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If you would like to join a fantastic group of volunteers, becoming a soccer coach is something that we believe is very fulfilling and rewarding, not just for the youth participants in our soccer programs but for you, the volunteer. There are many benefits to joining this group such as:

1. Sharing Your Love of the Sport with Youth Soccer Athletes

Often a coach reconnects with their love of sport by coaching. When you are passionate about the sport but take on the role of the coach, you learn new facets to the sport that make it both exciting and new for the coach, which in turn provides a wonderful environment for the youth players. To see that passion and love for the sport helps our youth players continue to participate and develop in the game with hope that they remain in the sport long after they have grown into adulthood.

2. Helping Youth Access the Benefits of Participating in Youth Soccer

With Canada Soccer Association (CSA) and their program for Long-Term Player Development (LTPD) it has been discovered that coaches are pivotal to helping the development of today's youth soccer athletes with focus not just on the physical aspects of the sport, but also mental development, psychological and social development as well. Whether as a head coach or an assistant coach, coaching youth soccer athletes helps to set the athletes on a path towards lifelong awareness.

3. Feeling the Rewards of Servicing Others

As a coach, you have the opportunity to see the impact you have on the athletes as well as the community. Often in the rural areas, to run a program for youth takes dedication. To contribute to the community through coaching adds to the legacy of the soccer program in the community.

4. Fostering Relationships

With the pressures of everyday life through work and other commitments, adults sometimes lose track of being a part of a "common community". As a soccer coach, you have a unique opportunity to meet other coaches and volunteers who are also committed to the same goal of providing the youth of the community with a soccer program they can experience and grow with. There is a good chance that good friendships can be forged by being part of the community soccer program.
