to a more unified and great "St. Albert Cardinals" themed baseball association. The overwhelming response we received from the coaches, players and parents by far exceeded our expectations. In addition, as per 2007 recommendations, S.A.M.B.A. introduced a player purchase program for baseball pants. With the exception of a few negative responses, overall the program was a huge success. Personally I was very impressed and felt a sense of pride, the appearance of our House League team's on the field in grey pants (matching our Rep players), Major League themed jerseys and St. Albert Cardinal caps made our teams not only look very smart and organized, but really enhanced the overall impression and player feelings that they belong to a more unified and great baseball association. Thanks to Rick Moreau at Amyotte's for alleviating the pressure on S.A.M.B.A. resources by stepping forward to manage the program, supply and sell the pant's at a very competitive rate directly out of their facility. In addition, all the families comprising our membership need to be commended for adopting

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this program, in the long run it will prove to be very beneficial from a financial perspective, ensuring S.A.M.B.A. continues to be one of the best and most cost effective baseball associations in Alberta relative to registration fee's and we can all share the same sense of pride to be part of it.

# Recommendations / Improvements for 2009:

# Carried over from 2007

- Assemble a committee to review, clarify and update S.A.M.B.A. league rules
- Implement a pre-season coaching program for all returning/prospective House League coaches (winter/spring camp participation?), continue to promote the online NCCP Initiation Coach program, online Respect in Sport program, etc. (partially incorporated in 2008)
- Expand T-Ball division mid-season/year end tournaments to a 2 day event, incorporating the Rally Cap Program for player assessment and skill development.

#### New for 2009

- Of most significance and importance, identify a successor to assume the role of House League Director
- Tender apparel contracts/renegotiate Amyotte's Advantage Program (expires in 2009)
- For future year's, it would advantageous for the division coordinator's to play an active role in determining make-up game schedules (rain-outs, etc.) and following up with the coaches to ensure all efforts are taken to make these games up. The season is very short, the objective is to provide as much opportunity as possible for our membership to play and enjoy the sport
- Reduce City of St. Albert facility rental requirements for Mosquito/PeeWee division practices. Provide and schedule access to S.A.M.B.A. facilities during weekends (some week nights) to minimize costs and take full advantage of our facilities
- Promote a Midget level House League team. ERRBL has grown to 10 teams, S.A.M.B.A. has sufficient number of players with interest to continue playing baseball beyond Bantam. Could be part of S.A.M.B.A.'s "Friday Night Baseball" initiative
- Restructure 5 House League Division Coordinator's to a Junior and Senior division Coordinator. Will provide the means to identify/engage these individuals earlier in the preseason to assist the House League Director
- Promote position of "Scheduling Coordinator/Director" to accommodate all divisions facility booking requirements at Legion Field
- Take advantage of Tiger's Baseball Club to assist in mentoring coaches/players throughout the course of the season
- Continue to promote Girls Baseball and support Baseball in general to surrounding communities...Morinville, NEZ Tournament, etc.

# **2008 Junior Rep Directors Report**

The 2008 season marked the first year of a partnership with the St. Albert Tigers and the St. Albert Minor Baseball Association. This relationship was of great benefit to the junior rep program, providing support to coaches as well as technical assistance during the evaluation process.

All programs within the junior division had a much greater focus on development than in previous years. Despite the shift in priorities, the teams managed to perform very well within the province and consequently, provided a strong argument that winning does not have to be at the expense of development.

Special mention must be given to the parents and players of the Mosquito and Peewee teams for stepping up and taking ownership of the diamonds that they called home for 5 months this season. The Peewee and Mosquito diamonds were consistently raked, tarped and cleaned-up by the parents of junior Cards.

#### Mosquito Competitive (AA's)

Head Coach: Randy Guy. The Mosquito AA's fielded a team made up primarily of first year players with very little experience playing competitive ball. The team showed continuous improvement throughout the year and finished the season by playing in the Tier II provincial tournament in Strathmore.

#### Mosquito Competitive (AAA's)

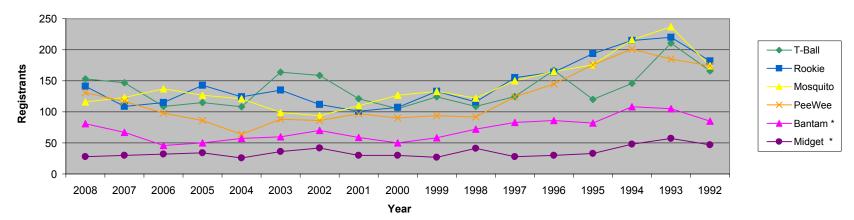
