## TORONTO BULLDOGS CHAMPIONS



## TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- 1** The Tournament will be comprised of Super Novice players only, born on or after January 1, 2002.
- 2** Round Robin format will consist of fourteen teams in two Divisions.
- 3** All games will utilize registered minor hockey league game officials.
- 4** Round Robin games will consist of two (2) twelve minute and one (1) fifteen minute stop-time periods.  
In the event of a tie, NO overtime period will be played.
- 5** Two (2) points will be awarded for a win, one (1) point will be awarded for a tie and zero (0) points will be awarded for a loss.
- 6** All Semi-Final games will be the same format as the Round Robin games except that in the case of a tie, overtime will be played. (See tie breaking procedures.)
- 7** The Final game will consist of three (3) fifteen minute stop time periods. Overtime will be played in the event of a tie. (See tie-breaking procedures.)  
For the final game the home team will be determined by a coin toss at the Beach Party.

## AWARDS

- 1** Each game will feature 1st, 2nd and 3rd star trophies.
- 2** Each member of the Final #1 and Final #2 teams in a losing effort will receive a semi-finalist trophy.
- 3** Each member of the championship game in a losing effort will receive a finalist trophy.
- 4** Each member of the Tournament winning team will receive a replica of the Brick Cup, plus a iPod/iPhone Speaker Dock Clock Radio.
- 5** The Tournament top scorer will receive an autographed trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
- 6** The Tournament M.V.P. will receive an autographed trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
- 7** At the completion of the tournament, First and Second All-Star Teams will be selected and each member will receive a trophy.



## TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

### A TIE-BREAKING - ROUND ROBIN PLAY

- In the event of a tie after completion of Round Robin play, the three teams within each division, that will be declared Division Finalist and advance to the playoffs, shall be determined as follows:
  - a) Most points in Round Robin play;
  - b) In case of a tie between two teams, the team having won the game between each other will advance;
  - c) If still tied, the team with the best +/- (goals for – goals against) during Full Round Robin play will advance;
  - d) If still tied, the team with the fewest goals against during Full Round Robin play will advance;
  - e) If still tied, the team with the most goals during Full Round Robin play will advance;
  - f) If still tied, the team with the fewest penalty minutes during Full Round Robin play will advance;
  - g) If still tied, then a single flip of a coin by the Tournament Director will determine the team to advance.

*NOTE: In the event of a 3, 4 or 5 way tie in step 'a' above, head-to-head points among the tied teams shall determine the top team to advance. If no team advances, apply steps 'c' through 'g' until one team advances. Continue this head-to-head points process with any remaining teams until all finalists are selected.*

### B TIE-BREAKING - PLAY-OFF ROUND (SEMI-FINAL & FINAL)

- In the event of a tie after the end of regulation play, one ten-minute sudden-victory overtime period will be played. Play will end as soon as one of the teams scores and barring dispute, the team will be declared the winner.
- In the event of a tie after the end of the sudden-victory overtime period, one player, not the goal keeper, will be removed from each team and each team will play with five players for two minutes sudden-victory overtime.
- In the event of a tie after the two minute period, an additional player will be removed from each team and each team will play with four players for a two minute sudden-victory overtime period.
- In the event of a tie after this two minute sudden-victory overtime period, an additional player will be removed from each team and each team will play with three players for a two minute sudden-victory overtime period.
- In the event of a tie after the end of this two minute sudden-victory overtime period, each team will select five shooters and each player will take one shot alternating from team to team. Upon completion of the five player shoot-off, the team with the most goals wins.
- If still tied, the procedure will be repeated with five different players and so on until a winner is declared. No player shall come around a second time for a penalty shot until the complete team roster excluding goal tenders has been used.

Our team has been carefully selected over the last three months and the roster was finalized in May. Our players and families are looking forward to all the experiences "The Brick" has to offer. ## THREE STAR AWARDS

The Three Star Awards are very popular among the players and each game will have these awards. The criteria for selection of Three Star Awards are as follows:

- 1** Players who play well in both the offensive and defensive zones.
- 2** Players who contribute to the scoring with goals and assists.
- 3** Players who exhibit good sportsmanship.
- 4** Goalies should be recognized equally with the other players due to the uniqueness of their position, as well as their contributions to points 1, 2, and 3 above.

Sports celebrities, media celebrities and tournament sponsors will select the Three Stars from each game and present the trophies at centre ice at the completion of the game.

## TOP SCORER

The tournament top scorer award will be given to the player who accumulates the most points at the end of Round Robin play. ## TOURNAMENT RULES

- 2** Any team unable to commence play within five (5) minutes after scheduled starting time will forfeit that game and the opposing team will be awarded a 5 - 0 score.
- 3** Any protests must be made known prior to five (5) minutes after the game in question. A written account must be submitted to the Tournament Director no later than one (1) hour after the game on the forms provided. "THE DECISION OF THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE IS FINAL!"
- 4** Any player who receives a match penalty (i.e., intent to injure) will be suspended for the duration of the game. Further action will be determined pending a review by the committee immediately following that particular game.
- 5** Any team official who receives a misconduct will be suspended for the duration of the game, and his team will be assessed a two (2) minute penalty to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
- 6** Any player or team official who receives a second major penalty, or second misconduct penalty, or a match game misconduct, or a gross misconduct penalty, shall be suspended from further play in the tournament.
- 7** Any of the Rule No. 6 penalties will also carry a five (5) minute bench major penalty to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
- 8** All major penalties are subject to review by the tournament committee immediately following that particular game.
- 9** NON CONTACT! BODY CONTACT FOULS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
- 10** Neck Protection must be worn by ALL PLAYERS.

## CROSS CHECKING

A forward motion with both fists clenched extending from the chest.



## WASHOUT

Both arms sweeping from chest straight out to the sides with palms down.

## SPEARING

A jabbing motion with both hands thrust out directly in front of the body.



## HIGH STICKING

Holding both fists, one above the other, to the side of the head.

## ROUGHING

Fist clenched and arm extended out of the side of the body.



## HAND PASS

Open part of hand displayed in pushing motion.

## MISCONDUCT

Both hands on hips at the same time.



## CHARGING

Rotating clenched fists around one another in front of the chest.

## TRIPPING

Striking leg with either hand below the knee with both skates on the ice.



## SLASHING

A chopping motion with the edge of one hand across the opposite forearm.

## KNEEING

With both skates on the ice striking right leg with the right hand below the knee.



## GOAL SCORED

A single point, with the non-whistle hand, directly at the goal where the puck legally entered, while blowing the whistle.

## INTERFERENCE

Crossed arms stationary in front of the chest.



## PENALTY SHOT

Arms crossed above the head. Give the signal upon stoppage of play.

## CHECKING FROM BEHIND

Arm placed behind the back, elbow bent, forearm parallel to the ice surface.



## DELAYED PENALTY

Extending arm fully above the head (hand without the whistle).

## HOOING

A tugging motion with both arms as if pulling something from in front toward the stomach.



## ELBOWING

Tapping either elbow with the opposite hand.

## HOLDING

Clasping either wrist with the other hand in front of the chest.
