

The Fenlands Arena 1 Ice Users

The Fenlands team is working hard to ensure our community and users remain safe. We have implemented the following requirements and recommendations per the direction of AHS and the Town's Emergency Coordination Centre. We continue to strive to provide accurate contact tracing in the event of an outbreak, regularly sanitize high touch points and have implemented barriers to reduce transmission such as requiring masks to be worn and installing plexi-shields at service counters. We hope you and your attendees have a safe and enjoyable experience at The Fenlands.

Building Access: Arena 1 bookings will enter through the Arena Doors (Entrance B). Facility staff will be on site should you need any assistance and can be contacted at: (403) 996-0700.

Please note that The Fenlands Recreation Centre is currently closed to the general public and all facility doors are locked at all times. Access to the facility will be permitted to the booked client and their attendees only. Users are also asked to use the provided hand sanitizer upon entry to the building.

Contact Tracing & Health Checks: Spectators will be required to complete a health check and sign-in for contact tracing purposes at the front desk. We would request that efforts be made to get players in first to allow them adequate time to prepare for the game.

Time of access: Access to the facility must be organized ahead of time and must be within the booked period. For most hockey games access time is 15 minutes prior to the booked time. Teams may enter at 20 minutes to the booked time for team meetings. Meetings must be held on the Arena 2 dry floor and shall be requested to recreation@banff.ca a minimum 24 hours prior to the booked time.

Masks:

Masks must be worn at all times as per the Temporary Mask Bylaw found here: <https://banff.ca/1149/Temporary-Mask-Bylaw>. Masks can be removed during physical activity.

Washrooms:

Spectator washrooms are located to the left of the arena lobby (Dressing Rooms 5 & 6).

Physical Distancing:

It is the booking clients' responsibility to ensure all attendees are adhering to physical distancing guidelines at all times. There are a total of 26 physically distanced spaces in Arena 1. Ice users should work with their attendees and develop a plan to ensure this is not exceeded. If there are more than 26 family groups, spectators will be asked to leave the arena. Members of the public must also not congregate in the lobby or hallways areas.

Dressing Rooms:

Players and coaches are still required to come as dressed and ready to play as possible. Typically, 4 dressing rooms will be assigned per booking (i.e. two per team). Masks must be worn at all times in the rooms and capacity is limited to 7 persons (inclusive of parents). Additional spaces for getting ready are available on the lower level of the bleachers and around the ice rink. It is up to the user to determine how to assign their dressing rooms for games / practices (i.e. for out of town users, goalies, gender specific, etc.).

Water & Food:

Please note that water fountains are currently unavailable for use. Commercial outside food and beverage is not permitted. Oh Bento Concession is open on most weekends and pre-orders can be made by visiting www.ohbentobanff.com.
