#### 4.0 ADMHA President's Report-

This year started with 165 registrants, down to 158 at season end.

U18/U15 had good numbers for their divisions

U13 had good numbers – in the 30s; but challenging to decide on how to divide teams. Tough decision, lots of discussion – decided to form 3 teams.

U11 had 19-20 skaters – also a difficult choice of 1 or 2 teams; decided to make 2 teams with a couple of kids moved up from U9. Small teams; might have looked

U7 and U9 numbers really struggling; need to get these up to keep aDMHA healthy. Survey results – non-members: 2 major concerns were fees and time commitment Members: 2 main things – communication from exec to membership; concerns about the league.

League AGM has not been held yet; possibility of a couple of NAI teams moving to CAHL. A couple of comments asking about if NAI is the only league for us. We are on the boundary of NEAHL. Scott did a travel comparison NAI / NEAHL across divisions. NAI travel is consistently less. NEAHL managers have to schedule their own games. League – hasn't really followed through on mini-tournaments/multi game weekends.

Interleague play – mixed reviews on it; some close games, but lots of disparity too. Hockey Alberta minor league committee will need to do more work

Overall most of teams were tiered OK. Brought home a number of banners, and 2 teams went to provincials.

Provincials hosted – produced a substantial profit for ADMHA, roughly \$27-28k; strong community support. Thanks to the committee, ADMHA members who volunteered, sponsors, community member volunteers.

Cabaret – the organizing committee had been working on this for 4 years – first as pigs'n'pianos, then covid, then last year with restrictions, then this year and changed the dates to coincide with provincials weekend.

Thanks to everyone in ADMHA, a privilege to be part of the executive, coaching, officiating; best of luck for next year and in the future.

Total \$205k in bank, \$125 in savings.

This is interim statement as of today. Fiscal year end is planned to change to April 30 to match season

Income of about \$28k from provincials,

Overall net loss of \$55k this year to date, but casino proceeds are not yet known. Typically brings in about \$30k

Registration fees have NOT been increased this year. To try to promote new members to join; but this size of loss cannot be sustained. Need to make decisions about fees, fundraising, etc.
