Coaching Development Accomplishments

Burlington

- **Coaching Orientation Meeting-** review of coaching expectations, start up checklist, RAB policies, RO process, etc.
- **Coaches Corner-** Collaboration shared drive and google classroom
- **Mid Season Coaching Feedback** Development of a midseason Coaches Feedback form "STOP/START/CONTINUE" to capture constructive feedback.
- **Mid Season Coaches Meeting** Collaboration and reflective practice; review of feedback; and building community
- Coaching Interview Process A committee was formed and interview
 process was updated.

Coaching Development - Looking ahead

- Coaching Development Opportunities On/Off Ice Coaching Development with PEAK; and RAB Coaching clinic (Coaches helping coaches)
- 2. **Coaching Mentorship program** Provide all new RAB coaches with an experienced coach mentor.

- 3. Coach Collaboration & Community- ongoing reflective practices where coaches support/help each other; and build capacity
- 4. **Coaching Interviews 2023-2024** All head coaching applicants will be invited to an interview with our Committee for 2023-2024 Coaching



Development Ice

- Sunday ice (11am-1pm) was difficult to use for development opportunities
- Sunday evening ice returns for 2023-2024 which should allow us to development programs

Continued focus on Goalies:

- 5 goalies who played 50% of the time and player 50%
- 6 goalies who played 100% (2 regionals goalies played for free as part of our new approved goalie policy in 2022)
- RAB goalies attended 33 free training sessions at O'Hagan goaltending

Shooting clinics

- Ryan Costigan (Director of Coaching) and some RAB U16AA and U19A players ran 10 shooting clinics for our U10-U14 teams
- Clinics were very well attended, and players who attended saw improvement in their shots over the course of the season

Looking Forward

• Continued focus on dedicated goalie training and shooting clinics

- More development opportunities during Sunday night time slot
- Piloting a new AI based camera to record RAB home games



- Recruited 4 new referees for this past season
 - 3 new referees recruited for 2023-2024 season so far
- All referees will be required to take a refresher course this year as it is a rule change year
 - Any rule changes will be announced in the fall
- Will look to hold a rules clinic for coaches at the start of next season



Team Rep Liaison

- 2023 tryouts and team formations went very well (U14AA, U16AA, U19AA), U12A in September; Special thanks to all our great coaches and volunteers!
- More than 100 players attend our tryouts in April '23!! A lot of out-of-town players attended the sessions.
- Our new tryout pinnies were a great success, improving the check-in process
- Our association will host 4 provincial teams 2023-24
 0 U12A (tbd), U14AA, U16AA & U19AA
- Overall player retention was good. A number of out-of-town players willing to play in Burlington
- This year we are projecting to have 2 teams at every level which I believe will be a first in RAB history
