## BATTLEFORDS AAA SHARKS REPORT - submitted by Jeanne Gilchrist, Director/Treasurer April 20, 2023

Preparing the report for BMHA's Spring Meeting is always an opportunity to reflect on the recently finished season.

This report provides a recap of some difficult decisions, moving the program forward as well as activities & contributions that have been positive for both the organization and the community at large.

At this elite level of hockey, as we are all aware, being in 7<sup>th</sup> place with a W2, L25, 3 OTW record puts us at the bottom of the standings. The season started off well, with a roster of 17 keen on picking up the momentum from the end of the 2021-22 season. Several games were close, losing by only 1 or 2 goals. However, by December 2022 it became apparent this was not the season anyone was looking for. Morale was low and many players were frustrated with their development. Concerns were being brought forward not only within our association but also the larger hockey community.

It's the board's job to be proactive, to listen to concerns, do our homework and make decisions that best serve the players and the organization, while continuing to support and promote female hockey. It was this very process that aided the board in the difficult decision to make a coaching change.

The decision was made with the best interests of the players and the program moving forward. The hope was to provide a reset, a fresh slate and that it would provide a positive atmosphere in the dressing room for the remainder of the season.

It was also a turning point that presented its own set of unforeseen challenges. There were lessons learned. It became apparent the communication between the board and the players & their parents was not as clear as the board presumed. We have noted the areas where questions arose. Moving forward we will ensure a clear understanding of policies and procedures.

Despite concerns raised during this season, the board is the stable foundation which remains constant. Players join our organization for a maximum of three years and then move on into their lives as young adults. Currently the Board consists of myself as Director/Treasurer, Wayne Brazeau as Secretary, Roger Blaquiere as Director of Scouting, Steph Green as Billet Coordinator/Member at Large, Kyle Kellgren and Patricia Mickeljohn as BMHA Reps, Ashley Rafuse, Erik Marcoux, and Noel Kingwell as Members at Large.

The board members have a depth of knowledge, both professionally, personally and through volunteering over many combined years within all areas of the hockey experience. This serves us well. Each board member is passionate about keeping the Battlefords AAA female hockey program evolving and organized. Key to our programming is mindful steps, whether at the board level, or for the players on the ice or in school. All of which will naturally pave the way to success.

Carolanne Pylypow stepped down as Secretary in August 2022. We were grateful for her knowledge and commitment to the association during the previous four years.
