MACDONALD, DONALD, LLOYDMINSTER, SK.-died September 17, 2023. Don was 82 years of age. Don was involved with the Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum from the beginning, working with the Founder, David Shury. Don was a member of the Saskatchewan Hospital Royals Baseball Team, the 1956 Saskatchewan Senior Baseball Champions, and inducted into the Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame in 2004. Don was a member of the Board of Directors for the past four decades.

WALLACE, RON, SASKATOON, SK. -April 6, 1939-March 25, 2023. Ron died at the age of 83 years. Ron was inducted into the Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame in 2009 for his contribution to baseball in Saskatchewan.

JANE'S CORNER

Jane,

All of us old ball players read your newsletter with great interest and you deserve all the praise you get the work you do. I read the Obits Section in your last newsletter with mixed emotions. Sorrow in the passing of some special baseball people but fondness in the memories I have of time spent with each of them.

The first time I played baseball against Jackie McLeod was in the summer of 1966. It was my rookie year in the South Saskatchewan League and I was having a pretty good year defensively playing shortstop for the Melville Millionaires. When, early in the game, one of the Swift Current Indians hit a ground ball through the infield to my right that I couldn't get to, Jackie McLeod could be heard from the dugout. He was all over me with cat calls on my lousy range. In those days, riding players on other teams wasn't such a big deal but his vitriol cut deep. As a kid growing up, he had been one of my sports heroes. I had pictures of him as a member of the international hockey champion Trail Smoke Eaters pinned on the wall in my bedroom. So here was my boyhood hero publicly bad mouthing my playing ability. But on the ball diamond what goes around comes around. In the bottom of the ninth, Swift Current, trailing by a run, had the bases loaded with two out and Jackie McLeod was at the plate with a 3-2 count. All runners were moving and Jackie hit a high bouncing grounder deep into the hole to my right which I fielded and threw him out at first. I never ever asked Mr. McLeod "How's that for range?" but relating that story to his son who later became a teammate and a good friend brought some smiles.

My first game with the Saskatoon Commodores in the Northern League was in Kindersley. Prior to that game there had been some newspaper publicity on the good year I had had with Melville in the Southern League. Midway through the game with a man on first, a Klipper hit a slow ground ball to our second baseman. We tried for the double-play and on the relay at second, the runner from first slid in like a freight train cutting my legs out from under me resulting in a tumble in the dirt for both of us. It was a perfectly good clean slide that was followed with a sarcastic "Welcome to the Northern League" and shins that remained a multitude of colours for the next month. The runner was Jerry Flanagan. I played against him for many years after and saw that he continued to play with that same intensity and always with class.

Sometime later in the year while playing the Biggar Nationals, we faced Clarence Proctor. I was on a 10 or 11 game hitting streak and in that game every one of our hitters got at least one hit. However, Clarence Proctor tidily brought my hitting streak to an abrupt end. I went zero for five against his off-speed breaking pitches. Biggar had some hard-throwing Americans but I always preferred seeing them in the starting lineup rather than Clarence.

Ron Wallace was the first playing coach I met when I tried out for the Saskatoon Commodores in 1967. I continued to play ball with him over the following years. He was the first playing coach I had when I retired to play old timer baseball in 1987. As old timers, we played together in tournaments all over Saskatchewan, in Phoenix, AZ, and in a 50 plus tournament in Puerto Rico. Good memories on the diamond through a couple of decades.

Somewhere in some tournament I know I was in the batter's box while Bernie Albers toed the mound. Can't remember how it went for either of us. But I think I know how Bernie felt this past March, during what I imagine was a time of failing health for him, while his son Andrew pitched for Canada in the 2023 World Baseball Classic in Phoenix, AZ. I was in attendance at each of Canada' pool games and Andrew was one of the few bright lights on the mound for Canada. I know he did his father proud in each of his outings. I was proud that he was a baseball player form Saskatchewan. Randy Munch. June 2023

HOW TO PREPARE A NOMINATION FOR INDUCTION INTO THE SASKATCHEWAN BASEBALL HALL OF FAME

<u>BASIC NOMINATION FORM</u> – complete this separate sheet, providing information of the Nominee and the Nominator.

-An individual is not allowed to nominate themselves.

-NOMINATION DEADLINE IS MIDNIGHT MARCH 15TH EACH YEAR.

CATEGORIES

Individual-player or builder, or both. Builder includes coaches, managers, umpires, executive or any combination thereof. These are selected each year in April to be inducted in August of that year.

Team-selected one [1] year in advance.

Family-selected one [1] year in advance.

Team and family nominations should be prepared as close as possible according to the *guidelines*.

Community-selected one [1] year in advance.

Community nominations should be based on the history of the community and it's support of baseball.

THE SUMMARY

This should be a comprehensive, concise, written nomination of the individual, team, family or community of their contribution to **Saskatchewan's** rich baseball history.

It must be -**in the 2nd person-not the first.** [An individual is not able to nominate themselves.]

-typed or clearly printed -no more than 3 pages in length

Each selection committee member will receive a copy to review prior to making the selection.

GUIDELINES-summary of baseball accomplishments should include

- position played
- awards,
- -years of participation
- -teams and leagues played in
- -statistics, if available
- -key games

-key championships

-nominee characteristics

-basic family information [name of spouse/number of children]

-Brief comments on community involvement or other accomplishments.

-Supportive materials

-first-hand accounts from peers, coaches, officials, or fans -local, regional, provincial or national media and newspaper articles -photographs

OTHER INFORMATION

The Selection Committee consists of thirteen [13] individuals from throughout the province. Each thoroughly reviews every nomination then votes to select those to be inducted. This voting is done the middle of April.

Nominations submitted but not selected are retained and presented in the following years until selected. Nominations not selected after being reviewed for five [5] years, may be determined inactive or rejected. PLEASE GET YOUR NOMINATIONS IN BY MARCH 15, 2024.
