

## APPENDIX:

# Mixed

See below for competition specific details. The rules and details contained in the main body of the Competitors' Guide apply to this competition. In the event there is a perceived conflict between the Competitors' Guide and this appendix, this appendix is considered to take priority.

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This appendix is subject to further review and evaluation on, at minimum, an annual basis.

Teams competing in a Curling Alberta Provincial Qualifier do so with the knowledge that they must continue to play at all levels, up to and including the Provincial Championships, until they are eliminated. In effect, this means a competitor may enter the Mixed category and another category as long as there is no date conflict up to and including the Provincial Championship.

The draw and schedule for the Provincial Qualifiers and Provincial Championships will be supplied to all teams and posted on the Curling Alberta website. Reference the Competitor's Guide on the Curling Alberta website for details on the draw making procedure and seeding process.

### **A. PROVINCIAL QUALIFIERS:**

1. The details and format are as described in section 1 of the Curling Alberta Provincial Berth Policy.
2. Eight provincial berths are awarded in total, all through results at the Provincial Qualifiers.
3. There are no pre-qualifying berths in the Mixed category.
4. All games are 8 ends and are not timed, however, teams are still expected to maintain a reasonable pace of play as managed by the Chief Umpire.
5. There are no "free agents" in any Curling Alberta Mixed competition.
6. Teams MUST play with 4 players, 2 men and 2 women alternating delivery of stones.
7. The player delivering last stone and the player acting as vice-skip must be opposite gender.

## B. PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP

1. The format is an eight-team full round-robin with “top 3” playoffs.
2. All games are 8 ends and are timed.
3. Thinking time is 30 minutes and 4 minutes and 30 seconds for each extra end. The fourth end break is 5 minutes.
4. Teams will draw for hammer (LSD) in pre-game practice (broom holder and deliverer must be opposite gender).
  - i. Each team member must deliver one LSD during the round robin.
5. A designated spare pool will be provided and will include any eligible player who has not competed in the same event category at any level.
  - i. Teams will have equitable access to the spare pool for the entire event. In the event more than one team requires access to the spare pool at the same time, the Chief Umpire will determine the order of selection by random draw.
  - ii. The team may select a substitute from the spare pool (a different substitute is allowed for each game).
6. PLAYOFFS:
  - i. After the round-robin, the **first place** team will advance to the finals.
  - ii. The second and third place teams will play in a semi-final with the winner advancing to the finals (see Playoffs section 2(C)(5) in the Competitors’ Guide for complete details, including the procedure in the event of a tie for a playoff position).
