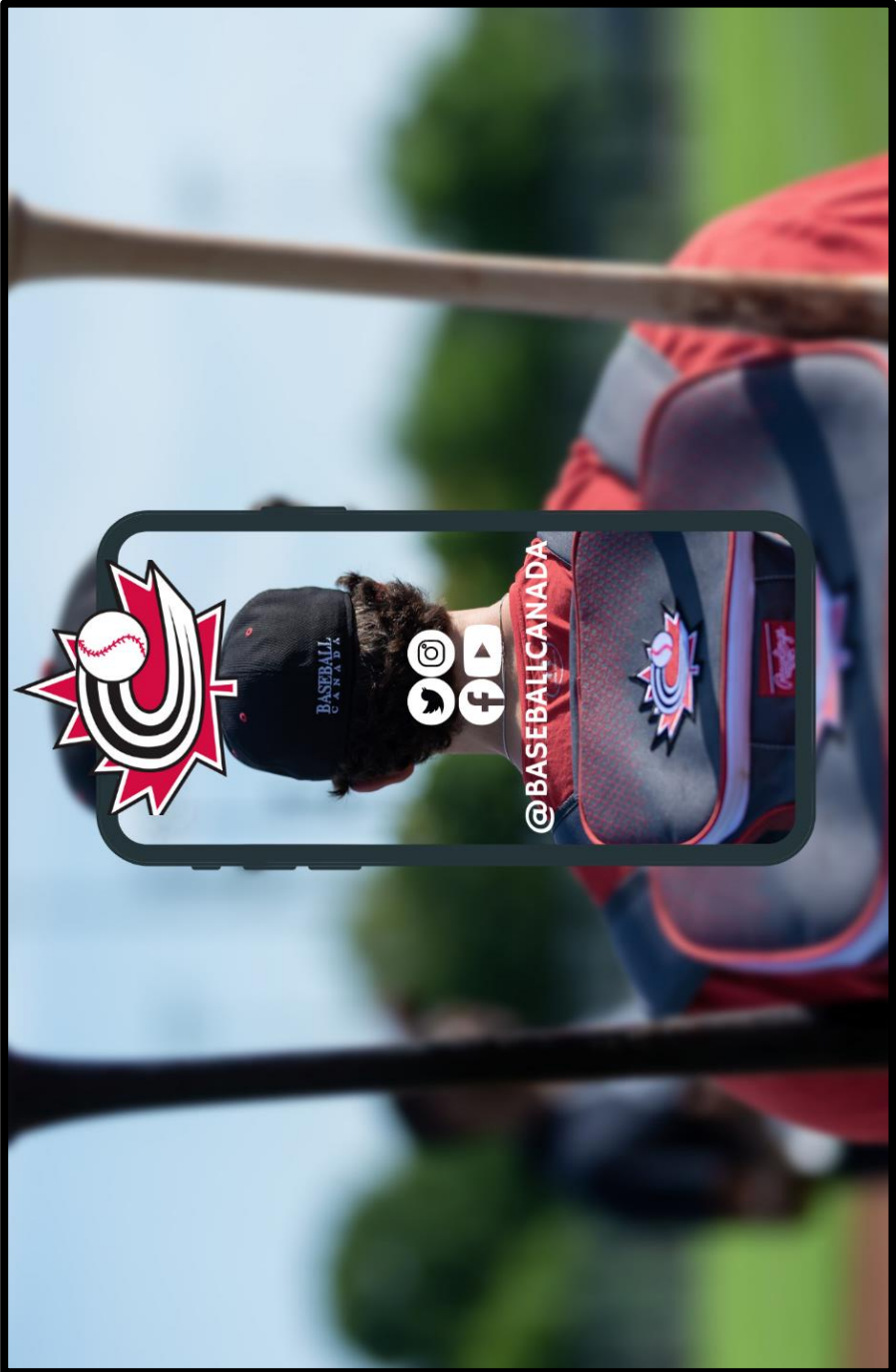

HISTORY of the MANITOBA BASEBALL ASSOCIATION

In 1952, under the leadership of Doug Cove of Winnipeg and Laurie Artis of Dauphin, the Manitoba Amateur Baseball Association was formed which has had as its primary purpose to organize and administrate provincial playoffs in various categories of Pee Wee, Bantam, Midget, Juvenile and Junior. This organization stayed in place until 1966 when it became known as the Manitoba Baseball Association Incorporated. Following a successful tenure in minor age categories, this organization decided to join with the intermediate and senior baseball bodies to form the Manitoba Baseball Association (MBA) in 1968. At that re-organizational meeting, under President Murray Zuk, the MBA also affiliated with the Canadian Federation of Amateur Baseball. The aim of the association was to administer baseball throughout the province and provide a level of consistency in the process.

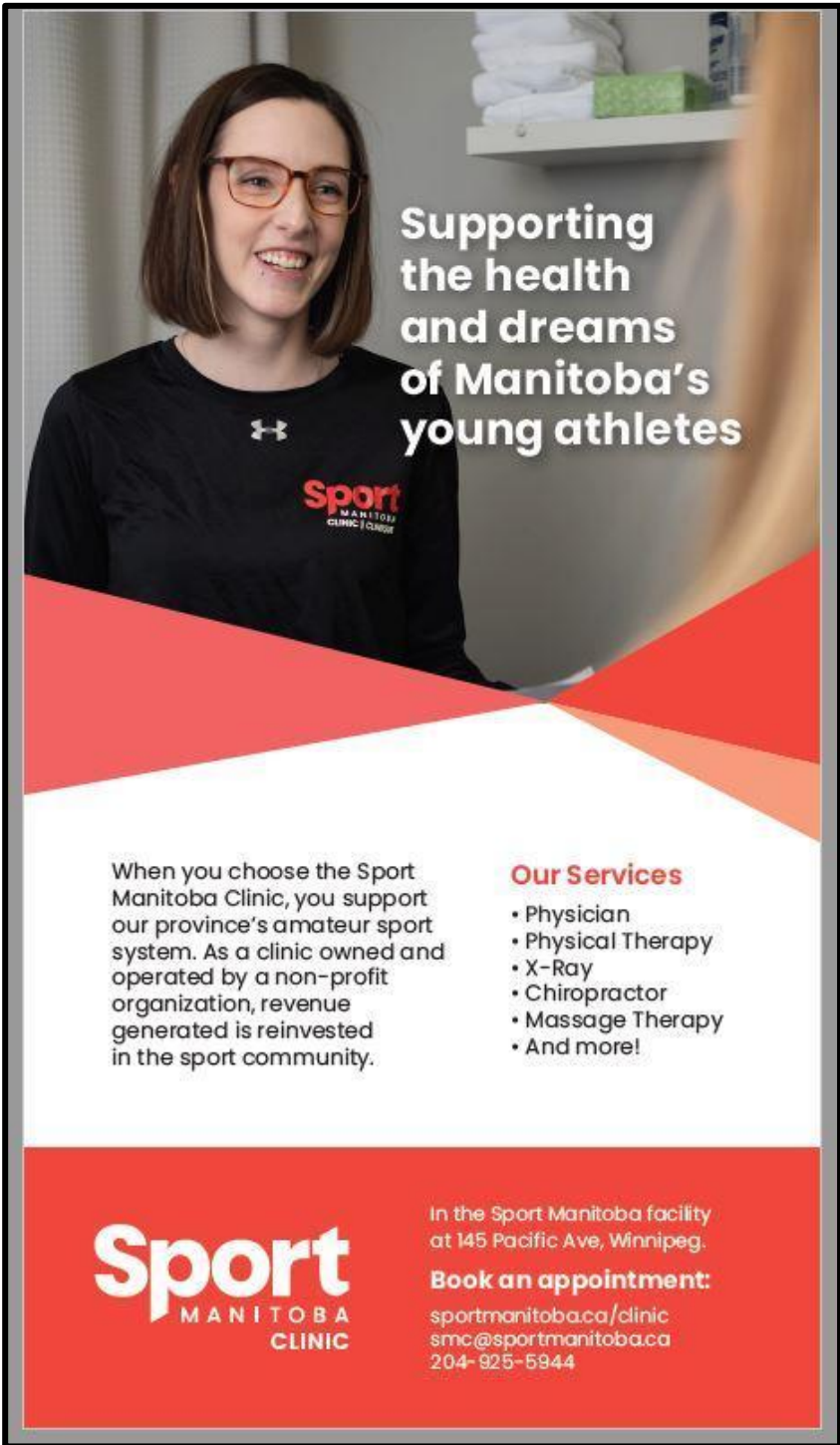

"FIELD OF DREAMS" SCHOLARSHIP

The Winnipeg Goldeyes Baseball Club, in conjunction with the Baseball Manitoba, will provide three (3) \$1,000.00 post-secondary scholarships to applicants who meet the required criteria. The criterion is as follows:

1. Must be a Manitoba resident.
2. Must be enrolled, or planning to enroll, in a post-secondary institution (Canada or U.S.). Scholarships may be conditional in that funds will be withheld until such time as the recipient provides proof that they are attending or will be attending a post-secondary institution.
3. Must be a registered member of Baseball Manitoba (player, coach, or official).
4. Must complete the application form on-line and submit by the required deadline.
5. Requirements for selection shall include, but not be limited to athletic achievement in baseball, academics, and citizenship.
6. The following must accompany the application before the application will be considered:
 - (a) A letter from the Principal or Post-Secondary Administrator certifying the candidate's scholarship, character and ability, and participation in school activities.
 - (b) If the candidate has graduated or is graduating from high school, a final transcript of the student's marks for grade 12 or a certified photocopy of the Permanent Record Card. If neither is available, a typed copy of the Permanent Record Card verified by the Principal or Post-Secondary Administrator's signature will be accepted.
If currently in a post-secondary institution, include a certified photocopy of university grades.
7. Disbursement of scholarship funds is on a "one-time" basis and is not intended as a yearly subsidization program. If a candidate is unsuccessful in their first application, they may apply again. There is no limit to the number of times a candidate may apply, other than the condition of having previously received a "Field of Dreams" scholarship.
8. Athletes receiving carding from Sport Canada or the Province of Manitoba are ineligible.

The selections of the "Field of Dreams" Scholarship program selection committee are final. Winners will be notified of their selection and will receive their cheques on "Field of Dreams" Day, in August at Blue Cross Park in Winnipeg.

Grand Slam is the official 9U program for Baseball Manitoba. This Baseball Canada Program is designed to develop skills in our young players by reducing team sizes and encouraging touches of the baseball through practice and game situations.

The Grand Slam Program is designed to promote physical development of children through the game of baseball. The program helps develop physical literacy by using a modified game to teach the basic baseball skills to children and ensure success. The program is designed for children of eight and nine and consists of four categories of activity fit into two seasons.

Grand Slam Goals

1. Create a healthy environment in which children of various levels of ability find pleasure in learning baseball
2. Initiate or pursue the development of basic baseball skills and strategies for players
3. Teach and develop sportsmanship in a context of healthy competition
4. Develop and promote self-esteem in children

General Information

There are no hard and fast rules for Grand Slam. Baseball Canada has put forth guidelines; teams of 6, all players in the infield, all players bat each inning, no walks or strikeouts, etc. Typical game days could include a 15-30-minute practice and then a game with another team afterward. 60-90 minutes total. Baseball Manitoba can also provide stickers and sticker books for players depicting famous Canadian baseball players - awarded for successfully completing categories, within Grand Slam.

The Challenger baseball games are played in a fun, safe environment where no score is kept. Able-bodied “Buddies” are assigned to each participant. These Buddies assist the Challenger players with their involvement in the game. Pushing wheelchairs around the base path, assisting players in how to hold the bat and swing, or providing protection for the Challenger player from a batted ball, are just a few of the ways the Buddies offer a better experience for the participants in Challenger Baseball.

Each participant is treated like every other player in the conventional baseball program. All players are outfitted in uniforms, use the same equipment, and play their games at the local baseball parks.

Prospects Showcase

The 11U and 13U Prospects Showcase events are back for 2024. The purpose of the showcase is to give players that are not on the league AAA team an opportunity to develop and participate in a high level of baseball and further develop their skills and interest in the game. While many of the players on the teams may be first-year players, some second-year players that do not make the league AAA team could make this team – as well as second year players from the age category below. All leagues are strongly encouraged to enter a team to facilitate the development of their future players.

To maintain the developmental focus of these events, there will be no medals or awards handed out based on order of finish, and the winning team will not advance to interprovincial competition. Teams may be seeded after the preliminary round(s) to maintain a competitive balance. Leagues can enter up to two teams per age category and can combine with other leagues if players are needed to make a team.
