**2023 Spring/Summer Minor Baseball Registration**

We invite you to have your children be a part of minor baseball in the Battlefords! Some of the benefits of having your boy or girl play baseball include:

- *There are teams for all ages and skill levels.*

- *Baseball provides an opportunity for great physical activity while being outdoors.*
- *There is a May-June Season for noncompetitive teams.*
- *There is an April-July Season for competitive/provincial teams (with tryouts in March and April).*

**Registration Options:**

1. **Mail in Registration** – The registration form is available on the BMBI website and can be mailed to the address under *contact information* with payment included (cheque or e-transfer).
2. **Email Registration** – The registration form can be emailed to the BMBI email address and payment made through E-transfer.
3. **Online Registration** – Click on the online registration option on BMBI website and follow the directions.
4. **In-Person Registration** – Will be available at one of our upcoming baseball camp nights, with dates to be posted on the website and Facebook pages as they are made available.

**Deadlines:** April 1 for regular registration. We will take registrations up to April 15<sup>th</sup>, but a late fee of \$50 will be imposed for any registrations received after April 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Payment options:** credit/debit, cash, cheques, and e-transfers are accepted.

**Coaches Needed:**

Our organization relies on parent volunteers for coaching, and we truly appreciate all those who have helped out in previous years. As the number of players increases, it is important that we keep team sizes manageable for the kids to get the playing time that they need for skill development. Therefore, we are asking all parents to consider coaching or assisting. We will help you transition into those positions.

Coach development is important to help us grow our player skills. There are training opportunities on-line and there will be opportunities for in-person coach development in North Battleford as well as in other locations. Clinics will be held prior to the season. These clinics can really help with ideas for drills

and skill development for our players. **BMBI will reimburse coaches for their participation in certifications and training events!**

If you are interested in coaching, please ensure to check the box in the appropriate section on the Registration Form. You don't have to have a kid playing to coach!

### **UMPING Opportunities**

Baseball in the Battlefords cannot proceed without umpires and developing new umpires is a key focus for this administration.

- Anyone **12 years of age or older** can take the umpiring clinic, which is provided prior to the start of the season. Umpire coaching and mentorship is also provided throughout the season.
- Younger umpires gain experience through umpiring the younger age groups such as the 11U house league.
- Umps are paid on a per-game basis, and umpiring is great way to earn some spending money.
- Younger umps with at least 1 or 2 years of experience are paired with more experienced umpires for older age divisions.
- Experience being an umpire looks great as a community activity on a resume for older students.

**Volunteers** are necessary for ensuring the success of the baseball programs in the Battlefords. If you don't feel comfortable coaching, there are many other ways to volunteer. As well, we have **4 Directors positions** open, and this is a great way to get involved and provide input into our baseball programs. Our monthly meetings occur on the second Wednesday of each month, and you are welcome to attend a meeting to see if it is something you would like to be a part of before making the commitment.

### **Understanding the Divisions and Setting Expectations:**

The information for each division may be slightly different than outlined below depending on access to leagues, the number of players, and access to fields. Every effort will be made to ensure fair play and a good experience for all those involved.

**8U (2015 – 2018):** 8U is divided into junior and senior teams with a focus on skill development through fun drills with some game play. Team plays twice a week, on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Juniors run from 5:30 to 6:30; Seniors from 6:30 to 7:30 at Kinsmen fields. Parent coaches and volunteers are necessary to help keep kids engaged, focused, learning and having fun.

**11U (2012 – 2014):** Evaluations and tryouts for provincial and competitive teams will start in March/April. One provincial team will be chosen at the start of the year, and this will be a travelling

team that plays outside of the house league. The remainder of the children will be divided among equal teams and play in a house league on Kinsmen fields, with a year-end tournament in June. A second provincial team may be chosen from the house league teams or at the start of the year if coaches are available and there is enough interest. Pitch count rules will be enforced, and all players will be expected to have experience playing all positions. The evening games for the house league will consist of a 45-minute practice followed by 45 min game. Coaches and assistant coaches are required for each team.  
Division 11U Coordinator – TBD

**U13 (2010 – 2011) & U15 (2008 – 2009)**: Evaluations and tryouts for teams will start in March/April or earlier. Teams will be determined based on the number of players registered and leagues available to play in. Travel outside of North Battleford and participation in tournaments is to be expected. Provincial teams will play a longer season, with more details available during evaluations.

**U18 (2005 – 2007)**: Evaluations and tryouts for team(s) will start in early 2023. The main team is competitive and plays throughout Saskatchewan as part of the Saskatchewan Premiere Baseball League. Depending on the number of players, there could also be a second team that would be less competitive with more local play.
