2025.2026 PARENT/VOLUNTEER CODE OF CONDUCT

Application and Expectations

All members of the Banff Alpine Racers Ski Club (“**BAR**”) and Bow Valley Quikies (“**BVQ**”), which includes BAR/BVQ parents and volunteers registered with BAR/BVQ as an AASA/ACA member (“**BAR/BVQ Parent/Volunteers**”) are required to adhere to this Parent/Volunteer Code of Conduct while participating in BAR/BVQ activities, including race competitions, training, camps, meetings, socials and other club activities. BAR/BVQ Parents/Volunteers are also required to adhere to all applicable policies, rules and regulations of BAR/BVQ (including “Parent Responsibilities” in the BAR/BVQ Parent Handbook), the Alberta Alpine Ski Association (“**AASA**”), including the AASA Code of Conduct and Harassment Policy, as well as all applicable policies, rules and regulations of Alpine Canada Alpin (“**ACA**”) and the International Ski Federation (“**FIS**”).

BAR/BVQ Parent/Volunteers are considered ambassadors of BAR/BVQ and the sport of Alpine Ski Racing and are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that will bring credit to BAR/BVQ and the Alpine Ski Racing Community. Any failure to comply with this Code of Conduct, or failure to comply with any applicable policies, rules or regulations of AASA, ACA or FIS will be reviewable by BAR/BVQ’s Executive Director, Executive Board Directors and/or AASA.

BAR/BVQ adopts the principles of Safe Sport and the Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport (“**UCCMS**”). “Safe Sport” refers to our collective responsibility to create, foster and preserve sport environments that ensure positive, healthy, and fulfilling experiences for all individuals. A safe sport environment is one in which all sport stakeholders recognize, and report, acts of maltreatment and prioritize the welfare, safety, and rights of every person at all times. The key themes that define Safe Sport include:

- Prevention of maltreatment (e.g., physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, neglect, etc.)
- Human rights (e.g., right to participation, right to voice)
- Equity, diversity, and inclusion
- Optimization of sport experience (i.e., how we can foster positive sport experiences that ensures everyone thrives and is kept safe in sport)

Safe Sport education is highly recommended for all BAR members and video sessions are available at www.banffalpineracers.com.

In order to create a safe and positive environment for all participants in youth sports, BAR/BVQ Parents/Volunteers must adhere at all times to the following. Each parent shall initial each statement to recognize agreement.

HAVING A POSITIVE ATTITUDE

1. I will treat all members of ski racing (including resort staff and race officials, referees, volunteers and athletes) with courtesy and respect. I will politely accept the outcomes of races and athlete performances.

SETTING A GOOD EXAMPLE

5. I will refrain from public criticism of any member of Alpine Ski Racing. This includes coaches, officials, club members and those involved in the operations and safe execution of Alpine Ski Racing. If I feel that I would like to provide feedback, I shall follow the proper protocol and do so respectfully.

6. I will refrain from making comments that may be offensive, insulting, humiliating, malicious, degrading, or intimidating. Such comments will not be tolerated by myself or others. If I feel that I would like to provide feedback, I shall follow the proper protocol and do so respectfully.

7. I will respect that coaches/officials and referees have been trained in the sport. I will refrain from confrontation, respect their decisions, and address any concerns with the correct personnel in a respectful manner.
