SPERO LEAKOS, CALGARY, AB- died March 6, 2020, at the age of 92 years. Spero's love of the game of baseball greatly influenced baseball in Saskatoon for decades. He was inducted to the Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame in 1986.

I grew up with practical parents. A mother, God love her, who washed aluminum foil after she cooked in it, then reused it. She was the original recycle Queen before they had a name for it. A father who was happier getting old shoes fixed rather than buying new ones. Their marriage was good, their dreams focused. Their best friends lived barely a wave away. I can see them now. Dad in trousers, tee shirt and a hat and Mom in a house dress, lawn mower in one hand and a dish towel in the other. It was the time for fixing things-- a curtain rod, the kitchen radio, screen door, oven door, and a hem on a dress, Things we keep! It was a way of life and sometimes it made me crazy. All that re-fixing, eating and renewing. I wanted, just once, to be wasteful!. Waste meant affluence. Throwing things away meant you knew there would always be more.
