Registrar Report - Registrations

- 201 player registrations in total for the 2024-25 Season (+ 25)
- FUNdamental programs (FUN 1, 2, 3) accounted for 86 players (+ 31)
 - 64 FUN1 / FUN2 (Bunnies) (+ 21)
 - 22 FUN 3 (U10) 2 Teams (+10)
 - These divisions set the tone for the long term stability of our association and are incredibly important for parent volunteer development and player engagement in the sport.

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Blast Tournament recap

The 2025 Blast tournament was a great success. Some stats:

- **69** teams attended
- 138 volunteers donated 456 hours of their time!
- 14,988 50/50 tickets sold

The tournament raised a record breaking **\$22,870!**

Funds from the tournament are reinvested in RAB. This includes:

- Limit registration fee increase for this upcoming season
- Replacements for our equipment lending program
- Registration subsidies for goalies
- Player and goalie development (Development ice time, paid goalie instructors, CanSkate instructors for FUN program)
- Pixellot Al camera
- Executive member registration discounts

2025-2026 Season Updates

- A second pixellot camera will be made available to teams to reduce conflicts when multiple teams want to use it.
 - Exploring a "pay per use" model to ensure teams that use the camera more often contribute to the budget for the camera
- The City of Burlington is opening Skyway Arena in October
 - \circ $\hfill \ensuremath{\mathsf{RAB}}$ expects to have some ice time at Skyway for next season

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Season Recap and Accomplishments



Coaching Development Accomplishments

- **Coaching Orientation Meeting-** review of coaching expectations, start up checklist, RAB policies, RO process, etc.
- **Coaches Corner-** Continue to build a collaborative shared drive and google classroom for coaches to access anytime
- End of Season Coaching Feedback- A questionnaire to capture constructive feedback from our coaches
- **Parent Feedback form** To ensure parents felt heard and or able to express how we are doing and where we can improve.
- Weekly Development Ice Hosted a weekly ice session to work on various ringette skills, also hosted goalie training sessions and the occasional shooting clinic
- **Successful Season** Numerous teams went to tournament finals and won, and a huge accomplishment that our U19AA went to Nationals



Coaching Development Opportunities - Summer coaching clinics and PD point requirements; and RAB Coaching clinic/meeting (Coaches helping coaches as likely a monthly online meeting)

Coaches Jackets - The RAB exec has approved the purchase of a jacket for all new coaches, and on an as needed basis for all existing coaches. This is to ensure all team staff have a certain "look" and a little thank you for coaching. During our purchasing window in the fall we will make a group order

Coach Collaboration - ongoing reflective practices where coaches support/help each other, with the possibility of having more shared ice to support coaches and players alike with learning opportunities while on ice together



Player Development

Development Ice

- Thursday evening ice (5 or 6 pm) in Aldershot was difficult to get regular attendance but we regularly had about 8 skaters, who were very enthusiastic and had great improvements
- Sunday evening ice had varied use, some goalie coaching, shooting clinics and power skating. Some ice was used for rescheduled games or bought by teams for extra ice
- 6 Goalie sessions were run throughout the season, with varying results, we hope to better improve support and development for goalies this upcoming season





Player Development

Goalie Development:

- This season RAB had 7 full-time goalies and 2 part-time goalies
- 2 regional goalies played for free as part of our new approved goalie policy in 2022.
- 7 A/AA/B goalies were able to utilize our discount code
- RAB used the services of Cam Schnarr & Elyssa Perron (Waterloo NRL goalies) through their Breakout Goalie Coaching business. They came for weekly on ice coaching from U12 regional goalies up to U19AA.
 - RAB paid for regional goalies & some A/AA sessions
 - Provincial coaching was covered by individual team fees



Player Development

Al Camera

• The Pixelot camera was available to all teams to be used on a request basis, it was utilized by some teams more than others, we hope to increase usage in the coming season

Looking Forward

- Continued to focus on expanded and dedicated goalie training (Powerplay & Breakout) as well as shooting clinics
- Increased development opportunities during additional ice at a more central time and location (Ideally not 5 pm in Aldershot)
- Hope to have older skilled players gain volunteer hours by attending development or team practices to work with players in small groups to increase particular skills



Referee in Chief

- Recruited 9 new referees for this past season.
- One existing referee obtained a level 2 certification
- GLRL took over scheduling referees for Provincial games which made it easier to ensure proper qualifications.
- We had new referees team up with more experienced officials and provided feedback.
- Going forward provide opportunities for officials to gain certifications
- Have Burlington host a referee clinic in the fall





- 2025 provincial tryouts went smoothly throughout April and early May; Special thanks to all coaches and other volunteers (evaluators, check-in desk, pinnie handout, on-ice management, Team Genius management - used for check-in, player evaluation, and player/family email communication)
- 25 hours of Provincial tryout ice time was used in the last 7 weeks including 7 warm-up and 18 tryout sessions
- More than 170 players attended our tryouts including a significant number of out-of-town players
 - About 40% of tryout registrants were RAB-based players out-of-town (including players current to RAB) registrations were driven mainly by the U16AA and U19AA groups





- Provincial teams declared:
 - U14AA 12 skaters + 2 goalies
 - U16AA 13 skaters + 2 goalies
 - U19AA 13 skaters + 2 goalies
 - U16A in progress
 - U19A in progress

FUN 1/2 Program

RAB had another great FUN1 / FUN2 year with 64 skaters enrolled!

Highlights!

- Expanded program capacity to welcome 41 FUN1 skaters and 23 FUN2 skaters
- Two FUN2 teams participated in weekly inter-league games as part of the new Lower Ontario Ringette League (LORL) structure
- Acquired additional ice to allow for separate FUN1 & FUN2 practices vs holding sessions concurrently
- Hosted two other FUN teams at our Burlington Blast Tournament
- Continued Orange Hoodie program to purchase branded RAB sweaters for all new players to RAB
- Year end party with each player receiving a custom designed medal

designed to build skills and challenge skaters!
