Regular Season Overtime Rules

- Overtime starts with a jump ball immediately after the 4thQuarter ends.
- Each team shoots at the same basket as the second half.
- The first team to score wins. This includes free throws.
- Fouls do not reset.
- There will be no timeouts in overtime.

Playoff Overtime Rules

- Overtime in the playoffs will start immediately with a jump ball at center court
- The first team to score 4 points or the team leading at the end of a 3 minute run time period is the victor, whichever comes first
- The clock will only be stop-time in the last 30 seconds of the 3 minute overtime period. The clock will be stopped during the 3 minute period for team or officials timeouts, and player injuries
- If the game remains tied at the end of 3 minutes, the second overtime period will begin immediately with a jump ball and the winner will be determined by the first team to score a point. This includes any type of point scored including a single foul shot
- Each team will continue to shoot at the same basket as the second half
- Each team will be only allowed a one-minute timeout for the entire overtime period. No timeouts carry over from the 2nd half of regulation
- Players who were fouled out or ejected during regulation time will NOT be allowed to participate in any
 of the overtime periods

There is no overtime in 22 minute or full length seeding rounds (until final divisions are set).
