1st Vice President Year End Report - AGM 2016

Seven years ago marked the beginning of my involvement with CRMHA. In the capacity of coach, volunteer, and parent, I came to learn about (and see), the amount of tireless commitment, dedication, and community involvement put forth by our members.

Coming into this past season admittedly, I was apprehensive, about my new role as 1st Vice President of the association. This did not last long however. Very quickly I came to recognize the amount of experience and dedication the other members of the executive brought to the table. I also realized how much energy each person was willing to give to make the season run smoothly, and successfully. I would like to thank each of them sincerely, for their support, patience, and willingness to work together toward that common goal. Of course, I would be remiss if I didn't also thank the parents, volunteers, family members, players, coaches, officials, and sponsors. It takes an enormous amount of cooperation to pull together a positive hockey experience for the kids of Campbell River.

As per the Policies and Procedures Manual and as mandated by the President, my focus for the year revolved around the association codes of conduct, and discipline. In this capacity, I chaired the CRMHA discipline committee. Our role was to investigate and respond to formal complaints, hand out any required suspensions or other disciplinary measures (such as community service, rink bans, or mentoring for example), and determine next steps if required. For players, this was usually very simple. There exists a list of clear-cut suspensions for game infractions as set out by VIAHA. Sometimes as a committee, we decided to add to these suspensions, depending on circumstance. Other issues around the rink like disrespectful parents, bullying, or rink vandalism were not as clear-cut and so required investigation and discussion to determine best action.

Both a process to declare complaints, and a disciplinary committee to review them, are essential. Obviously, there must be an avenue to report an infraction or inappropriate behavior, and CRMHA must enforce accountability. There is never room for harassment, bullying, or assault of any kind and this must always be reported. To ensure these reports are heard, we need to have proper and known chains of communication. These of course already exist, and are set out in our Policies and Procedures Manual. At the beginning of each season, we

all need to re-familiarize ourselves with them. This is an example of what makes the internet and our website so powerful. There are links to all pertinent documents for ease of access. For anyone not completely certain, it is up to CRMHA to be available to answer questions, and be supportive. That said, a good portion of the committee's time this year involved investigations of complaints resulting from preventable situations.

There are many examples of preventable situations. Parents yelling at officials, yells that can eventually turn abusive. Complaining about team process before communicating with the team manager, resulting in conflict. Yelling at a coach after watching your child miss a shift, when perhaps it was due to a behavioral issue. These are all examples of things that should not escalate when one uses proper conduct and respectful communication.


We (all stakeholders) need to continue to work hard both on how we communicate with each other, and when. Conducting ourselves in a respectful manner is essential. Far too often, we see how it is possible to get upset and over react. Tempers can flair, opinions form, and over reactions can occur. Not necessarily because something is wrong, but usually because we do not know all the pertinent information before arriving at our reaction. Unfortunately, these reactions can result in the need for discipline.

At the beginning of this past season, CRMHA delivered a presentation to each division entitled "Respect Begins in the Stands". It was a great opportunity to initiate discussion about the season, and answer questions about association process. This type of front loaded communication is important, and is something I am passionate about. I hope to continue with this next season as I firmly believe we need to be up front, open, honest, and respectful.

Next year will be my second term as 1st Vice President, and I look forward to working with executive members to deliver a well-structured, well-communicated, positive experience for the young hockey players of Campbell River. As always, we will continue to strive for improvements.

Let's always remember that hockey is for the children, and meant to be a fun enjoyable experience. It is about their development of life skills, and lifelong friendships. Whether we are a coach, parent, family member, volunteer, official, or executive member...we should always be focused on providing a positive environment for this to happen.

CRMHA Registrar Year End Report 2015-16

The 2015-16 season saw a slight increase in registration numbers for a total of 546 members. Of that 72% registered online choosing to pay by credit card, an increase from 55% who used the online registration system in 2014-15. There were some small issues with the Hockey Canada Registry program this year, which I have been reassured are resolved. I appreciate everyone's patience with the online system as well as with me, as I worked through my first full season in this position.

Some of this year's registration numbers are below:

546 players—354 recreation players, 104 rep players, and 88 female.

153 players tried out for the rep program.

Mini Hockey school registration increased by approximately 13 skaters this season, going from 59 to 72.

PreNovice – 50 players, 11 females, 72% being first time players to CRMHA

Novice – 95 players, 12 females, 21% of registered players were first time players

Atom – 90 players, 14 female, 11 new players, (68% Early Bird registrations)

Peewee – 104 players, 21 female, 6 new players, (72% Early Bird registrations)

Bantam – 83 players, 13 females, 8 new players, (68% Early Bird registrations)

Midget – 121 players, 17 female, 2 new players, (52% Early Bird registrations)

****Juvenile** – 18 applications to play overage hockey in Midget

I look forward to next season, wish everyone an excellent summer. Registration for the 2016-17 Season will start in June and will be posted onto the website when available.

We started the year of hockey with familiar faces returning for the season. At our officiating clinic, we welcomed 17 new officials and 3 officials returning to officiate with CRMHA. We also had the pleasure of welcoming Mike Lytwynec back to the officiating program as our Mentor.

Mike is a very dedicated Mentor and CRMHA officials are better because of Mike and his tireless efforts in encouraging and developing officials. He has attended 107 games this season and has provided feedback to all officials, no matter their level.

CRMHA allowed us to utilize some ice time to work on our officiating techniques a few times during the season. I had incorporated a few of the Rep teams to have a practice game session in order to improve positioning and rule knowledge. I would like to thank the Atom Development teams for their help in making this happen. I would like to keep this program going as I feel that it has the potential to make a big impact to our officials and understanding our roles within the game of hockey.

At the end of January, we decided that making Atom, Peewee and Bantam House a 3 official system would be beneficial to the development and growth of our officials. This proved to be a very wise decision as we saw a lot of growth within the officials in such a short amount of time that we are going to be looking at the budget for the next season to see if this would be reasonable to start at the beginning of the year.

Because Mike came back this year as Mentor Mike, CRMHA thrived in developing our officials this year. He is a very dedicated Mentor and CRMHA officials are better because of Mike and his tireless efforts in encouraging and developing officials. He has attended 107 games this season and has provided feedback to all officials, no matter their level. I know that Mike has some ideas based off this season which we will try to implement into the new season.

CRMHA put 8 names forward to officiate in BC Hockey Provincials this season and we were able to have 4 of our officials represent in the Midget Tier 1 Provincials! I would like to say Congratulations to these officials as it was their hard work and determination that got them there!

Thank you to all of my officials for a great year. We all came out and officiated to the best of our ability and I look forward to making improvements in mentoring and development.

I'd like to report that we were successful in finding ways for both players and coaches to attend skill development sessions. We partnered up with Bryce Cockburn of Next Level Training and Lee Stone of the Campbell River Storm to run power-skating sessions for players on a weekly basis. We also continued our goalie development sessions using: the Storm's goalies, Brent Bengston of Replay Sports and Nolan Kurceba out of Parksville.

But as my title would indicate, my focus was on the coaches of our association. In addition to our regular Hockey Canada mandatory coaching courses, we organized a few events to improve our coach's ability to teach our wonderful game. We started in August with a session by Nolan Kurceba to show our coaches how to properly develop our goalies. This was a great session with a lot of positive feedback. Later in the fall we had Lee Stone of the Campbell River Storm put on a session for our coach's both on and off the ice. Then close to the end of the season we had a Sports Psychologist, Steve Falk of Switchback Safe, do a session on team building, mental toughness and positive thinking.

I'd highly recommend using all of these resources on a regular basis in the future as I think it was very worth our time. Proof of that value, would be exemplified by our Bantam A team coached by Vince Devlin. That team won the Tier 2 BC Championship this year...and by no coincidence is the reason our association was introduced to both Steve Falk and Nolan Kurceba.

I'd like to congratulate not only the Bantam A team, but all of our Rep and House teams in CRMHA as there are too many tournament gold medals and good memories to mention in one report! Last but not least, I would like to send a BIG THANK-YOU to all of our Coaches for all their hard work and dedication.
