# 5. SAMBA Executive and Director's Reports

# **5A. President's Report**

The 2013 season overall was another successful year of baseball in terms of what SAMBA projected/planned to deliver and achieve. As per his Presidents Report, Ed highlighted some of the Achievements and Challenges in 2013, as well as some of the Objectives for 2014.

#### **Achievements**

- SAMBA was named Baseball Alberta's "2013 Large Association of the Year" for the second time in the last 6 years, and is the only Association to ever win this award more than once
- SAMBA continued to see steady growth, with more than 600 players registered in all divisions in 2013
- SAMBA signed a 3-year agreement with Athletes Nation to utilize their facility to conduct all Winter and Spring Camps as well as the Rep Player Evaluations
- SAMBA continued to field very competitive teams at the Rep level, winning numerous medals at various tournaments throughout the year. Provincial Silver Medals were awarded to the Midget AAA's, PeeWee AAA's and both Mosquito AA teams
- SAMBA's Midget AAA Team won the Gold Medal at the Western Canadian Championships held in Winnipeg. In addition, two of our players won "AAA Player of the Year" honors, as awarded by Baseball Alberta in their respective divisions, Dylan Gates in Bantam, and Zach Froment in PeeWee
- SAMBA hosted a number of very successful events this year including the Early Bird Tournament, the Sr. Men's Canadian National Championships and the Bantam Alberta Zone Championships
- SAMBA's Jr. Cardinals inaugural year was very successful and the team finished 6th overall. The Jr. Cardinals were the youngest team in the league, and saw 4 of its players named to the league All Star Team
- SAMBA's third season in the Fall Ball Program and Winter Conditioning Program/Camps saw continued success, with an overall increase in registration numbers

### Challenges

 Poor Weather proved to be a big factor this year, causing a tremendous amount of extra work and frustration from a

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- management position, at both the House League and Rep levels, due to the necessary re-scheduling of games and umpires, cancellation of tournaments, etc.
- Volunteer Participation continued to be a problem this year, and additional efforts to encourage more of the Membership to get involved will be pursued in 2014
- The availability of coaches and respectable facilities for game play at the Bantam and Midget House League level hampered SAMBA's ability to form additional teams as required based on interest and registration
- While SAMBA was fortunate to benefit from funding assistance from a variety of sources this year, Sponsorship and Fundraising will be key initiatives again in 2014

# 2014 Objectives

- SAMBA will continue to appeal to the Board and Membership at large for more active involvement and participation and volunteer assistance to ensure the success of its programs
- Slight fee increases may be incorporated in 2014 for various programs to offset increases SAMBA will incur for utilities, salaried grounds crews, etc.
- SAMBA's current Bylaws, Policies and Procedures, and League Rules are in need of a review and update. Better documentation will assist the Association with Policy implementation and enforcement
- SAMBA will focus on a more regular and efficient maintenance program for the baseball fields and the equipment in an effort to avert and/or minimize untimely failures and breakdowns
- Mature (frustrated) Board needs to revitalize. Continue to appeal and encourage our entire membership to participate as many do not realize or understand significance or impacts

## **Acknowledgements**

Ed acknowledged that it takes many individuals to ensure an Associations success, and thanked all Board Members, Volunteers, Coaches, and Umpires for their tremendous effort throughout the year.

## **5B Questions/Comments from the Director's Reports**

Ed gave those in attendance a few minutes to review the various Directors Reports and asked for any questions or comments.

■ The question was posed: Why the House League evaluations were scheduled during Spring Break? Ed responded that SAMBA was bound by the times and dates available at Servus Place, and this was the only suitable time offered. A Motion was passed at the September 10th Board meeting to end future House League Evaluations. The consensus was that despite the limited turnout last year, the effect it had on player placement was negligible, as

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Michelle Whyte was able to take into consideration a number of other factors when assembling the teams

- The question was posed: Will SAMBA offer any refunds to House League players for missed Regular Season Games and Tournaments? Ed responded that despite the games cancelled due to weather, alternate and suitable field times were made available to all teams to conduct make-up games. It was incumbent on the coaches to facilitate the re-scheduling of the games and therefore SAMBA is not responsible for issuing any type of refund
- Lengthy discussions continued regarding Coach selection and education at the House League level, options for increased communication, etc., giving those in attendance the ability to make suggestions and offer input which the Board can review at a future meeting

## 6. Financial Report

Melanie presented the 2012/2013 Financial Report

### 6A. 2013 Financial Review

- SAMBA managed expenditures relative to established budgets and projected income. The Association ended the fiscal year with Cash Assets of \$49,048.21, Accounts Receivable and other assets totaling \$17,720.00, Liabilities of \$350.00 (equipment deposit), for a total Liabilities and Equity of \$66,768.21.
- Highlighted overall in 2012 SAMBA managed expenditures relative to established budgets and anticipated income. The association is ending the fiscal year with an accounts payable of \$22,432.00, an accounts receivable of \$739.92 and cash assets totaling \$21,439.09. The balance of the Income and Expense statement is in a negative amount this year (-\$252.99) due to an outstanding invoice to Baseball Alberta for 2012 registrations. We are certain that clubhouse rentals will continue to offset all costs associated with janitorial services and utilities

# 6B. 2014 Budget Review

Indications and the presented budget reflect that the 2014 budget components for the most part will remain the same as 2013. It is expected that more revenue will be realized from registration fees, rep player fees, fundraising initiatives and sponsorship income, to help offset increases in expenses related to field operations,

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maintenance and utilities, etc.

Melanie gave the attendees a few minutes to review the report and asked for questions and/or comments.

- John Bresler questioned whether SAMBA Rep Teams were in fact collecting/paying the proper amount of Umpire Fees and relative Travel Costs? Melanie confirmed that, yes indeed all teams have been following this practice correctly.
- Trudy Quartel suggested that perhaps SAMBA should not allow any Players that have not paid their Registration fees upfront the opportunity to take to the field for play. Ed confirmed that currently only the Jr. Cardinals were given some leeway in this regard due to it being the inaugural year for the program. Otherwise this is being enforced at the House League level and for most part at the Rep level.

# 2014 President's Report

### **General Comments:**

Overall 2014 like the past couple of seasons was another challenging (volunteers, weather, etc.) but successful year of baseball in terms of what SAMBA projected to deliver and achieved. Our Key Focuses over the past year remained as per previous years, to continue expanding and enhancing our various baseball programs, promoting a fun environment for our House League and Rep League, updating our social media, documenting policies, procedures and rules, fielding competitive teams across all Rep team levels, conditioning and skill development of players, technical knowledge/certification of our coaches, marketing of our association, as well as maintaining and continuing to enhance the overall condition and appearance of our facilities. I am very pleased to be able to present the following Achievements and Challenges, as well as some Key Objectives for the upcoming year.

#### **Achievements:**

## Administration

- Registrations: All SAMBA Summer/Fall leagues and yearly camp programs are now conducted on-line. SAMBA continued to realize growth in registrations for all programs this season (640), and once again are Baseball Alberta's largest Association
- Baseball Alberta League/Player Registrations: Once again were facilitated in a very timely fashion and met or exceeded all Baseball Alberta expectations and deadlines. Thanks to Pat Sullivan!
- Multi-Year Agreements: Renewed Amyotte's HL/Apparel agreement, also entering into our second consecutive year of a three year agreement with Athletes Nation to utilize their facility for hosting our Winter Camps, Spring Camp and Rep Evaluation's

# Program

- Fall Ball Program and Winter Conditioning Program/Ball Camps: Fourth season SAMBA has provided these programs thanks to Travis and all the supporting coaches for their dedication, support and time to provide the extended opportunities to our Membership!!!
- Spring/Summer Camps: Once again SAMBA delivered very successful Spring, Tigers and Girls Baseball skills camps, maintaining registration numbers parallel to last year
- Coach Certification & Training: Again this year, and in conjunction with MMBA and Baseball Alberta, SAMBA hosted more clinics than any previous year and more than any other Association within Alberta. All (100%) of our Rep level coaches attained required levels of certification this year, as well as many additional coaches at the House League level
- Rally Cap Program: Third successful year of implementation, thanks primarily to Kelly Phelan. Lessons learned along the way continue to make this program more adaptable and understanding for everyone involved. Rally Cap Day hosted in Morinville, was a huge success!!

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- House League: Overall a successful season. Regardless of our typical foul weather conditions throughout the season, SAMBA managed to complete the season, mid-season tournament and year end tournament as scheduled....a first in a number of years
- Abolishment of HL evaluations (Rookie to PeeWee) and Player Helmet Program
- Rep Evaluations: Second year in a row where we realized a record number of players (163) vying for a spot to play Rep level ball. In addition to players from our Association, we continued to see players from many outlining communities at our evaluations which were conducted and completed all indoors by the first part of April
- Competition Level: One of the most exciting and gratifying years of baseball for SAMBA.
   All representative teams in all divisions and at all levels continued to be very competitive throughout the season. Three out of our nine teams won Provincial Gold, Our Midget AAA team won National Silver and many other teams won numerous medals at various tournaments throughout the season. Thank You to all the coaches/players for their commitment, efforts and true sportsmanship....Well done everyone!!!!!
- Hosting of Tournaments: Third straight year of successfully hosting/completing the Early Bird Tournament! Thanks to Gerry Peterson for coordinating/managing this great event again this year. SAMBA also introduced a second tournament this year as part of our regular/annually hosted events. The Rain Maker Rodeo Tournament which hosted junior level teams from within the North Central Alberta Baseball League. The NCABL has now added this tournament into their standard league tournament package
- Hosting of Provincial Championships: Highlight and Pivotal Point of our Year!!!! This year SAMBA was very fortunate to host the Mosquito AA and PeeWee AA Tier III Provincial Championships as well as the PeeWee AAA, Bantam AAA and Midget AAA Tier I Provincial Championships all on the same weekend....a feat that very few communities could accommodate on their own accord. What an exciting and memorable 2 weeks of baseball at Legion Memorial Ball Park, and the fact that 3 Cardinals Team won Gold in our own back yard....this is something that has not happened for many years! Congratulations to everyone involved, SAMBA received nothing but rave reviews and comments related to how well the events were organized and run
- MMBA/Legal: Continued to work with Kelly and Colleen to promote growth of baseball in Morinville and Legal, as well enhance our overall House League at various levels/divisions. Also want to express a note of appreciation for the use of their diamonds, we hope this continues to be a lasting relationship that will continue to benefit all three Associations
- Jr. Cardinals: Second year of hosting a Jr. level team to play in the NCABL. SAMBA's Jr. Cardinal's remain the only Association based team and again were the youngest (avg. age) team in the league. Although there continued to be challenges from a team management and player commitment perspective, we look forward to finding additional coaching resources and recruiting players throughout the winter months, and continuing this program for many years to come
- Coach Assessments: Implementation of online assessment (Survey Monkey) proved to be very effective

### Facilities

 An exceptional year of field preparation and maintenance practices...thanks to Gerry, Sean, Cam, Will and Matt who were certainly one of SAMBA's best field groups ever to manage the facility and at the same time complete numerous projects around the facility; including the carpeting of our batting cages and bullpen area c/w seeding

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- Continued to maintain clubhouse bookings and cleaning services to sustain the clubhouse facility year round. Managed to solidify a two month (Oct.–Nov.) rental agreement with Alberta Health Services to provide for St. Albert's Flu Vaccinations
- Completed/partially completed a number of projects related to our awarded 2012 City Partnership Grant. Projects include Kitchen Fire Suppression System, Umpire Room Washroom, Mosquito Diamond Press Box and Partial Memorial Garden plantings. Still to be order is the Mosquito diamond scoreboard and 3 flag poles. Thank you to Travis and all the families who volunteered their time to build a terrific press box for our Mosquito teams.
- Implemented a user fine system for all teams who utilize our facilities. SAMBA has
  continually had to deal with issues related to our clubhouse maintenance/security and field
  maintenance practices. This first year SAMBA assessed approximately \$300 in fines, we
  were somewhat lenient as part of the introduction of this system, the number of fines that
  should have been assessed, should have been much greater in number

# Marketability & Image

- Social Media Exposure: In April, SAMBA promoted our new website where we have since realized more than 350,000 visits to our site. We also increased our Facebook exposure thanks to Kelly Phelan and established our Twitter site thanks to Kerry Knight, which has since exposed SAMBA and our activities most significantly
- Program Sponsors: SAMBA is grateful to Bob Fisher (CN Rail \$500) and Dave Maguire (Shell Canada - \$1000) who managed to once again have their respective company's provide sponsorship in support our programs
- Facilities Sponsorship: SAMBA was successful at obtaining a long term (15 year) \$10k
   Diamond Naming Sponsorship from St. Albert Physical Therapy & Sports Injury Clinics Inc.
   Thanks to Cori White for all her efforts in finding and solidifying this deal

## Challenges:

- House League Monitoring: SAMBA need's to allocate resources to continually monitor the program/games ensuring fair play is being practiced at all levels and rules are being adhered to. This will minimize the number of conflicts, issues and disappointments of players/families we continue to deal with
- Need to re-establish 'A' level ball for provincials at various divisions and summer ball program. Second straight year of no coordination and participation from SAMBA
- Player Development: Resources to manage and facilitate various programs on a regular bases. Rally Cap & My First Pitch programs, player clinics, camp resource recruitment, etc.
- Participation/Volunteer's: Need to continue appealing to and encourage our membership to participate in various programs/events and engage volunteer's as part of the regular operational (coaches, coordinator's, teams, etc.) and seasonal requirements
- BOD: Continually need to promote/mentor more committed members to the specific positions and roles. Those that will be engaged with SAMBA for years to come and contribute to the operational needs and all other related requirements of the association and their role firstly, not just attend meetings or participate on behalf of their family member. Too many Executives and Board members full-filling multiple roles!
- Sponsorship and Fund Raising: Designation of key resources who are dedicated to continually manage and promote various initiatives. SAMBA needs to obtain funding from various other sources in order to maintain a positive balance on our financials and promote enhancement of various aspects of our programs and facilities. Otherwise registration fee's will continue to increase in order to offset the costs and/or aspects of the program need to be reduced or cut

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• Financials and Related Processes: Maintaining budgets, dedicated person to maintain up to date financial status and ensure efficient AP/AR processes are in place. Restore vendor/membership relations and reputation

# 2015 Objectives:

## Administration

- BOD full participation: Need to encourage our membership to participate as many do not realize or understand the significance or impacts that voids have on other members. Requires more than just names next to titles
- Membership may incur increased fees in 2015 in order to sustain our facilities, utility increases, salaried crews and coach honorariums
- Continuance of the user fine system and team clubhouse maintenance fee's (dedicated clubhouse custodian)
- Bylaws, Policies, Procedures and League Rules: Review/update desperately required.
   Need to document, publish and mandate strict policies in every regard in order to alleviate the growing issues and instill conformance. Ongoing issue for many years now
- Re-assess and possibly abolish commitment to Athletes Nation Agreement. Continued low registrations will have significant impact on SAMBA financials

# <u>Program</u>

- Early coach selections, mentorship, certification & retention (HL & Rep). Continue to deliver/enhance SAMBA camps and player development programs, year round
- Continue to build on our Health & Wellness program
- Continue to build our program's in conjunction with Morinville Minor Baseball Association and Legal Minor Baseball, re-establish and promote "Girl's Baseball"
- Tigers Association: Review of relationship, benefits to SAMBA and objectives of the agreement/program. Possibly implement a user pay system or prioritize commitments and obligations going forward, better understanding of each other's expectations

## **Facilities**

- Facilities Director successor and hiring/rehiring of valued field staff members
- Continue focus on a regular and efficient field and equipment maintenance program due to aging equipment and mature grounds. Fully documented daily, weekly, annual and long term maintenance program (components still outstanding from previous years)
- Complete all outstanding projects related to the City Partnership Grant and submit final report. Required prior to submitting additional grant proposals of similar nature
- Complete development permit for team trailer and C-Cans (presently in progress)
- Continue discussions with the city related to obtaining a full capital grant for our tree pruning and replacement program (presently in progress)

### Marketing & Image

I look forward to in the offseason looking at ways to increase involvement from our House League coaches towards player development as well as how we can make our coaches stay for years to come.

# **SAMBA House Leagues & Development**

### Recommendation:

# 2014 Jr. Rep Director Report

2014 was a successful year for the junior division. We hosted three provincial championships and celebrated with two provincial titles. The hard work of the players, coaches, parents and volunteers made the year a success for all Cardinals, even if a championship was not achieved.

The spring brought stress with coach selection and player evaluations. How does one fairly evaluate 54 PeeWee players while hockey play offs are happening? It wasn't easy but we did it and the results on the field made the stress all worth it.

## **MOSQUITO DIVISION**

The Mosquito division struggled with registration numbers and 2<sup>nd</sup> year rookie players were encouraged to try out as underage players. In the end 24 players were successful in being selected and made up the Mosquito Blue and Red teams.

The Mosquito rep program graduates 14 players to the Pee Wee program in 2015.

The Mosquito diamond received a press box in time for hosting provincials and the effort of all involved is greatly appreciated. This press box is an excellent addition to the diamond allowing announcing, music and inclement scorekeeping to proceed without interruption.

## **Mosquito AA Blue**

The Mosquito Blue Cardinals were led by the coaching staff of Greg Reiniger, Travis Parker, Dave Edwards and OFM Jerry Boutin. The team played 17 regular season games, compiling a record of 8-10-1.

*Tournaments:* The Cardinals competed in the St. Albert Early Bird Tournament and unfortunately did not advance past round robin play.

*Tier III Provincials:* In St. Albert the Cardinals lost both games in round robin play. A torrential downpour Friday had coaches and volunteers scrambling to prepare the fields for the six-team tournament. Their tireless efforts included not only dealing with wet conditions but also securing portable lighting to allow the championship to be completed. The games did not start until late Saturday and the finals were completed on Monday.

In a show of support for one of their teammate's younger sister whose cancer fight is in remission, the team raised \$1,600 for Kids with Cancer through 50/50 draws and donations, including a \$400 donation from the Northeast Zone Northstars.

The development of this team from start to end of season was tremendous and all the players should be proud of their season.

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# **Mosquito AA Red**

The Mosquito Red Cardinals were led by the coaching staff of Scott Ironside, Ian McKinley, Brian Hartman, Richard Serafinchon, Mortie Moss and OFM Krista Morris. The team played a total of 17 regular season games, compiling an overall record of 13-4.

*Tournaments:* The Cardinals participated in the St. Albert Early Bird Tournament and the Doc Plotsky and lost in the semi-final in both.

*Tier I Provincials:* In Okotoks the Cardinals won both their round robin games and advanced to the semi-final, but lost to Camrose Blue.

#### PEE WEE DIVISION

This season saw a record number of players register and try out for one of three teams. The numbers were such that evaluations were held in two groups due to space limitations at Athletes Nation. Hockey playoffs conflicted with baseball evaluations and all efforts were made to ensure players were evaluated on all components.

The Pee Wee rep program graduates 20 players to the Bantam program in 2015.

# Pee Wee AA Blue

The Pee Wee AA Blue Cardinals were led by Chris Schneider, George Whyte, Rod Dabels, Karl Schwendeman, Rick McClinton and OFM Wayne Libich.

Tournaments: The Cardinals competed in the St. Albert Early Bird Tournament (3<sup>rd</sup> place finish), Doc Plotsky and the Calgary Summer Slam (gold medal).

Tier II Provincials: The Cardinals hosted provincials at the pee wee diamond. The championship started out on a soggy note with rain causing the final to be delayed until Monday. The efforts of the coaching staff, volunteers, and Gerry's field crew were outstanding, fans, pumps, and rakes were all needed to make the diamond playable. When play got underway, the Cardinals won both their pool games to advance to meet Heisler where they won by a score of 13-3. In the final versus Stettler the Cardinals won a high scoring affair with a walk off single to score the winning run in the 15-14 game.

# Pee Wee AA Red

The Pee Wee AA Red Cardinals were led by Gary Odegard, Dave Beattie, Kelly Olsen, Chad Baker, Andrew Odegard and OFM Merilee Odegard. The team played 18 regular season games, compiling a record of 14-4-0.

*Tier I Provincials:* In Grande Prairie the Cardinals went 1-2 in round robin play. Unfortunately this was not enough to advance to the semi-finals.

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# Pee Wee AAA

The Pee Wee AAA Cardinals were led by Mark Brisson, Tim Marples, Colin Froment, Brian Bourassa and OFM Kerry Knight. The team played 24 regular season games, compiling a record of 19-5-0.

Tournaments: The Cardinals competed in the St. Albert Early Bird Tournament and won gold. In the Doc Plotsky the team went 1-2 and in the Red Deer Tournament in early July the Cardinals took gold.

*Tier I Provincials*: The Cardinals hosted 8 teams in this highly competitive championship. The Cardinals went 1-2 in pool play. The Baseball Alberta formula was in the Cardinals favour and sent them to meet Spruce Grove where they battled it out to win 5-4 in an extra inning. In the finals vs the Okotoks Dawgs, the Cardinals dug deep and pulled off a 14-4 win to be crowned Provincial Champions. The Cardinals battled hard and put a scare into favoured team Ontario but unfortunately came up short. In the bronze medal game the host London Badgers proved too strong defeating the Cardinals 6-2. Being there as a parent, I witnessed a great effort by Team Alberta. They may not have won a medal but this team did Alberta proud.

The Cardinals competed in 4 tournaments and ended up with 1 tournament Championship.

- The next tournament was the Peter Devries Tournament hosted by the Edmonton Cardinals. The Cardinals were flawless capturing the title over the Okotoks dawgs and posting a perfect 5-0 record.

A special mention should be made that Tanner McLean Poll was nominated for Midget AA player of the year. As of Sept 27 he was in the mix as one of 3 finalists for the award.

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As you can see from the report, the senior level within the St Albert Minor Baseball continues to produce strong minded and goal orientated young men. Results do not make a team, the players make the team. The coming together at the beginning of the year for early tryouts, to the delight (and sometimes disappointment) of being selected for one of the senior rep teams, to taking the field for the first time as a member of your new team, fills these young men with a great sense of belonging, and with this belief and pride in the work done, St Albert Minor Baseball Association will only continue to be one of the major Baseball Associations in Alberta.

# **2014 House League Directors Report**

# **House League Overview:**

Through the second year within the position of House League Director, I was more aware of the good, the bad, and the ugly that can happen through the year. Overall, in my opinion, we had lots of good, a little bad, and unfortunately even some ugly. However, with growing the association, we will continue to have shining moments among a few dark clouds.

In spite of 2013 being a difficult year weather wise, our 2014 registrations were up just under 10% for a total of 500 players. We fielded teams within each division, with four divisions (Rally Cap, Rookie, Mosquito and Pee Wee) playing two nights a week on either Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday. Our Bantam teams and Midget team participated in the Edmonton Rural Recreational Baseball League, with games scheduled Monday through Saturdays, playing against teams in Edmonton and surrounding areas.

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### **General Comments:**

- Player Evaluations Over the past few years, the number of registrants participating in House League Evaluations have continued to decline, last only 35% of House League players attending the evaluations. Because this endeavor is both time and financially consuming, this year, we decided to try something different group players according to neighbourhoods, as do other community associations. But, different problems arose we did not have a perfect number of registrants per neighbourhood to make up teams so some players were on teams without their neighbourhood friends; we do not ask for height or weight when registering so some teams were bigger than others. In fact, some parents believed one particular rookie team was stacked, which happened to be my own son's team. It's unfortunate no matter which way teams are decided, people will not be happy I still think grouping kids by neighbourhood is a better way to create teams unless evaluations are made mandatory.
- The only age grouping completing evaluations were Bantam level players. 33 out of 36 players attended helping to create teams created based on their results. Thanks to Travis Parker, and other coach volunteers for running the evaluations
- Registrations This year we had our strongest registration numbers at the Rally Cap level. At the
  end of the registration period, we had a total of 168 registrants. Rather than turn any children away,
  we created an additional two teams, increasing our total teams to 16. We also provided 8 Rally
  Cappers the opportunity to move up and to play at the Rookie Level. These players all had a
  minimum of one year of play at the House League level in addition to permission from their parents.
- Division Coordinators Coordinators for the each division were found either prior to the season beginning. Kelly Phelan (Rally Cap), Jennifer Storrie (Mosquito & Pee Wee), and Cori White (Bantam & Midget) contributed their time and assistance for their perspective divisions. All these individuals provided much needed assistance and support not only for their division groups but for me as well. A heartfelt thanks to all.
- Player / Team Pictures This year's photo sessions were again at SDI Digital Imaging. Pictures
  were scheduled for the start of the season rather than mid-season to ensure delivery prior to the end
  of season.
- Girls Baseball While our number of female players increased this year at most levels, because of
  the choice of nights of play (either Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday) we would have been
  unable to create a separate girls team for any other division than Rally Cap.
- League Play SAMBA had planned for the 2014 season to begin on Monday, April 28, 2014.
   Unfortunately, both Mother Nature and the City of St. Albert Parks Department had different ideas.
   The city diamonds needed additional time to be prepped for play and to ensure safety for our members. We were able to get started shortly thereafter, allowing for the first week of games to be tacked on to the end of the schedule, after the year-end tournament. Thanks to Kelly Phelan, and Colleen Allison for their assistance in juggling field locations and scheduling.
- **Tournament Play** Two tournaments were scheduled for the 2014 season a midseason tournament for the Rally Caps, Rookies, and Mosquitos and then our year end tournament for Rally Caps, Rookies, Mosquitos and Pee Wees.
  - Midseason It was a great weekend for our midseason tournament. M/W teams played against T/H teams to give everyone a chance of playing against new teams. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves and have fun. Our Pee Wee teams participated in the NEZ tournament, with SAMBA paying for \$150 (75%) of the registration fee and the remainder, \$50 (25%) being funded by each team. The tournament was a success for our SAMBA teams, enjoying the opportunity to play other teams outside St. Albert.
  - Year-End like this year's midseason tournament, we were able to get the complete tournament played. All SAMBA players were awarded plaques demonstrating their participation throughout the year. The Bantams & Midgets played their year-end tournaments through the week with the ERRBL.

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- Practice Facilities and schedules were made available for all divisions/teams, including access to the batting cages. The requests were accommodated through Ed Ewasiuk.
- **Coach Meetings** to review and discuss the 2014 program, distribute information packages, schedules, uniforms & equipment took place at the clubhouse prior to the start of season
- No teams were drafted this year the Midget level had enough players for one team, and the Pee
  Wee teams had no evaluations and were thus organized by neighbourhood. Travis Parker, SAMBA's
  technical director created the teams at the Bantam Level following the evaluations. Again, the hope
  at all levels is to distribute the ability levels amongst the teams to find a fair an equal balance for the
  divisions that completed the evaluations.
- This was the 3<sup>rd</sup> year the Mosquito Division had major changes in the rules this year. The biggest change was that there were no walks in this division. The rule changes were more clearly understood this year which allowed players more opportunity to practice and learn in a less stressful situation. The best part was having the coaches pitch sometimes pitching is harder than it looks!!
- RallyCap schedules this year consisted of one RallyCap skills night and one game night each week.
   We took away the requirement of moving diamonds within one night to allow for more playing time for our players.
- Umpires John Bresler (Umpire Coordinator) and all his local umpires need to be commended for their efforts to ensure the games were played as scheduled. Kelly Phelan and Morinville Minor Baseball Association, and Colleen Allison, Legal Minor Baseball Association, also need to be commended for their role in coordinating in Morinville
- Facilities The City of St. Albert ball fields were well maintained, grass cut and shale raked on a regular bases. They responded quickly to requests for action. The fields in Morinville were maintained regularly and to a high standard.
- Equipment Deposit Program SAMBA this year once again collected a deposit from each House League coach prior to distribution of equipment. Teams were held responsible for non-returned equipment
- **Community Division Provincial Play** Unfortunately, no coaches were able to step-up and take on the responsibility for community teams at any level this year
- **Summer Baseball** No coaches were able to contribute their time for summer baseball this year. Therefore, no teams participated.
- SAMBA Camps and Coaching Clinics These clinics and camps continued throughout they year, welcoming players at all level of abilities. It's great to see the progress our athletes are making by attending a few of the camps each year.

### Recommendations / Improvements for 2014:

- Continued from 2013 review, clarify and update SAMBA House League rules to ensure consistency and understanding by our membership, in conjunction with SAMBA By-Laws.
- Suggest implementing a Tournament Director position (non-board member) to assist with running both the mid-season and year-end tournaments.
- Send out surveys to previous members who have not returned to SAMBA to determine why (determining attrition levels)
- Send out surveys to current members to determine why they are staying (determining retention levels)
- Begin to organize both summer and community ball ('A' ball) at the start of the House League season to ensure SAMBA representation at these levels. Even though this was brought up at the start of the House League season, two coaches that had initially volunteered to coach community all decided against it.

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• Discuss the options of holding our own Pee Wee level mid-season tournament and making it optional for Pee Wee teams to attend the NEZ tournament. Our M/W teams would like to play the T/H teams as opposed to driving into Edmonton.

A big thanks to Kelly Phelan, who continues to try and keep me grounded, through the past two years. She was an amazing sounding board who was always there to lend an ear and a hand.

To Ed Ewasiuk, who puts in more hours than I think possible to keep the association running. His expertise and knowledge is insurmountable.

To our membership as a whole, for helping me sa I continued in this role. I had many e-mails thanking the board for all the hours we put in and it's nice to know it doesn't go unappreciated.

And most of all, thanks to George, Alex, and Aiden Whyte, who again functioned without a wife and mother for the months of April through to June, so I could do my best in this volunteer role.

To accomplish that they had to spend some very long days ensuring everything was done which included working on changing the Bantam mound until 11:30PM one night to ensure it was ready for a 9:00am game the next morning. They always went above and beyond so a huge thank you to them.

SAMBA had a fairly busy end of the season hosting a lot of events such as The Midget AAA Provincials, The Bantam AAA Provincials, The PeeWee AAA Provincials as well as the Mosquito & PeeWee AA Provincials besides all the other events that we normally host such as the Earlybird Tournamnet & Tigers Tournament.

In the attempt to continually improve and maintain the playing fields we implemented a Filed Fine System which worked out fairly well and this fine system will be continuing for next year as well.

# **2014 Grant Proposal Coordinator Report**

During this fiscal year, SAMBA again had limited provincial and national grant opportunities to draw in extra funding to support sports/leisure related projects running as part of SAMBA. Specifically, continued facility upkeep and equipment replacement remain as priorities.

Over the last year, one new proposal was submitted in June 2014 seeking funding from the **Farm Credit Canada AgriSpirit Fund**. As part of this proposal, our Association had secured support from the City to receive our grant funding if successful (as required by the funding agency.) The grant proposal coordinator learned that this proposal did not advance in late August. The funding agency was unable to share information as to why SAMBA was not funded. This is the second year that SAMBA was unsuccessful in accessing funding from this source and it is probably not likely to get funded in the future.

Ongoing grant funded projects include:

In early March 2012, SAMBA submitted a proposal to the City of St Albert's Community Capital Grant Program for the amount of \$11,256.30 (33% of total project expenses). The other two-thirds is being funded through SAMBA registration fees and volunteer labor offset.

This proposal was approved by the City Council in early May 2012.

These monies have been allotted to the following five projects:

- 1) Legion Memorial Ball Park Eternal Membership Memorial Garden;
- 2) Mosquito Diamond press box and scoreboard
- 3) Umpire room (shower/washroom completion)
- 4) One team dressing room conversion (equipment room)
- 5) Replace existing fire sprinkler system and re-charge it

Work has moved closer to completion on all projects with an aim to complete all five by this coming spring. A final report will be submitted to the city, including photos of the completed projects, to ensure that all requirements required by the city have been completed.

SAMBA also acknowledges Shell Canada, the employer of a SAMBA coach (Dave Maguire), who has generously supported SAMBA with financial support again this year, as did CN, the employer of a family member (Bob Fisher) on the Midget AA team. Should others who volunteer for SAMBA have employers that would support this organization, please contact the SAMBA President and/or the Grants Coordinator to ensure prompt follow-up.

# 2014 Equipment Managers Report

In 2014, SAMBA issued 44 equipment bags to the House League with 100% return or an equivalent or better purchased replacement turned in. Another 9 equipment bags along with 15 complete jersey sets were issued to our Rep and Jr. Cardinal's team's. In summarizing 2014, problems encountered and solutions are listed below:

- Personal cheque collected from Rep coaches to initially be held <u>only</u> temporarily until team accounts could be set up, in some cases wound up being the team's deposit, as these team OFM's Treasurers and Coaches would not respond to requests to have a team equipment cheque turned into our Treasurer to be cashed.
  - It is my recommendation that a \$25.00 fine be in place and issued after team accounts have been set up and a reasonable amount of time has passed without a proper deposit being turned in to SAMBA.
- 2) The return of jerseys seems to be an issue with some Rep teams. With no leverage for the teams to collect jersey's in a reasonable amount of time at season's end.
  - It is my recommendation that an individual jersey deposit cheque be collected from parents and held by SAMBA, and returned only once the jersey/jerseys are washed and turned back into SAMBA. Total replacement is \$150.00/each for home and/or away jersey(s).
- 3) SAMBA is now issuing First Aid kits to both House League and the Reps. Next season will be the first time where we will be purchasing and restocking kits at both levels. Some kits issued to Rep teams were severely depleted from SAMBA camps with no time to restock prior to issue.
  - It is my recommendation due to the high costs associated with F/A material that the Board set out basic replacement items as a guideline for the Equipment Manager, and these purchases be made during the winter and restocking done then. The restocking of these kits will be prior to issue and any further restocking needs during the season will be at each team's expense.
- 4) The cost to purchase new Home Plates and Pitching Rubbers each season due to wear and tear (fasteners being pulled out) by the House League due to the fact they need to be hammered in and removed once, twice or more a week for 2 months for league play.
  - It is my recommendation that SAMBA push the City to install home plates and pitching rubbers on the diamonds used for Mosquito to Midget in St Albert. Understanding that some fields may have a dual use home plates minimum could be installed. If the City is unwilling, maybe a trial could be done with SAMBA installing some home plates on the 6 or so diamonds we use.

In summary, SAMBA has not had a designated Assistant Equipment Manager for a couple of years now. I feel valuable lessons learned are not being passed along to future replacements and means they only have to be relearned after each cycle. I would like to thank the President and Registrar for their assistance over 3 days collecting and sorting the large volume of House League equipment back into their appropriate storage space. Also I would like to thank the Jr. and Sr. Rep directors in providing the transportation and a work party for the return of all our equipment from Athletes Nation once evaluations concluded.

# **2014 Umpire Coordinator Report**

The number of umpires seems to stay at the same levels year to year. We lose a few and replace them with a few new ones.

We have approximately 27 registered umpires in the St Albert region. This includes 17 from St Albert, 4 from Morinville and 6 from the Legal area. We had 6 umpires from the Legal area who primarily worked the few Legal games and their Fastball games, none of the Legal umpires worked any games outside of Legal.

Our umpires range from level 5C to level 1's. We have umpires who work all levels of baseball in the province from House League to Western Major baseball. All level 1 and 2 umpires primarily worked SAMBA House League games during the week and some had the opportunity to do some Rep Ball. I am happy to say that all but 4 of them (not including the Legal group) worked some Rep ball this year.

The main focus for the level 1 and 2 umpires was the House League schedules, including the mid year and year end tournaments. In addition some of them worked at the Early Bird Tournament and helped out at NEZ and Sherwood Park with their Major tournaments.

This year Baseball Canada introduced a new NUCP clinic format, first year umpires faced a more difficult task officiating. Having said that we tried to have them partnered with more experienced umpires for the first few games and then on their own if needed. With the help of some very understanding coaches they got through with the games without major issues, both the umpires and coaches are learning as the season went on and hopefully at the end of the season they achieved their goals. The fact that most of the umpires worked some Rep Ball is a strong testament to their hard work and their willingness to learn.

Standard Alberta weather caused some cancellations and changes with the schedules but we were all able to get through with season. Unfortunately some games had no umpires show and in some of those cases the games had to be cancelled. It is unfortunate but we have half of our umpires who are also players and as their schedules change they will drop the officiating and play their games, there are times when the changes are made quite late and we could not find umpires to replace them. This is a problem that is quite common in all Associations not just SAMBA.

Looking forward we face the same problems every year, the recruitment of new umpires and the retention of the ones we have. Unfortunately after a couple of years these boys turn 17 and 18 and are looking for more permanent work so umpiring becomes secondary. In terms of remuneration there is no other job that pays as well, but at times the pressures become a bit too much and we lose some. All the umpires are registered with Baseball Alberta and Baseball Alberta has to do a better job in mentoring new umpires, at time the more experienced umpires are more concerned with their own development and do little for the advancement on new umpires. This has once again been addressed with baseball Alberta and hopefully they are listening.

Most of the equipment has been returned, once it's all in I will get a better indication as to what we have and may need for the upcoming year. Some of the returning umpires have started buying their own equipment and hopefully that will put less pressure on the existing stock.

As for myself, I will not be returning as Umpire Coordinator for SAMBA, it is time for some one new to take the reigns. I will be more than happy to help whoever takes over.

In closing I would like to thank the Executive and all the coaches for the support and patience with our young umpires, we are all part of the game and it's the passion and dedication of all that makes the game great.

Brad was able to grab many players to attend a "Hitting and Pitching Camp" hosted by MMBA/SAMBA out in Morinville. The camp focused strictly on Mosquito & PeeWee House League kids and was a huge success. This camp should be considered for future years. Due to overwhelming response and attendance, the PW kids attended the camp in Morinville on a separate weekend, while the Mosquito kids attended the camp during the regular SAMBA Tigers Camp (afternoon session).

Tiger's camp was held in June this year and was a success as always. I continue to support the idea that Rally Cap kids only attend a half day (up to and including lunch) while the older kids attend after lunch for more skills (eg: further Pitching & Hitting sessions).

The Bat Boy program was not as successful this year as many home games were held during the school week. Weeknight games make it difficult for the younger kids to attend a full game. The kids that did attend, loved it. Tigers were great at accepting the players on the field.

The Tigers Tournament was a huge success!! We had multiple kids work multiple games for the bat-boy program. We only had a small issue with one visiting team being 'intimidating' for a young boy who had never been a bat boy before. Next year I suggest that a more experienced and older player be the bat boy for such team(s), if at all.

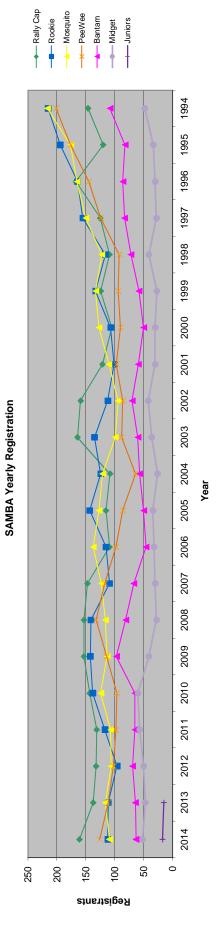
