President's Report to Ringette Calgary for the 2022-2023 Season

The 2022-2023 season was indeed busy for the athletes of AA Ringette Calgary. Many of our current and alumni athletes and one of our coaches had the honour of competing in the 2023 Canada Winter Games in PEI, and additional athletes represented Canada at the World Ringette Championships held in Helsinki. As an association we cheered Team Alberta, Team Canada Junior and Team Canada Senior to their Silver medal wins at these events.

AA Ringette Calgary hosted the Ring It On Tournament September 23-25 at the Great Plains Arena. The Matt Loh award was presented to the U16AA Regina Stingers and to the U19AA St. Albert Mission. Our association continued our tradition of having all teams and athletes participate as Team Jenna in the Ovarian Cancer Walk of Hope. We also held an association-wide clothing drive for the Making Changes Society, with over 2600 articles of clothing donated.

We also hosted the U14AA and U16AA Provincial Championships. It was an especially challenging task due to the lack of ice availability. The U14 competition was held at various rinks across Calgary, and the U16 competition was held in Hussar, Alberta. This resulted in a substantial volunteer requirement and multiple logistics to be planned. We extend our appreciation to the Provincials Host Committee, chaired by Kristy Assaly, for a terrific weekend. The year end banquet was also put together by Kristy, who was awarded the AA Ringette Calgary Service Award for the season.

We had the opportunity to recognize two of our coaches with awards. Shaundra Bruvall was selected for the Jenna Sauer Spirit in Coaching Award, and Terry Shinkewski was selected for the Ringette Alberta Excellence Award.

Our teams had great success on the ice this season. We would like to specifically recognize the following accomplishments:

Western Canadian Ringette Championships – U14AA:

- Jordan Niro and Payton Boyd were named to the All-Star team, and Jadee Patel won for fastest skater in the skills competition.



Canadian Ringette Championships:

U16AA:

- 4th place finish Team Core
- 5th place finish Team Current
- In the skills competition, Tasha Blackwell won skating agility, and Dani Falconer for hardest shot.

U19AA:

- Bronze Team Fusion
- 4th place finish Team Rise
- Team Fusion was awarded the Agnes Jacks True Sport award for sportsmanship.
- Regan Meier and Kaylee Armstrong were named 1st line all-stars, and Mia Hemstreet was named as a 2nd line all-star.

NRL:

- The Calgary Rath took home Bronze in the National Ringette League Championship, and the Agnes Jacks True Sport award for sportsmanship.
- The Rath coaches of Barb Bautista, Dallas Robbins, Nicole Prokop and Jeff Ung won the NRL Coaching Staff of the Year award
- Erin Ung was named Rookie of the Year, and Kaitlyn Youldon was named as Most Valuable Player. Brea Beck was named as the 2nd line all-star goalie.

Throughout the year, the Board of Directors have been working at documenting our processes and procedures for improving transition and succession planning for committee roles, renewing our mission and vision statements, and developing a strategic plan to continue to lead in the delivery of AA ringette programs. We aim to provide more transparent and informative resources for athletes and families who are considering our program. We are grateful for the volunteer efforts of all members who are contributing to our vision of leadership and high quality programming in ringette.

- very dire situation at RCal board level as many of these reps no longer have youth playing in the Chinook League; need volunteers to consider these board roles
- 2022 CRCs profits fund distribution committee formed to accept proposals for use of funds;
 contact Cheryl if any ideas for proposals to take to Ringette Calgary
- Sam Allison was the chair of CRL; Greg Otterson has stepped in as co-chair
- CRL aligned with RAB policy for recording defaulted games as 7-0 score
- As we know, Ringette Calgary denied our request for 2 goalies at U19 this season. The
 reasoning was due to an expected shortage of goalies in the associations, but actually ended
 up with a surplus of goalies. As a result, several goalies have quit at the association level due
 to not wanting to play at the B level. We will continue to request for RCal to approve 2 goalies
 at U19AA next year.
- O BV changed their Jingle Ring dates which gave us the opportunity to purchase that ice for Nov 17-19 at Great Plains. Some will be used for BGL as a hub weekend for U19AA league games with Calgary and Z2 as home hosts, some has been picked up by RAB, BV and SCRA for various uses, and the rest of the ice will be distributed to our 14AAs and 16AAs for their use as exhibitions or practices. More information to be provided to Head Coaches.
- Blended ice rate this season is \$260 / hr
- Ref mileage will be paid at \$0.45 / km for travel above 30 km
- WRCs needs volunteers such as minor officials, ticket booth, team hosts for USA or Czech, and more please see the WRC website for signup; Banner Crews opportunity also available

RAB Updates

- AGM was May 6, 7 and was also attended by RCan; Terry Shinkewski was awarded a RAB Excellence award; RAB fees were increased for this season
- o RAB board is also in need of volunteers; please consider these important roles
- RAB has aligned with SafeSport and has developed a new "warning letter" as an initial step in their disciplinary process for members
- AWG proceeding with U16 A/B/C athletes only, no AA participation
- added the U16C tier this season and implemented their Player Pathway Model for determining tiering for the associations. (It was noted during the Tiering Model presentation at the RAB AGM that their language around AA changed to calling it a program rather than a tier, and as such the AA athletes are removed from their tiering algorithm.)
- To accommodate their Tiering process next season, we may need to move our Tryouts a bit earlier to give RAB time to run their model and inform associations of their tiering targets

b) VP League (Heather H.)

• Thank you to the new volunteers stepping into roles this season on such short notice. Thank you also to those members who have chosen to stay on in their roles for another season and for those that have stepped up to fill vacant positions.

Ice Allocation

- stats from last year: 13/100 ringette players experienced a concussion last season, missed
 18 days on average; most were forwards

Jr Coach Program

- We have 5 excellent Jr Coaches assigned to teams this season. This is down slightly from 7 last season, however some of those previous Jr Coaches are now ACs which is exactly what the program hopes to see.
- Also want to address some misconceptions about the time commitment that is required of Jr Coaches. We understand that they are players with their own busy team schedules and as such they are not expected to be able to attend everything. I have heard things like "they have to attend all the events" or "they can't apply because they had a suspension in U12", and I want to clarify that there aren't any stipulations like this for our Jr Coaches. It is simply asked that they attend what they can in hope that they build their coaching skills and one day transition to ACs, which we have successfully seen happen this season and in previous seasons.
