


Financial Highlights - Revenues







Financial Highlights - Expenses








- ✓ Ice continues to be the largest expense; city ice has increased over the last several years from \$150/hour to \$192/hour and will increase again in the coming year
- Ringette Ontario fees are the 2nd largest expense
- ✓ The summer camp program has lost money each of the past 2 years; changes have been made that will hopefully bring us back to net \$0 or perhaps a small profit
- ✓ The tournament continues to make a profit, although less than last year due to the fact that fees were not increased
- ✓ The various clinics continue to make a small profit
- ✓ We have opted to not increase registration for 2019-2020, so the budget will be even tighter next year





A brief Education Session – ONTARIO RINGETTE GOVERNANCE







Novice & Regional, U12P, U14A: NCRRL (National Capital Regional Ringette League)

- All Eastern Region teams in these divisions play regular season games within the NCRRL
- NCRRL determines the composition of the various leagues based on player evaluation and team composite scores
- Travel as far as Kingston for season games, typically in the Ottawa Area (all associations which fall under ERRA PLUS Gatineau are part of the NCRRL)

U16A, U19A: LRQ (Ligue de Ringuette Québec)

- All NCR teams in these divisions play regular season games within the LRQ
- Travel as far as the Quebec City for season games (typically Montreal and surrounding areas)

U14AA, U16AA, U19AA: LERQ (Ligue Elite de Ringuette du Québec)

- All NCR teams in these divisions play regular season games within the LERQ
- Travel as far as Quebec City for season games






- ✓ GCRA registration was consistent:

- ✓ Held 2 CTR Events (Fall / Spring)



 - Communications to players/parents
 - Evaluation result management
 - Final team formations (competitive: with coaches)
 - Underage athlete requests / committees

 - Primary contact point for teams and escalation person for parents

- ✓ U19 Fletcher: Gold Medal at Whitby; Silver medal at GCRA
- ✓ Tons of team bonding activities
 - ➤ Bottle drives, BBQs, drum class at Movati, Skating at Rideau Hall, Archery, team dinners, Christmas parties, sharing ice at TD Place with our GCRA novice players, paint nights, team sleepovers, scavenger hunts in the hotel, laser tag, Escape Room......



Regional Complications:

- Request for players to 'play up' an age division to join friends/family;
- Friend requests at U12 and U19 accept a one-toone friend request;
- Complaints around U12 teams conforming to LTAD principles;
- Use of underage players for team viability at U12 and U14C levels;
- Complaints around individual player placement;
- Grumblings came from about 2% of our membership



Re-seeding November

- U12 Division: 17 teams split based on first half results. * next year, proposed that there is no mid-season split.
- U14B teams moved to A; play a skewed schedule and NOT play sister teams.

NCRRL Year-end Tournament

- From all accounts, the weekend was a success.
- The divisions used for tournament generally come from the re-seeded divisions
- Since U14A does not participate in year-end, U14B teams played in original division

Regional Report: Feedback from teamscoaches-players-parents



- Lack of goalies
- > Skills clinics open to interested Regional players (received positive feedback from those attending).
- Coach Mentors
- Clarification of NCRRL call-up rules
- "Curriculum" of incremental drill and plays
- Complaints process:
 - Issues of bullying
 - Tournament volunteer hours: too many for some families with multiple kids in different activities.
 - Lack of evaluators at Regional sort-outs; need for regional conveners;

- ✓ Many new players due to either the Come Try Ringette event or friends raving about the sport
- ✓ Many players who developed a love of the goalie role.
- ✓ Many fundraising and team bonding events, from bottle drives to nerf gun wars and playing with the older girls at TD place.
- ✓ U10 Archer won silver for the GCRA tournament
- ✓ U10 Hibbeln won gold for the Kingston tournament as well as the NCRRL tournament and then silver in the Arnprior tournament; great start for a new coach
- ✓ All our bunnies developed so much over the season but most importantly began their love of the sport!





Novice & Bunnies Complications:

- Placement of new players
- Friend requests –accept a one-to-one friend request (we may introduce a policy);
- Code of conduct issues;
- Low numbers for bunnies
- Formation of only 1 U8 team; decreases our future viability

Re-seeding November

Very little impact to novice teams & does not apply to Bunnies

NCRRL Year-end Tournament

- All teams participated
- Opening ceremonies were cancelled due to schedule of games; unfortunate for younger teams

Background: Why the change?

1972. 2002. Minimal maintenance, dated

- Duplication
- Gaps
- Difficult to read in current format
- Defined governance that does not align to our needs
- > Defined governance does not entice new volunteers

With the new bylaws you will see the following benefits:

- ➤ Modern, clearly articulated, easy flowing and understandable set of rules to which the GCRA Governing Body will be accountable
- New Governance Structure:
 - ✓ GCRA will now be administered by a set of councils putting more bums in seats;
 - ✓ Distributed workloads!
 - ✓ More transparency within councils helps more than one person be doing any one specific thing alone
 - ✓ A more effective governance structure with more evenly distributed workloads
 - ✓ Good succession planning
 - ✓ Oversight





New Structure

- Bylaws
 - Contain the only the rules
 - > Define what we are accountable for adhering to
 - ➤ Governance: Only fundamental governance is defined, rest stripped out
 - > No significant changes to what previous bylaws defined:
 - > Enhanced financial accountability
 - Enhanced discipline
 - ➤ New requirement to notify membership of proposed changes
- ➤ Governance is defined as a Minimum and Maximum number of people
 - Council format and role definitions defined in a separate policy
 - ➤ Will take time to implement 1 year or more
 - ➤ Elected body and appointees will work collaboratively to finalize the council formations and and job descriptions
 - > We need to be able to form councils to meet the needs and expectations of the membership
 - Welcome input from membership
