

Cranbrook Minor Hockey Gameday Procedures 2020/2021 November 12, 2020

1. Covid-19 Screening

- Visiting team must provide contact information of ALL screened participants including support staff prior to entering the arena. Full name, phone number or email address are required.
- You must be screened by your own teams Covid Screener and answer the applicable questions if required. CMHA game day contact tracing PDF sheets can be filled out in advance to expedite this process for those players and team staff that are expected to attend the ice time. If anyone is added, simply add their information on game day.
- Contact tracing records will be held by the Home Team for a minimum of 30 days
- The entry door is not to be propped open. Each group must enter as a COMPLETE unit and not prop the door open for late comers or people coming and going.

2. Facility Maximum

- The maximum group size for all City of Cranbrook arena's is 65 (full participants plus essential event staff). Arena Staff are not included in the (65) total number
- Those in the arena must be identified on the CMHA game day contact tracing and must hold the role as identified on this form

3. Games

- All people entering the facility and their respective roles must be recorded along with contact info for each game in the CMHA Game Day Sign Up Form PDF
- Face coverings must be worn at all times within the facility. Masks may only be removed by players when leaving the dressing room directly to the field of play (ice surface).
- Support Staff must remain in the designated areas within the facility as follows:
 - o Coaches, HCSP, and Athletic Trainers will be permitted on the benches.
 - Volunteers will be permitted to sit in the top row in Section A in WFP and in Section B in the Memorial. Vacant seats must be left between volunteers unless they share the same home
 - Penalty Box attendants, Time/Score Keepers will be permitted in the penalty box area
 - Videographers will be permitted to sit in Media Suite above and behind the penalty box in WFP and in Section A in the Memorial (If music is utilized by another volunteer, they are permitted to sit in the area to optimize the position)
 - o Volunteers may also be permitted in the Lower Lobby area in WFP to be in position to support players where needed.
 - o All other areas within the stands will be off limits at this time.
- The following are deemed Game Essential Staff:
 - 40 Players 20 per team
 - 8 Coaches 4 per team
 - 2 Managers 1 per team



- 2 Hockey Canada Safety Persons (HCSP) 1 per team
- 2 Covid Ambassadors (Home Team)
- 1 Time keeper (Home Team)
- 1 Score clock operator (Home Team)
- 2 Penalty box operators (Home Team)
- 2 Video streamers 1 per team
- o 1 Referee
- 2 Linespersons
- o 2 Covid Screeners 1 per team
- Teams are encouraged to minimize their group sizes as much as possible. The numbers above are maximums, and roles should not be replaced with other non-essential roles to push the limits to 65
- All Team Officials, On-Ice Officials, and Support staff must wear a face covering at all times within the facility
- 4. **Spectators** are not currently permitted in the arenas in Cranbrook

5. Arena

- Both home and visiting teams are to enter the arena no earlier than 15 minutes prior to
 the start of the game unless otherwise advised by individual Team Managers. Once in
 the arena, all participants MUST wear a mask and go directly to their assigned dressing
 room. No players will be permitted in the arena that have failed the Covid screening
- 6. **Leaving the arena** Teams must exit the arena within 15 minutes of their game ending. Please follow attached arena flow charts
- 7. Female dressing room Will be made available
- 8. **Showers** Are not currently available

9. Covid Screener

Each team will supply a Covid Screener who will be responsible for conducting the screening
protocol for their teams prior to entry into the building. They are also responsible for
staying throughout the ice time and directing anyone to the designated isolation room and
notifying the player's contact should someone develop symptoms during the game. The
Covid Screener will answer any questions on proper entry, exit points and volunteer staging
areas in the facilities

10. Covid Ambassador

• The Home Team will name a (max of two) Covid Ambassador(s) who must have a visible presence. This individual will oversee adherence to the return to play plan, facility guidelines, and ensure that COVID protocols are being followed. A City staff member will meet the COVID Ambassador 10 minutes prior to the participants allowed entrance to the facility. The Ambassador must be on time. Failure of the Ambassador to oversee adherence



to the return to play plan, facility guidelines, and ensuring the COVID protocols are being followed could result in a loss of booking privileges to the renter or organization

11. Additional Facility Information:

- Sanitization stations with hand sanitizer will be located at each check-in station.
- Designated washroom usage will be permitted but will be restricted to only 2 people per washroom at a time.
- Dressing room showers will remain off limits

12. Additional Safety Rules:

- NO SPITTING (including water from water bottles) anywhere inside of the facility including on the ice surface.
- No sharing of water bottles.
- No horseplay of any kind.
- Any player that feels sick or unwell MUST stay home
