TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1 Playing rules will be those used during the regular season in Edmonton in accordance with the C.A.H.A. and E.M.H.A.
- 2 Any team unable to commence play within five (5) minutes after scheduled starting time will forfeit that game and the opposing team will be awarded a 5 - 0 score.
- 3 Any protests must be made known prior to five (5) minutes after the game in question. A written account must be submitted to the Tournament Director no later than one (1) hour after the game on the forms provided.
"THE DECISION OF THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE IS FINAL!"
- 4 Any player who receives a match penalty (i.e., intent to injure) will be suspended for the duration of the game. Further action will be determined pending a review by the Tournament Committee immediately following that particular game.
- 5 Any team official who receives a misconduct will be suspended for the duration of the game, and his team will be assessed a two (2) minute penalty to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
- 6 Any player or team official who receives a second major penalty, or second misconduct penalty, or a match game misconduct, or a gross misconduct penalty, shall be suspended from further play in the tournament.
- 7 Any of the Rule No. 6 penalties will also carry a five (5) minute bench major penalty to be served by a player on the ice at the time.
- 8 All major penalties are subject to review by the Tournament Committee immediately following that particular game.
- 9 NON-CONTACT! BODY CONTACT FOULS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
- 10 Neck Protection must be worn by ALL PLAYERS.
- 11 Home team will wear their lighter jersey, if there is an issue with jersey colours the visiting team must change.
- 12 The Tournament will be comprised of players born on or after January 1, 2006.
- 13 All games will utilize registered hockey league game officials.

ROUND ROBIN FORMAT

- 1 Round Robin format will consist of fourteen teams in two conferences.
- 2 Round Robin games will consist of two (2) twelve minute and one (1) fifteen minute stop-time periods. In the event of a tie the teams will play two-2 (2) minute sudden victory overtime periods. The first period will be 3 on 3, the second period will be 2 on 2, if still tied, there will be a 3 player shootout, which will continue with additional shooters, until a winner is declared.
- 3 Three (3) points will be awarded for a regulation time win, two (2) points will be awarded for an overtime win, one (1) point will be awarded for an overtime loss, and zero (0) points will be awarded for a regulation time loss.



ROUND ROBIN TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE

In the event of a tie after completion of Round Robin play, the three teams within each division, that will be declared Division Finalist and advance to the playoffs, shall be determined as follows:

- a) Most points in Round Robin play;
- b) In case of a tie between two teams, the team having won the game between each other will advance;
- c) If still tied, the team with the best +/- (goals for – goals against) during Full Round Robin play will advance;
- d) If still tied, the team with the fewest goals against during Full Round Robin play will advance;
- e) If still tied, the team with the most goals during Full Round Robin play will advance;
- f) If still tied, the team with the fewest penalty minutes during Full Round Robin play will advance;
- g) If still tied, then a single flip of a coin by the Tournament Director will determine the team to advance.

NOTE: In the event of a 3, 4 or 5 way tie in step 'a' above, head-to-head points among the tied teams shall determine the top team to advance. If no team advances, apply steps 'c' through 'g' until one team advances. Continue this head-to-head points process with any remaining teams until all finalists are selected.

PLAYOFF FORMAT

- 1 All Semi-Final games will be the same format as the Round Robin games except that in the case of a tie.
- 2 The Final game will consist of three (3) fifteen minute stop time periods. Overtime will be played in the event of a tie. For the final game the home team will be determined by a coin toss by the Tournament Director.
- 3 In the event of a tie after the end of regulation play, one ten-minute sudden-victory overtime period will be played. Play will end as soon as one of the teams scores and barring dispute, the team will be declared the winner.
- 4 In the event of a tie after the end of the sudden-victory overtime period, one player, not the goal keeper, will be removed from each team and each team will play with five players for two minutes sudden-victory overtime.
- 5 In the event of a tie after the two minute period, an additional player will be removed from each team and each team will play with four players for a two minute sudden-victory overtime period.
- 6 In the event of a tie after this two minute sudden-victory overtime period, an additional player will be removed from each team and each team will play with three players for a two minute sudden-victory overtime period.
- 7 In the event of a tie after the end of this two minute sudden-victory overtime period, each team will select five shooters and each player will take one shot alternating from team to team. Upon completion of the five player shoot-off, the team with the most goals wins.
- 8 If still tied, the procedure will be repeated with five different players and so on until a winner is declared. No player shall come around a second time for a penalty shot until the complete team roster excluding goal tenders has been used.





AWARDS

- 1 Each game will feature 1st, 2nd and 3rd star trophies.
- 2 Each member of the **Final #1** and **Final #2** teams in a losing effort will receive a semi-finalist trophy.
- 3 Each member of the **Championship Game** in a losing effort will receive a finalist trophy.
- 4 Each member of the **Tournament Winning Team** will receive a replica of the Brick Cup, plus a gift from Monster Canada.
- 5 The Tournament **Top Scorer** will receive an autographed trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
- 6 The Tournament **MVP** will receive an autographed trophy hockey stick and a pair of skates.
- 7 At the completion of the tournament, **First and Second All-Star Teams** will be selected and each member will receive a trophy.
- 8 The playoff **MVP** will receive the Bill Comrie Award.



THREE STAR AWARDS

- 1 Players who play well in both the offensive and defensive zones.
- 2 Players who contribute to the scoring with goals and assists.
- 3 Players who exhibit good sportsmanship.
- 4 Goalies should be recognized equally with the other players due to the uniqueness of their position, as well as their contributions to points 1, 2, and 3 above. Sports celebrities, media celebrities and tournament sponsors will select the **Three Stars** from each game and present the trophies at center ice at the completion of the game.



TOP SCORER

The Tournament **Top Scorer** award will be given to the player who accumulates the most points at the end of Round Robin play. If there is a tie for the most points, the player with the most goals will win.

If still tied, then the winner will be the one with the least penalty minutes. In the event that we are still tied, this award will be decided by a coin toss by the Tournament Director.

MOST VALUABLE PLAYER AWARD

The **Most Valuable Player** for the Tournament will be selected by the Tournament Committee based on the player's ability, scoring, sportsmanship and value to his team during the Round Robin play only.

The top scorer is not eligible for the tournament **MVP**.



PLAYOFF MVP - BILL COMRIE AWARD

The **Most Valuable Player** for the Tournament playoffs selected by the Tournament Committee based on the players ability, sportsmanship and value to his team during the playoff rounds only.
