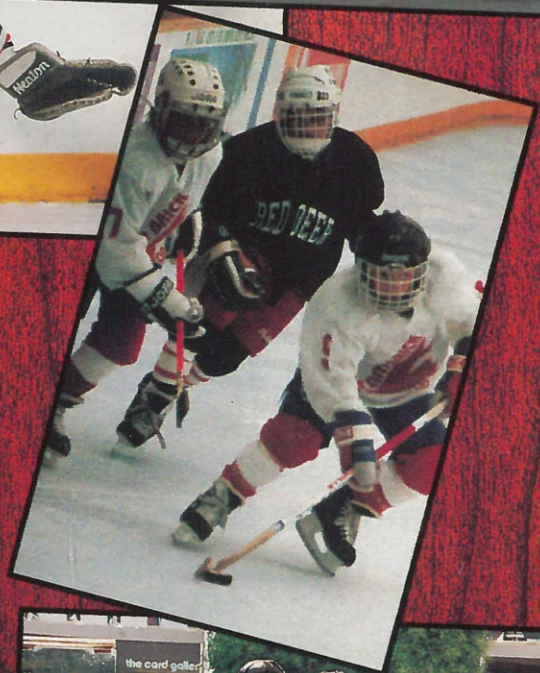
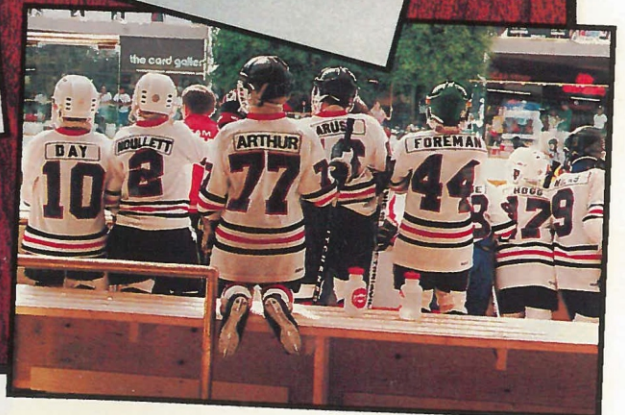


LETTER FROM THE TOURNAMENT CHAIRMAN

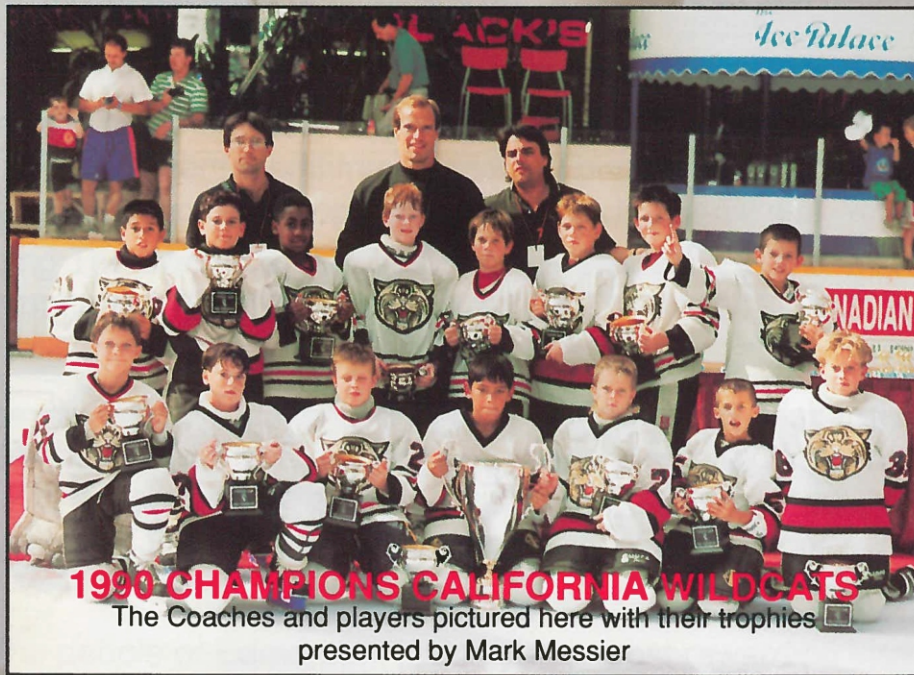

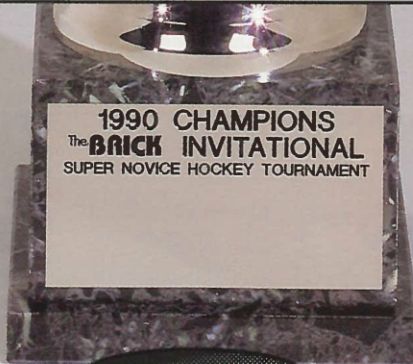

CENTRAL ALBERTA SELECTS

The Central Alberta team is comprised of players from Bashaw, Sylvan Lake and Red Deer. All players are novice players and were the top players in their respective leagues. Although the players were not chosen in a camp, they had all played against each other throughout the season in league and exhibition games. At the end of March the ice was taken out in Central Alberta and the coaches picked their players based upon the most recent season experience. They are scheduled to play exhibition games against Edmonton and are looking forward to the tournament as they fared very well last year and feel that this years team gives the proper balance to provide successful competition in their division.



TOURNAMENT FORMAT

1. The Tournament will be comprised of Super Novice players only, born on or after January 1, 1981.
2. The Round Robin format will consist of ten teams in two Divisions.
3. All games will utilize registered minor hockey league game officials.
4. Round Robin games will consist of three (3) twelve minute stop periods. In the event of a tie NO overtime period will be played (Note: the teams will also change ends and benches at the sixminute mark of the second period.)
5. All Semi-Final and Final games will be the same format as the Round Robin games except that in the case of a tie, overtime will be played (see tie breaking procedures).
6. Two (2) points will be awarded for a win, one (1) point will be awarded for a tie and zero (0) points will be awarded for a loss.

AWARDS

1. Each game will feature 1st, 2nd and 3rd star trophies.
2. Each member of the Semi-Finalist teams in a losing effort will receive a semi-finalist trophy.
3. Each member of the finalist team in a losing effort will receive a finalist trophy.
4. Each member of the Tournament winning team will receive a replica of the Brick Cup which remains on display at The Brick Head Office, plus a Sony Walkman.
5. The Tournament top scorer will receive a Wayne Gretzky trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
6. The Tournament M.V.P. will receive a Brett Hull trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
7. At the completion of the tournament, First and Second All Star Teams will be selected and each member will receive a trophy.

TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Playing rules will be those used during the regular season in Edmonton in accordance with the C.A.H.A. and E.M.H.A.
2. Any team unable to commence play within ten (10) minutes after scheduled starting time, will forfeit that game and the opposing team will be awarded a 5 - 0 score.
3. Any protests must be made known prior to five (5) minutes after the game in question. A written account must be submitted to the Tournament Director no later than one (1) hour after the game, on the forms provided. "THE DECISION OF THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE IS FINAL!"
4. Any player who receives a match penalty (i.e.: intent to injure) will be suspended for the duration of the tournament.
5. Any team official who receives a misconduct, will be suspended for the duration of the game, and his team will be assessed a two (2) minute penalty, to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
6. Any player or team official who receives a second major penalty, or second misconduct penalty, or a match game misconduct, or a gross misconduct penalty, shall be suspended from further play in the tournament.
7. Any of the Rule No. 6 penalties will also carry a five (5) minute bench penalty to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
8. Any major penalties & the results of these penalties are subject to review by the committee, immediately following that particular game.
9. **NON CONTACT! BODY CONTACT FOULS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED**

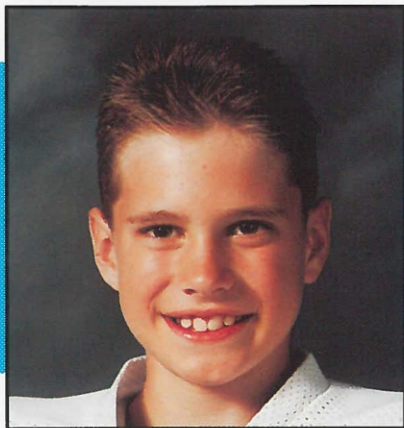
LOS ANGELES JUNIOR KINGS

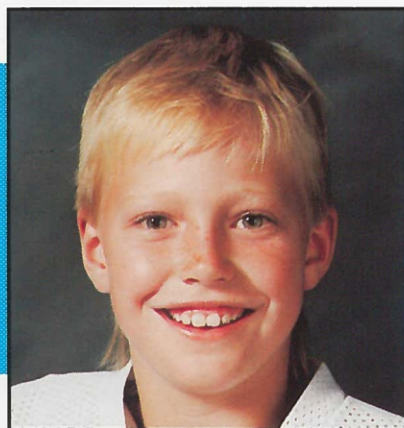
#97 David Iwanyshyn

TEAM CZECHOSLOVAKIA

The Hockey Committee for the Brick Tournament are very happy to have the team from Czechoslovakia representing this age group in Canada for the very first time. Mr. Rich Winter and Mr. Paul Bily have assisted greatly in coordinating the planning for the team's arrival in Canada.

Czechoslovakian hockey is run out of clubs, each consisting of many teams ranging from entry level Atom to First League, the source of the National Team. It was financially impossible for this team to enter the tournament, however, thanks to Canadian Airlines and The Brick, their dream is now a reality. Miro Henys of Henys Sports Corporation, an organizer of European Hockey Tournaments, was contacted and assisted in making all of the necessary arrangements for the Czechoslovakian team with respect to Visas, etc.

The team consists of 15 players, 8 from the industrial City of Litvinov and 7 from the famous pilsner beer City of Plzen. The players will practice as a team one week before their departure to Edmonton and will be in Edmonton for 10 days, August 4th to 13th. The members of the Czechoslovakian organization would like to thank The Brick Warehouse Corporation for this tremendous opportunity that is indeed a once in a lifetime event.



TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES

A. TIE-BREAKING - ROUND ROBIN PLAY

In the event of a tie after completion of Round Robin play, the team(s) that will be declared the Division Winner(s) and advance to the playoffs shall be determined as follows:

- a) most points in Round Robin play.
- b) in case of a tie, the team having won the game between each other will advance.
- c) if still tied, the team with the best +/- (goals for - goals against).
- d) if still tied, the team with the fewest goals against will advance.
- e) if still tied, the team with the most goals will advance.
- f) if still tied, the team with the fewest minutes in penalties will advance.
- g) if still tied, then a single flip of a coin by the Tournament Director will determine the team to advance.

Note: in any of the above possibilities, if the tie is a 3, 4, or 5 way tie then once one team has been selected, all other teams will then go through the same tests once more to determine the second team to advance.

B. TIE-BREAKING - PLAY-OFF ROUNDS (SEMI-FINAL & FINAL)

In the event of a tie after the end of regulation play, the teams will change ends and play one five minute sudden-death overtime period. Play will end as soon as one of the teams scores and, barring dispute, that team will be declared the winner.

In the event of a tie after the end of the sudden-death overtime period, the goalkeepers will be removed and each team will play with five (5) players. Play will continue until the first goal is scored and the team scoring the goal will be declared the winner.

- a) all penalties that are assessed during the regular time but were not served in their entirety must be completed in the overtime period.
- b) no player(s) shall be allowed to enter the goal crease to guard against a shot. A minor penalty will be assessed for violating this rule.
- c) no player shall be allowed to freeze the puck in his goal crease. A minor penalty will be assessed for violating this rule.
- d) players are allowed to enter the goal crease to play or clear the puck, provided the puck has PRECEDED the players into the goal crease.
- e) the puck must be shot from within the defensive teams zone by a player within the defensive zone in order to score a goal. The goal will be disallowed if the puck is shot from outside the defensive zone, even if it deflects off a defensive player. The play will be ruled dead and the face-off will occur from the spot where the puck was shot. If a player shoots the puck into his own net from anywhere on the ice, a goal will be awarded to the other team.
- f) awarded goals (C.A.H.A. Rule Book) will apply.
- g) all minor penalties shall be two (2) minutes stop time.

THREE STAR AWARDS

The Three Star Awards are very popular among the players and each game will have these awards.

The criteria for selection of Three Star Awards are as follows:

1. Players who exhibit good sportsmanship.
2. Players who play well in both the offensive and defensive zones.
3. Players who contribute to the scoring with goals and assists.
4. Goalies should be recognized equally with the other players due to the uniqueness of their position as well as their contributions to points 1, 2, and 3 above.

Sports and media celebrities will select the Three Stars from each game and present the trophies at centre ice at the completion of the game.

TOP SCORER

The tournament top scorer award will be given to the player who accumulates the most points at the end of Round Robin play. If there is a tie for the most points, the player with the most goals will win. If still tied, then the winner will be the one with the least penalty minutes. In the event that we are still tied, this award will be decided by a coin toss by the Tournament Director.

MOST VALUABLE PLAYER AWARD

The most valuable player for the tournament will be selected by the tournament committee based on the player's ability, scoring, sportsmanship and his value to his team during the Round Robin play only. In the event that this player is also the top scorer for the tournament, the tournament committee shall declare their second choice as the Tournament M.V.P.



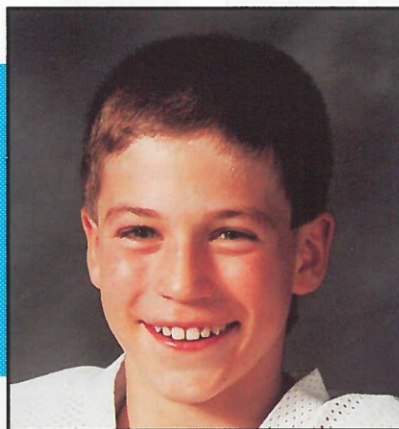

REFEREE'S SIGNALS

CHECKING FROM BEHIND

A forward motion of both arms, with the palms of the hands open and facing away from the body, fully extended from the chest at shoulder level.



TRIPPING

Striking leg with either hand below the knee with both skates on the ice.



WASHOUT

A sweeping sideways motion of both arms across the front of the body at shoulder level with palms down. This signal is used:
a. by the Referee to signal "no goal".
b. by the linesman to signal "no icing" and in certain situations "no offside".



DELAYED CALLING OF PENALTY

Extending arm fully above the head (hand without the whistle).

HIGH STICKING

Holding both fists clenched, one immediately above the other at the height of the forehead.



HOOKING

A tugging motion with both arms as if pulling something from in front toward the stomach.



HOLDING

Clasping either wrist with the other hand in front of the chest.



INTERFERENCE

Crossed arms stationary in front of the chest

PENALTY SHOT

Arms crossed above the head. Give the signal upon stoppage of play.



ELBOWING

Tapping either elbow with the opposite hand.



RED LINE OFF-SIDE PASS

The back Linesman or Referee who is positioned at or near the blue line will signal the pass originated inside the blue line with the following signal: With his arm extended at shoulder level, he will point toward the centre red line.

SLASHING

A chopping motion with the edge of one hand across the opposite forearm.



ICING THE PUCK

The back Linesman or Referee in the play signals a possible icing by fully extending either arm over his head. His arm should remain extended over his head until the front Linesman or Referee either indicates the icing is completed or washes out the icing. The front Linesman or Referee shall indicate the icing is completed by extending either arm over his head. The back Linesman or Referee will then blow his whistle and skate to the face-off spot, crosses the spot to indicate the icing infraction

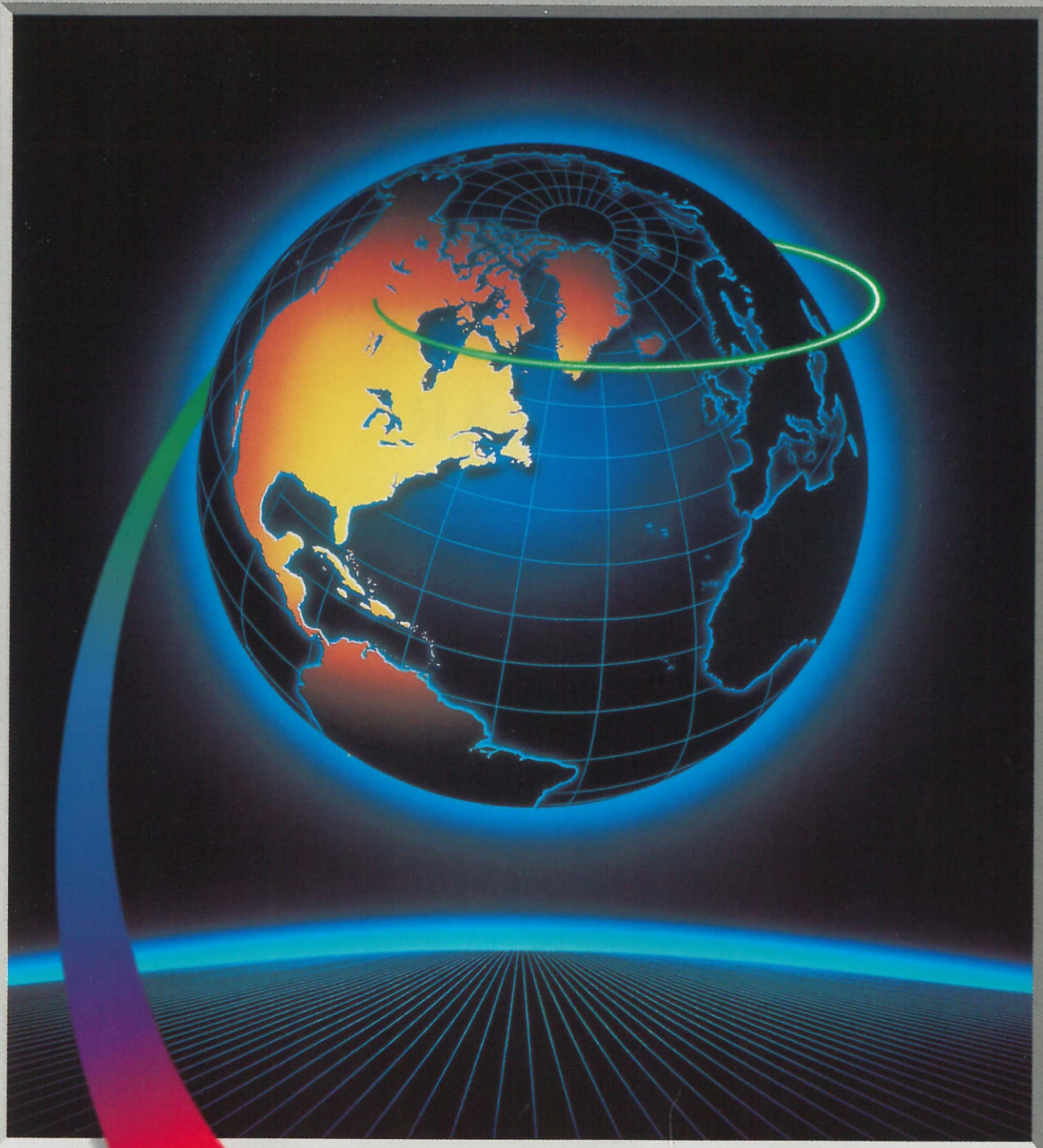
