Presidents Report

As many in the ringette world found out quickly this was my first year as president of BVRA and what a ride it was. “I’m new” became my trademark and go to staple that meant I have no idea what’s going on. To say it’s been year full of learning, challenges, and growth would be an understatement. I’ve learned so much from our incredible coaches, athletes, and volunteers, and I’m so grateful for each of you who has been a part of what made this year a success for BVRA.

Now, as we reflect on this past season, I want to emphasize that our work and values are always grounded in our **core mission statement**: to nurture the love of ringette among BVRA athletes by providing opportunities for players of all ages and skill levels to learn, grow, and excel in a supportive environment. We are committed to promoting the values of teamwork, sportsmanship, and personal development, while also offering pathways for those with aspirations of competing at the highest levels. Our goal is to foster a vibrant ringette community within BVRA by cultivating a balance between grassroots community participation and elite-level competition.

Over the past few years, BVRA has experienced incredible growth—proof that our love for ringette is stronger than ever.

- **Registration numbers are up**
 - **51% from 2021 and 46% from 2022**, and we’re now proudly supporting **246 athletes**, including **49 amalgamated players** who we were thrilled to welcome into our BVRA family.
- **Pre-Season Camp welcomed**
 - **140 athletes**, while **325 participated in our Fall 3x3**, **74 in our Winter Development Camp**, and **431 athletes** for **Spring 3x3**. Which thank you Deanne for pausing when we said, let’s do the Gala on the 17th of April, smack in the middle of spring 3x3
- **Jersey Orders & Clothing:**
 - We welcomed a significant number of new players into our BVRA family, resulting in a total of 61 new or replacement player jerseys.
 - This year BVRA clothing moved online, partnering with Zueike. A total of 3 clothing orders were offered throughout the year resulting in 181 orders totalling \$2174.73 for fundraising. Zueike will be back in 2025!
- **Preseason Tournament:**
 - The Preseason Tournament saw participation from 47 local teams and 8 out-of-town teams, totaling 109 games played over the week of Oct 14th – 20th, 2024.
 - We successfully raised \$10,000 for BVRA programming, thanks to the generous contributions from corporate donors.
 - A heartfelt thank you to our tournament committee members for their dedication and hard work.
 - Mark your calendars for next year's tournament, scheduled for Oct 20th to the 26th, 2025.

- **BVRA Banquet:**
 - The third annual BVRA banquet was our largest to date, accommodating 16 teams and their guests, totaling 452 attendees.
 - Congratulations to the athletes who received player awards in four categories, recognizing their outstanding contributions to the sport.
 - A special thank you to our dedicated banquet volunteers for their invaluable support.
- **BVRA Post-Secondary Scholarship:**
 - Congratulations to our deserving recipients of the 2025 BVRA Post-Secondary Scholarships, each awarded \$500.
 - Audree Lafond
 - Atiya Roopra
 - Sarah Beatty
 - Alexina Wilson
 - These athletes exemplify the values and characteristics instilled by the game of ringette, preparing them for future success.

2024-2025 BVRA Registrar's Report

Registration opened from June 26th till August 16th, 2024, with A Tryout registration closed by August 1st. BVRA registered 246 players at the R4U-U19 levels and had 48 players amalgamate with us for a total of 294 players. The most notable registration increase was at the Open level. There was a decrease again at the U14 level, but that is due to registrants that made AA. We helped to keep the R4U & U10 numbers by providing half-off of registration for first-time ringette players. 48 players registered at the AA level. BVRA hosted five Open teams this season, registering 81 players, which grew by one team from the previous year.

BVRA Angels 2024/2025 Annual General Meeting Report

During the **2024–2025** season, the BVRA Angels hosted AA teams at the U14, U16, and U19 levels. The teams were composed of athletes from BVRA, TRA, SWRA, MacDonald, and NWRA, showcasing strong collaboration across associations.

The season began with the annual retreat at Camp Manitou, offering athletes and coaches a valuable opportunity to build team culture and prepare for the year ahead. Throughout the season, all three teams demonstrated commitment, development, and perseverance. The U16AA and U19AA Angels both went on to win Provincial Championships. Following those victories, **9 players from U16AA** and **8 from U19AA** were selected to represent Manitoba at the **National Ringette Championship**. A special highlight at Nationals was our **U16AA goaltender** being awarded the **Top Goalie Award** during the skills competition.

In connection with tryouts, we once again offered a **pre-tryout camp** to potential AA athletes, helping prepare them for evaluations. This camp continues to be a well-received and valuable opportunity for skill development and confidence-building ahead of the formal tryout process.

Tryouts for the **2025–2026** season were recently completed. For the upcoming season, the BVRA Angels will host teams at the **U14AA** and **U16AA** levels. At **U19AA**, a single **provincial team** will represent Manitoba and will run as a **provincially managed team**, rather than being hosted by a local association.

Financial activity for the 2024–2025 season reflected total income and expenditures of approximately **\$32,500**, with key investments made in areas such as athlete development, retreat and league ice, coaching certifications, and support for athletes attending national events.

Thank you to all athletes, coaches, families, and volunteers who contributed to another strong year for the BVRA Angels program.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT REPORT- BVRA 2024-2025 SEASON

The 2024-2025 season was a great success. Season opened with the BVRA Pre-Season player and goalie camps in August. Camp ran from August 19-29, 2024. We had three age/loop divisions: R4U Advanced/U10, U12, U14 & U16/19. All their divisions were full, including goalie camp. The player camp was run by Competitive Edge and the goalie camp was run by Caroline Girardin and her team.

BVRA Pre-season 3 X 3 program was held in the month of September. 78 games were scheduled. Total of 31 teams were formed. 6-U10, 10-U12, 6-U14, 9-U16/19. With a total of 289 registrants plus 31 goalies. Rinks used were Dakota, Notre Dame, Sam Southern, Southdale, Glenwood and East End arenas.

Centralized Tryouts were held from September 3-12 at Dakota, Glenwood and Sam Southern arenas. BVRA held team formation at the U10 level (4 teams) & U12 B (2 teams) assessments from September 14-21 at Dakota, Southdale & Glenwood arenas.

BVRA held a player power skating camp & goalie camp. This camp was held on Sundays at Bertrand arena from – Nov 3-Feb 9th. Total of 12 1-hour sessions per group. Age groups held were R4U Advanced to U12 and U12 Advanced to U16. Groups were divided by skill level. All groups were full. Brooke Enns from Competitive Edge ran this camp. The Goalie camp run by Caroline Girardin and her team were 1 hour sessions and ages ranged from U10-U19.

BVRA Spring 2025 3 X 3 program was a huge success this year. Program was held all of April to early May. 106 games were scheduled. 390 players registered & 41 goalies. Total of 42 teams were formed. 12-U10 (R4U advanced), 13-U12, 8-U14, 9-U16/19. Arenas used were St. Vital, Glenwood and Dakota.

Plans for the 2025-2026 season are underway starting with August Pre-Season camp, Fall 3 x 3 Pre-Season ice, as well as Centralized “A” Tryouts.

Looking forward to an exciting & busy 2025-2026 season. Thank-you to all BVRA Board members, BVRA coaches and volunteers for your time and dedication to this great sport.
