RULES AND REGULATIONS
2025

1. NATIVE HOCKEY ALBERTA SENIOR PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (NHASPC)

Shall be played under the official HOCKEY CANADA rules, except for the HOCKEY ALBERTA (HA) and Native Hockey Alberta Senior Provincial Championship (NHASC) Rules and/or Regulations adopted by Native Hockey Alberta Council (NHAC).

2. **REFEREES**

Certified Referees will be used throughout the NHASC.

- a. All participants (players, coaches & supporters) must respect their decision.
- b. There will be ZERO TOLERANCE on the abuse of referees.

3. **COACHES**

- a. It is MANDATORY that the following certification is always on the bench
 - i Head coach: First Aid and Respect in Sport Activity Leader.
 - ii Failure may result in team participation from NHASC.
- b. Maximum four bench staff per team
- c. Must be registered on RAMP.

4. **REGISTRATIONS**

- a. Teams are allowed to register if communities are in good standing with NHAC.
- b. Any player or coach currently serving a suspension in any NHAC-sanctioned event or ANY HOCKEY LEAGUE. The suspension must be served before stepping on the ice. Current suspensions can be found at www.nhac.ca under the senior tab.
 - i NHAC suspensions can be served during the NHASPC if the player or coach is registered and on the game sheet.
 - ii The completed game sheet must show what game and how many games the suspended player or coach served on the game sheet. See Rule (11. c. viii)
- c. All players and coaches must register through the NHAC RAMP registration system by March 28
- d. Additions after March 28 will be a \$100.00 late fee if you have open roster spots.
- e. All Teams must send in a master roster by March 20
- f. Colour Proof of Aboriginal descent must be uploaded onto RAMP to play in the NHASPC.
- g. The NHASPC official roster sheet will function as the master sheet for game sheets.
- h. Prior to all games, the game sheet will be verified against the master sheet.
 - i Any discrepancies found will result in forfeiture of the game, and further disciplinary action may occur.
- i. All teams must have two sets of jerseys. No taped numbers will be allowed on jerseys.
- j. All players must provide a picture ID and sign off on the master roster before playing the first game. The NHAC arena director or an NHAC board member may ask a player for their ID at any time during the NHASPC.

5. **DIVISIONS**

- a. Open Divisions (Ladies and Masters)
 - i Teams can ice or combine Players from any Treaty Area or Metis Regions within Alberta.
 - Onion Lake is considered a community in Alberta
 - ii Teams are allowed to register nineteen players (18 skaters, 2 goalies).
 - iii Players must have a STATUS CARD (No Letters)
- b. Community Divisions (Men's, Nakehko Lamouthe and Legends)
 - i Teams must ice a team within Treaty's or Metis Communities
 - ii Teams allowed one to import any position. Treaty to Treaty or Region to Region
 - The Treaty 6 community team must only use the Treaty 6 area for imports.
 - The Treaty 7 community team must only use the Treaty 7 area for imports.
 - The Treaty 8 community team must only use the Treaty 8 area for imports.
 - Metis community teams must only use from within West and East Regions or an MNA cardholder see below
 - o West Metis Settlements are Paddle Prairie, Gift Lake, Peavine and East Prairie.
 - West Metis teams can only use an MNA card holder from regions 4, 5 or 6
 - o East Metis Settlements are Buffalo Lake, Kikino, Elizabeth and Fishing Lake.
 - o East Metis teams can only use an MNA card holder from regions 1, 2 or 4
 - o MNA card holders home addresses will determine the region
 - iii Players need to play for their own community if their own community is registered.
 - iv No player release will be given. Except for goaltender
- c. Ladies Open
 - i Players must be 18 years old on the day the NHASPC commences.
- d. Master's Open
 - i Players must be 50 years old on the day the NHASPC commences. Goalies can be 48.
 - ii No slap shots allowed.
- e. Men's Community
 - i Players must be 18 years old on the day the NHASPC commences.
- f. Nakehko Lamothe Division Community
 - i Players must be 18 years old on the day the NHASPC commences.
- g. Legends Community
 - i Players must be 35 years old on the day the NHASPC commences.

6. **GAME REGULATION**

- a. All teams must be at the arena at least 45 minutes prior to game time.
- b. All games will start on time.
- c. Teams must start the game once six players or five players and goalie are on the ice.
- d. Any team unable to commence play 10 minutes after the game start time will forfeit the game, and the score will be 7-0
 - i A goal will be awarded to the team after 4 minutes, one goal for every minute thereafter if the team is late up to 10 minutes for a 7-0 forfeit win.
- e. Teams will not be allowed in the dressing room and warmups unless accompanied by a team official.
- f. If a 7 or more-goal differential exists at any time during the game shall be called.
- g. No ties in round-robin play.
- h. The finalized ice schedule will be posted at each arena. Match program schedule with arena postings.
- i. NAHC reserves the right to match the game times with ice availability.
- j. STOP TIME: 2 Goals or less within the last 5 minutes of the Game (All Games)
- k. 30-sec Timeout each team (STOP TIME ONLY)
- I. All teams will require a \$100.00 deposit for room keys. The dressing room will be inspected before the deposit is returned.
- m. Any damage reported by Arena staff in dressing rooms or facility by teams will be fined \$500.00. Must be paid before the next game, or the team is removed from the NHASPC.
- n. The top team is the home team in bracket play.
- o. Only teams paid in full will be out on the draw. Teams must have a minimum of twelve registered players on RAMP at the deadline to be put on the draw. Failure to do so will result in the team being removed. No refunds.
- p. Players cannot play in two divisions. If caught, the team will be removed from the tournament immediately and will be reviewed by NHAC.

7. **FORMAT**

a. Bracket Play, Pool Play, modified round robin, 3-game guarantee bracket, and True/Modified double knockout may be used for format in any division.

8. **FIGHTING**

a. No fighting allowed. Automatic suspension from the NHASPC and further review from NHAC.

9. **PENALTIES**

- a. All penalties assessed during straight times shall be:
 - i Minor penalty will be 3 minutes.
 - ii Major penalty will be 7 minutes.
- b. Penalties assessed during straight time will not commence until the puck is dropped.
- c. Stop time minor penalty will be 2 minutes.

10. **OVERTIME**

- a. Will be sudden victory, first goal wins.
- b. All play will be straight time.
- c. Overtime will run for five minutes
 - i Play will be three on three
- d. if no goal scored.
 - i Shootout will occur:
 - 1. Three players would shoot alternately if no goal scored.
 - 2. One player from each team will shoot alternately until winner is decided.
 - 3. Players cannot shoot again until all players from the team have shot.

11. **DISCIPLINE**

- a. All disciplinary rulings shall be final.
- b. Managers and coaches will be deemed responsible for the behavior of their teams and supporters.
- c. The Hockey Alberta minimum suspension guidelines, except for the following, will be used for suspensions.
 - i Any player who receives a 7.5(c)match for Checking from behind will be suspended for the remainder of NHASPC and will be reported for further disciplinary action.
 - ii A Gross Misconduct or Match Penalty assessed will result in suspension for the remainder of NHASPC and further review from NHAC.
 - iii Any player, coach, or manager who receives an 11.2(f), 11.3, 11.4, or 11.5 penalty will be suspended from the remainder of NHASPC and reported for further disciplinary action.
 - iv NHAC will review all major infractions and discipline accordingly.
 - v NHAC may continue a suspension to any NHAC sanctioned event and may include the following year.
 - vi Coaches and managers are responsible for reporting and recording any suspensions to NHAC.
 - vii Any coach and/or manager who does not disclose that a player is serving a suspension will be suspended for the remainder of the tourney.
 - viii Managers/Coaches are responsible to ensure the Scoresheet identifies suspensions properly (ex: 1 of 2, 2 of 2)
 - ix The coaches are responsible for ensuring that a player assessed a suspension does not participate in the next game.
 - x Please have someone from the coaching staff pick up the copied Score Sheet and Write-Up for your records.
 - xi ANY TEAM CAUGHT WITH UNREGISTERED PLAYERS OR BENCH STAFF WILL FORFEIT THAT SCHEDULED GAME

12. **RULE CHALLENGE**

- a. The Referee must be informed of Rule Challenge at the beginning of the game and/or during the game up to the end of the first period.
- b. The Rule Challenge must be received in writing along with a \$500 cash Challenge fee (non-refundable) to the Arena Director by the start of the second period.
- c. Must have documentation to go with Rule Challenge
- d. One Rule Challenge per \$500 fee
- e. All rulings are final and are not subject to appeal.
