VIVIANE FOREST | KEYNOTE SPEAKER GOLD MEDALIST | PARALYMPIC ATHLETE AND OVERCOMING ADVERSITY EXPERT

Viviane Forest is one of Canada's most decorated Paralympic athletes and an inspiring public speaker on topics of corporate, education & community events. Viviane Forest shares her real story of overcoming adversity to earn success, in a genuine, strong manner that motivate people to be active and reach for their goals and dreams.

JASON CROOK | ALA TECHNICAL DIRECTOR EMPOWERING COACHES FOR SUCCESS AND TEAM ALBERTA PATHWAY

Jason grew up playing Minor lacrosse in Calgary with the Axemen Lacrosse Association, becoming a standout Junior prospect and enjoying a successful career with the Junior A Mountaineers.

His offensive talent and leadership led to his selection as the 1st overall pick by the Sr B Mounties in 2009. As team captain in 2010, he became one of Alberta's top offensive players, leading the Mounties to two President's Cup appearances and revitalizing the club's culture.

Coaching came naturally to Jason, who excels at teaching players and coaches. He co-led the Calgary Jr B Shamrocks to the Founders Cup National Championship in 2019 and continues to serve as GM and President. Jason is uniquely certified in both Box and Field lacrosse in Alberta, coaching both men's and women's teams, and also works as a current official.





RICHARD LACHLAN | ALA TECHNICAL SPECIALIST LACROSSE GAP ANALYSIS: IDENTIFYING OPPORTUNITIES FOR GROWTH AND IMPROVEMENT

Born and raised in BC, Richard played Minor lacrosse in Port Coquitlam, then Jr A with the Port Coquitlam Saints and Sr A with the New Westminster Salmonbellies. In 2016, he moved to Edmonton for work and joined the Sr B Miners, where he has remained.

A prolific goal scorer, Richard led the RMLL in scoring in 2018 and 2019 and holds the record for most goals in an RMLL Sr B season with 62 in 2017. He's also a three-time President's Cup champion and an All-American from Roanoke.

Recently, Richard joined the Jr A Miners coaching staff and has coached the 14UA West Edmonton Blues, the 14U Team Alberta boys' team, and served as offensive coach for U19 Team BC. He will work part-time as a Technical Specialist from Thursday to Sunday in the Edmonton area
