Over the course of 2024, we've worked closely with sport management consultancy Capitis Consulting to undertake careful research with our member clubs, sport partners, and most importantly, the people of Nova Scotia who play, coach, lead, and officiate basketball every day. This plan flows entirely out of this insight so we can be sure that what we commit to as an organization and a sport is reflective of what those we serve ultimately want from us.



Fine Focus 2030 identifies a more purposeful direction for our strategic activities moving forward, to ensure they are safe, productive and value-adding, and that our resources – be they people, funding or time - support difference-making activities within our basketball communities throughout Nova Scotia.

We are aware that our resources are often restricted and, as such, there are limitations to what we can effectively do. Our new plan tightens the lens of our future work and introduces collaborative ways with our members and partners to grow the game, make it safer and in the end work to reach our overall intended mandates.

Fundamentally, at BNS, we see ourselves as focusing on three core master pillars in the development of the sport of basketball in this province:

- System Governance
- Technical Leadership & Cohesion
- Competitions & Events

Please take a few moments to read through what we're committed to achieving between now and 2030. There is an important role for everyone in our basketball community to play in this plan, and we are excited about that alignment and opportunity.

System Governance


Ensuring basketball in Nova Scotia is run safely, fairly, ethically and in line with rules and policies required by law and the sport's governing bodies.

Technical Leadership & Cohesion

Developing a player development system that allows every player to develop to the best of their age and ability, led by qualified coaches who see their growth and development as keys to success and growth of the game.

Competitions & Events

Developing and administering a competition system throughout the province that supports the development of players, coaches and officials at all levels, and creates a positive, enjoyable basketball experience for all.





MEMBER CLUBS

OUR STRATEGIC PLAN

Our plan highlights key strategies geared towards the growth and betterment of basketball overall - focusing on three key groups: Basketball Nova Scotia, our member club organizations, and our affiliated basketball participants. Our plan is also laid out in a format that aligns with the pillars of our Sport Development Tool, which supports the fiscal health and growth of Basketball Nova Scotia now and in the future.

ORGANIZATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS

Enhance and align BNS systems of governance

- Review and modernize policy framework, bylaws, and Board structure.
- Enhance Board representation and effectiveness and stabilize staff attrition rates.
- Establish stronger **systems of internal communication** and role definition to improve workflow and overall productivity.



Refine a member services approach that focuses on sustainable development of and connection with BNS Club infrastructure

- Improve efficiency and ease of athlete registration through roll-out of sport-wide registration system in partnership with Canada Basketball.
- Promote and expand Canada Basketball's Verification Program to BNS member clubs.

Promote core Safe Sport principles to all affiliated participants

- Promote and monitor all Safe Sport policies and procedures that are in effect (including coach screening, safe sport education, and grievance/incident reporting protocol) to all BNS-affiliated participants.
- In collaboration with the Nova Scotia Basketball Officials Association, enforce a respectful game environment for all, taking a zero-tolerance approach to abusive or disruptive behaviours.



PARTICIPATION

Promote safe, equitable, welcoming and inclusive participation of all Nova Scotians

- Encourage the affiliation of unsanctioned basketball organizations to BNS.
- Continue the development of wheelchair basketball programs on an outreach basis to athletes with a disability.



- Continue to partner with KidSport Nova Scotia to reduce financial barriers to participation in youth basketball and look to additional opportunities to mitigate the cost of participation.
- Work hand in hand with our **African Nova Scotia communities** and member programs to increase the opportunities for participation and growth at all ages and in all areas of the game.
- Establish ways to bring basketball opportunities to Nova Scotian indigenous communities and New Canadians / newcomers.
- Provide fun and innovative programming options to encourage **young girls** to stay in the sport.

Develop a sport-wide 'Basketball For All' technical plan, integrating all of BNS's competition, underpinned by Long Term Athlete Development compliance.

- Standardize provincial rules of play for all age groups.
- Introduce **3x3 basketball** at appropriate development levels, implemented in a phased approach.
- Expand the partnership with Junior NBA, to the benefit of BNS member clubs, and their work promoting and developing youth basketball.
- Move to a province-wide approach to the creation of a standardized competition structure.
- Expand competition-based playing opportunities for all at Sport For Life level for U13-U18 ages
- Clearly differentiate the NCCP Learn-to-Train, Train-to-Train and Train-to-Compete coaching pathways for competition from the Sport For Life coaching model which promotes participationdriven competition.

Drive Safe Sport practices into all basketball activities in BNS-affiliated clubs and programs.

- Ensure all provincial Safe Sport policies are adopted by all BNS clubs and basketball programs.
- Review BNS discipline policies and procedures and adjust to adopt modern Safe Sport practices.



PARTICIPANTS

COACHING & OFFICIALS

Continue to integrate basketball officials into BNS at a system and organizational level.

- Develop a Memorandum of Understanding with Nova Scotia Basketball Officials Association, outlining roles in support and enforcement of Safe Sport practices in game environments.
- Establish how and where BNS can provide enhanced support to the Nova Scotian basketball officiating community.
- Explore and support education opportunities to further the development of basketball officials in Nova Scotia



Enshrine coach development and coaching qualification standards in BNS's 'Basketball For All' technical plan.

- Increase the number of coach learning facilitators and evaluators who can deliver coaching courses and evaluate coaches.
- Drive BNS's newly developed **Introduction to Coaching Course** and provide access to all coaches in BNS member clubs and related development activities.
- Work with Canada Basketball to make coach certification more accessible and affordable for each individual coach.
- Work to support the addition of Learning Facilitators within member club organizations or regions to support the growth and development of coaches.
- Create minimum standards of coaching qualifications, starting with Intro to Coaching and Learn to Train certification.
- Encourage and work with clubs (particularly large, capable ones) to establish and fund resident coach development programs in their organizations.

Provide value-adding support to coaches, complementing club-delivered coach development endeavors

- Ensure Safe Sport training is actively delivered to all BNS coaches as a minimum coaching standard for all competitions.
- Offer and promote free professional development opportunities to BNS coaches.
- Commit to running an appropriate volume of coaching courses and clinics to match the demand.



MEMBER CLUBS

Establish capacity needed to develop and execute a modern excellence athlete development program structure.

- Improve the athlete identification model to ensure provincial reach.
- Identify and target the recruitment of top and emerging excellence coaching talent.



- Establish excellence program planning in partnership with Canada Basketball and the Canadian Sport Institute Atlantic that is funded and supported appropriately.
- Support excellence for our athletes and coaches by collaborating on programming with other provincial basketball organizations in Atlantic Canada.

Establish Excellence programming that integrates properly with club members activities and needs.

- Establish junior (U12-U14) and senior (U15-U17) programs of excellence and integrate their training with local club or high school activities.
- Integrate BNS-sanctioned competitions with its **excellence programs**, particularly as it pertains to high performance athlete training curriculum and associated game load.
- Align excellence programs with BNS' provincial team program and Canada Basketball National training camp activities.

Provide value-adding support to higher performing athletes

- Provide opportunities to train with like-skilled athletes.
- Provide consistent access to sport science/medicine resources such as strength & conditioning, mental performance and nutrition guidance.
- Ensure **Safe Sport policies and procedures** fully extend into advanced development systems, such as the provincial team program.
- **Celebrate and promote the success** of BNS excellence athletes and their athletic accomplishments, whenever they occur.
