



RICHMOND HILL STARS

The Richmond Hill Stars are a team and organization that is committed to excellence both on and off the ice. Off the ice, education and being good will ambassadors of the organization are emphasized with the view to develop solid citizens. On the ice, the main objective is to create the proper environment for each and every individual to excel at their own pace, one in which they can develop their skills, strive for perfection and enjoy themselves while doing so. Over the past 2 years, this Stars' team has maintained a winning percentage of in excess of 800 while playing in excess of 150 games. They have been the winner of a number of very competitive tournaments including the Wonderland Tournament (Toronto), the Tim Hortons Tournament (Kitchener), the Vic Teal Tournament (St. Catherines) to name a few. Over and above those accomplishments, two years ago, they placed third in the all Ontario Championships and last year, second, losing 2-1 in the championship game. TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- 1. The Tournament will be comprised of Super Novice players only, born on or after January 1, 1988.
- 2. Round Robin format will consist of twelve teams in two Divisions.
- 3. All games will utilize registered minor hockey league game officials.
- 4. Round Robin games will consist of three (3) twelve minute stop periods. In the event of a tie, NO overtime period will be played.
- 5. All Semi-Final games will be the same format as the Round Robin games except that in the case of a tie, overtime will be played (see tie breaking procedures).
- 6. The Final game will consist of three (3) fifteen minute stop time periods plus overtime will be played in the event of a tie. (See tie breaking procedures).
- 7. Two (2) points will be awarded for a win, one (1) point will be awarded for a tie and zero (0) points will be awarded for a loss.

AWARDS

- 1. Each game will feature 1st, 2nd and 3rd star trophies.
- 2. Each member of the Semi-Finalist teams in a losing effort will receive a semi-finalist trophy.
- 3. Each member of the finalist team in a losing effort will receive a finalist trophy.
- 4. Each member of the Tournament winning team will receive a replica of the Brick Cup, plus a Sony Walkman.
- 5. The Tournament top scorer will receive a Wayne Gretzky trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
- 6. The Tournament M.V.P. will receive a Wayne Gretzky trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
- 7. At the completion of the tournament, First and Second All Star Teams will be selected and each member will receive a trophy.

TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. Playing rules will be those used during the regular season in Edmonton in accordance with the C.A.H.A. and E.M.H.A.
- 2. Any team unable to commence play within ten (10) minutes after scheduled starting time will forfeit that game and the opposing team will be awarded a 5 0 score.
- 3. Any protests must be made known prior to five (5) minutes after the game in question. A written account must be submitted to the Tournament Director no later than one (1) hour after the game on the forms provided. "THE DECISION OF THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE IS FINAL!"
- 4. Any player who receives a match penalty (i.e. intent to injure) will be suspended for the duration of the game and further action will be determined pending a review by the committee immediately following that particular game.
- 5. Any team official who receives a misconduct will be suspended for the duration of the game and his team will be assessed a two (2) minute penalty to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
- 6. Any player or team official who receives a second major penalty, or second misconduct penalty, or a match game misconduct, or a gross misconduct penalty, shall be suspended from further play in the tournament.
- 7. Any of the Rule No. 6 penalties will also carry a five (5) minute bench penalty to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
- 8. Any major penalties & the results of these penalties are subject to review by the Committee immediately following that particular game.
- 9. NON-CONTACT! BODY CONTACT FOULS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

The criteria for selection of Three Star Awards are as follows:

- 1. Players who exhibit good sportsmanship.
- 2. Players who play well in both the offensive and defensive zones.
- 3. Players who contribute to the scoring with goals and assists.
- 4. Goalies should be recognized equally with the other players due to the uniqueness of their position as well as their contributions to points 1, 2, and 3 above.

TOP SCORER


MOST VALUABLE PLAYER AWARD

TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES

A. TIE-BREAKING - ROUND ROBIN PLAY

In the event of a tie after completion of Round Robin play, the team(s) that will be declared the Division Winner(s) and advance to the playoffs shall be determined as follows:

- a) most points in Round Robin play.
- b) in case of a tie, the team having won the game between each other will advance.
- c) if still tied, the team with the best +/- (goals for goals against).
- d) if still tied, the team with the fewest goals against will advance.
- e) if still tied, the team with the most goals will advance.
- f) if still tied, the team with the fewest minutes in penalties will advance.
- g) if still tied, then a single flip of a coin by the Tournament Director will determine the team to advance.

Note: in any of the above possibilities, if the tie is a 3, 4, or 5 way tie then once one team has been selected, all other teams will then go through the same tests once more to determine the second team to advance.

B. TIE-BREAKING - PLAY-OFF ROUNDS (SEMI-FINAL & FINAL)

In the event of a tie after the end of regulation play, the teams will change ends and play one ten-minute sudden death overtime period. Play will end as soon as one of the teams scores and barring dispute, the team will be declared the winner.

In the event of a tie after the end of the sudden-death overtime period, one player, not the goal keeper, will be removed from each team and each team will play with five players for two minutes sudden death overtime.

In the event of a tie after the two minute period, an additional player will be removed from each team and each team will play with four players for a two minute sudden death overtime period.

In the event of a tie after this two minute sudden death overtime period, an additional player will be removed from each team and each team will play with three players for a two minute sudden-death overtime period.

In the event of a tie after the end of this two minute sudden-death overtime period, each team will select five shooters and each player will take one shot alternating from team to team. Upon completion of the five player shoot-off, the team with the most goals wins.

If still tied, the procedure will be repeated with five different players and so on until a winner is declared. No player will come around a second time for a penalty shot until the complete team roster has been used.



REFEREE'S SIGNALS



DELAYED CALLING OF PENALTY

Extending arm fully above the head (hand without the whistle).



INTERFERENCE

Crossed arms stationary in front of the chest



A sweeping sideways motion of both arms across the front of the body at shoulder level with palms down. This signal is used: a. by the Referee to signal "no goal". b. by the linesman to signal "no icing" and in certain situations "no offside".



Holding both fists clenched, one immediately above the other at the height of the forehead.



RIPPING

with either hand below the knee with both skates on the ice.



Striking leg



CHECKING FROM BEHIND

A forward motion of both arms, with the palms of the hands open and facing away from the body, fully extended from the chest at shoulder level.



RED LINE OFF-SIDE PASS

The back Linesman or Referee who is positioned at or near the blue line will signal the pass originated inside the blue line with the following signal: With his arm extended at shoulder level, he will point toward the centre red line.



Clasping either

wrist with the

other hand in front of the chest.

ELBOWING

Tapping either elbow with the opposite hand.



SLASHING

A chopping motion with the edge of one hand across the opposite forearm.



HOOKING

A tugging motion with both arms as if pulling something from in front toward the stomach.




SHOT

Arms crossed above the head. Give the signal upon stoppage of play.



ICING THE PUCK

The back Linesman or Referee in the play signals a possible icing by fully extending either arm over his head. His arm should remain extended over his head until the front Linesman or Referee either indicates the icing is completed or washes out the icing. The front Linesman or Referee shall indicate the icing is completed by extending either arm over his head. The back Linesman or Referee will then blow his whistle and skate to the face-off spot, crosses the spot to indicate the icing infraction.
