Successes

• Our FUN 3 team medaled in several tournaments that they attended. Many of our athletes are making competitive teams, this signifies development within our programs.

Challenges

- Recruiting is definitely still our top priority and our biggest challenge as well as getting parents more involved. We attempted to hold our first tournament, however the tournament link on the RO website was not listed. As such we did not see a favorable amount of teams sign up to host the tournament.
- Recruitment/Come Try Ringette
 - Lots of time and energy has been spent on our Come Try Ringette event this year. We had about 30 kids participate. The activity went well. We did receive registration out of this event. Consideration to hold this event twice a year is a high priority.

Future

- 2024-2025 will see us have potentially 5 teams as well as our FUN 1 team. What teams will depend on early registration to properly form teams accordingly. This will be a difficult bi year for our association and team formation will strongly depend on registration. Next season, we hope to host a successful tournament but require volunteers to have this happen.
- Strategic planning will take place to develop a competitive plan beginning with our U12 program. Starting with the U12 program will build the base that will lead into other levels.

ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS:

- Coaching Calls will be launched Shortly for all potential age groups. There will be an interview process if more than 1 candidate is available and we will ask for season plans prior to making decisions.
- Coaches must have the required certifications by Nov 30th to be insured by RO and cannot be on the bench otherwise. We encourage you to get certified during the summer if courses are available. It is your responsibility to provide us with your NCCP# and show course proof of course completions.
- U12-U14 LVL of play will depend on player evaluations in the Fall.
- U14's very few players moving up this season leaving this cohort in a position where players might be offered to play up or down depending on registration numbers, Or ultimately offered a release for the season.
