## **Regarding Vulnerable Record Checks as of Fall 2010**

In the fall of 2010 the Federal Government in conjunction with the B.C. and Ontario provinces have made amendments to the Vulnerable sector of the Criminal records Check, that volunteers and workers have been accustomed too.

While talking with the Office of Blair Lekstrom and their aid, as well as of Sgt Traichevich of Dawson Creek Detachment, and discussion with our local RCMP detachment this is what has been found in change.

- -The Criminal record check has stayed the same as for now.
- -The Vulnerable section has changed. A general inquiry of your name and Allais will be placed into the system (not specifically you at your address) and if anyone closely resembling your name has a vulnerable offence, or conviction, your vulnerable search will fail. Say your name is one like Bill Smith? You will likely fail.
- -So if you have a common name and have failed, with the New Federal/Provincial mandate enforced by the RCMP, you will need to be fingerprinted by the RCMP to determine the true identity of yourself and clearly determine that you are record free.
- -I started this inquiry in later 2010 and little was known as to these changes. Many RCMP detachments were not even aware at this time, but Chetwynd's were. The RCMP are under Government direction and must comply with these changes, and feel the public's frustration.
- -Moral of the story-If you have a common name you most likely will fail a vulnerable check and will need to be fingerprinted, under the current program. Your prints will be sent to Ottawa to be processed and sent back. Common timeline for this is **Five Months**.
- -This has become a news worthy and public event, as this has and will have an important impact on Volunteerism, but has become an even larger impact, on new hires for certain types of employment.
- -The office of Blair Lekstrom has sent notice to the Provincial Government office on the specific issue. The problem is our Province is in an election status presently, so a quick resolution to this is not expected, at this time, as stated by Blair's office. It was reflected that this has been deemed important and will be looked at in the future as it has become a great issue with many types of employment, and impacted volunteering already.
- -If you do not agree to these changes, contact your local politicians, and tell them your beliefs.
