- Net Income \$63,648.40 with April monthly bills, beef raffle expenses outstanding
- We Collected \$16,363.09 of Gaming Funds this was put into the Casino Account. Gaming proceeds from every AGLC License totaling \$8,328.73 = \$24,691.82
- Tournaments did VERY well & with the added U18 Tournament Total income \$52,133.08 this includes the U18 provincials from last year deposited in this year budget of \$4,728.72 (\$47,404.36 for this season)




- ★ 76 total LMHA in CAHL


