Step 3: Respect in Sport (RIS) – Mandatory for Parents

One parent or guardian per player must complete the Respect in Sport Parent Program before registration, as required by VIAHA. You only need to complete this once and can be applied to more than one child in your family.

NEW TO HOCKEY?

As a new member of Hockey, there are **two choices for you!** We have direct registration with CRMHA Your fees will have a discount on them! Choose the available "First Time Player" package when you are registering! **OR** you have the option of trying the NHL/NHLPA First Shift Program. (There are limited spots in the First Shift Program)

Please note you can only register for ONE of the options, either First Shift OR CRMHA registration for the start of the season!

OPTION 1) THE NHL/NHLPA FIRST SHIFT (LIMITED SPOTS)

No Equipment? No Experience? No Problem.

The NHL/NHLPA First Shift wants to help you fall in love with hockey. For children between the ages of 6-10 only, the NHL/NHLPA First Shift could be the hockey program for you! Receive 6 on-ice sessions and full Bauer equipment for only \$299.

The First Shift Program Welcome Event is October 26th, and ice times start November 9th to December 14th, 2025, with the option of signing up with CRMHA for the remainder of the season.

OPTION 2) CRMHA REGISTRATION

Our CRMHA Hockey season starts after the September long weekend and ends in the middle of March. Recreation hockey players typically have 2 ice times per week (one during the week and one on the weekend)

CRMHA REGISTRATION FEES

We are encouraging all players to register early! It helps CRMHA with ice planning, coach planning and being organized going into the season.

You may choose to pay in full or in installments. An initial payment must be made at the time of registration and includes the mandatory BC Hockey Fee plus 25% of your total cost of registration.

REP TRYOUTS

Should you want to try out for the North Island Tier 1 Team (U13-U18) or a Tyee Rep Team, or the U11 Dev Tyee team, please select the appropriate registration package for your division – "Rep Tryouts" (ie U15 - Rep Tryouts). Your registration package will include the Rep Try Out fee for both the Zone Team (U13 to U18) and Tyees Tryouts (\$175) or \$150 for U11 Dev tryouts.

Should your player be successful at tryouts, please be aware that there are further association and team fees that will be charged. We recommend families carefully consider the time and financial commitments before entering the Rep tryout process.

Financial Commitment

Rep hockey does come with additional costs, including:

- Travel expenses for games and tournaments
- Extra practice and game ice time
- Non-parent coach payments (when applicable)
- Team apparel and dress clothes to meet CRMHA standards
- Additional association and team fees

If you want to tryout for the North Island Bears Tier 1 Zone Team you must also complete and submit buy JULY 31st a <u>Tryout Application form found here</u>

FEMALE HOCKEY

The CRMHA offers a Female Hurricane Hockey Program to girls aged 5 through 18.

Registration Options:

- 1) Co-ed House League ONLY
 - For those wanting co-ed recreational hockey only.
 - No female team participation.
 - 2–3 ice times/week (including early mornings)
- 2) Female Hurricanes Program ONLY
 - Join the Female Hurricanes only.
 - 1–2 ice times/week.
 - Travel required if placed on a team (e.g., games in Nanaimo, Victoria, etc.).
 - Must commit to ALL games—home and away.
- 3) BOTH Co-ed & Female Programs
 - Play on both a co-ed team and the Female Hurricanes.
 - 3–5 ice times/week.
 - Female games/practices take priority if there's a schedule conflict.
 - A <u>Dual Roster Agreement form</u> is required and submitted to braithwaitehockey@gmail.com.

DO YOU WANT TO BE A COACH, TEAM MANAGER OR SAFETY PERSON?

 - Register separately via the Volunteer Registration link
 - Complete a Criminal Record Check (CRC) (free)
 - Complete Respect in Sport Leader certification (This is not the same as the Parent version and is no longer accepted as a substitute.)
 - Complete any other courses and clinics required for the position you have chosen

Step 5: Player & Team Staff Registration - HCR 3.0 (Spordle)

Registration is done through the HCR 3.0 "Spordle" platform. Make sure you link all family members under your account!

To register, you must have an HCR account.

CLICK HERE TO REGISTER YOUR PLAYER!

Choose: Register an existing participant (Your player will "exist" in the system if you have completed the Parent Respect in Sport for your child)

Then click Start Registration

- 1) Search and Select the participant(s) you wish to register
- 2) Choose which registration package you want

- 3) Answer the CRMHA questionnaire
- 4) REVIEW and accept the waivers REVIEW the P&P manual available on our website, and the various codes of conduct with your player. They must be aware of expectations.
- 5) Register another participant OR Next
- 6) Choose pay in full or pay in installments (if available)
- 7) Agree to payment terms and conditions choose next
- 8) Complete payment and submit!

The initial payment must be made at the time of registration and includes the mandatory BC Hockey Fee plus 25% of your total cost of registration

What happens next?

You will receive an invoice indicating that your registration is completed. You will receive an email from the Rep Coordinator, Female Coordinator or your division manager with your ice schedule.
