PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Year in Reflection!



Facility projects got into high gear in 2009. Broadview building upgrades were completed. After 4 years of planning with the city we finally received the development permit to install our FIFA standard irrigation

system that will be operational in 2010. We also saw NECCS go into the ground after many years. We are scheduled to be playing in this facility in 2011. The Artificial Turf Committee is nearing shovel ready for 4 or 5 fields at the Subway Soccer Centre. We are anticipating playing on them in 2010.

Our growth in CUSA is contributing to driving the above facility growth. We continue to grow in teams and players. Our growth and size has attracted sponsors which we've signed our first this month and continue in discussions with several and anticipate additional announcements in the next few months. One of them allows us to sell our own beer through Sleemans at the Subway Soccer Centre. In keeping with CUSA's history, we are now managing another league which is the Co-ed League. It is the largest one in Alberta and Canada. CUSA is also the largest men's league in the country.

In order to insure members have what they need from the association, we've spent a lot of time this year improving communication. This past year we introduced the monthly CUSA Newsletter that distributes pertinent information along with board communication. We've overhauled our website and are currently rolling out phase 2. A lot of value has been realized including dramatically cutting down the foot traffic into the office for registration. Planned enhancements will further improve

your interface experience with the site. Finally we introduced a new member committee called the Competitions Committee comprised of our Vice Presidents and several members. It dealt effectively with league management and rule changes. We will be expanding this approach with new committees concentrating on specific leagues.

This year's success is attributed to the size of our membership and the quality and stability of your Staff and Board. Business Plan development has been initiated and will continue into 2010. Your involvement in this process will intensify in the coming year. As a member of ASA we submit the most white papers and by doing so contribute well to the development of soccer across the province. We are collaboratively and significantly involved in the Calgary Soccer Federation with our members leading many of its key projects.

At the 2009 Canadian Soccer Association Annual General Meeting held in Banff a number of individual's recognized. As for the Association's award winners, **Mr. Fred Kern** was presented the President's Award. Alberta soccer community standouts **Stuart Brown, Mario Charpentier, Joanne Mazurkewich, Mike Oliver, Dave Randall, Henry Szewczyk** and **Mike Traficante** were all presented with the Award of Merit.

Mr. Kern was presented the President's Award by Canadian Soccer Association president Dr. Dominic Maestracci. **Mr. Kern** has been involved in soccer for more than 35 years, culminating with his recent roles as Alberta Soccer Association president and Canadian Soccer Association board member. He has been a player, a coach and an administrator. He has also been a soccer dad, watching both of his sons win national championships - Greg with the Calgary Kickers (1987 Canadian Soccer League) and Gary with the Vancouver Westside Rhinos (1993 Challenge Trophy).

The seven Award of Merit recipients have all made significant contributions to soccer in Canada, most notably in their home province of Alberta. Mr. Charpentier has long been associated with the Edmonton Minor Soccer Association, **Ms. Mazurkewich** with the Calgary Soccer Association, **Mr. Oliver** with the Calgary United Soccer Association, and Mr. Szewczyk with the Edmonton Minor and Senior Associations. Mr. Brown and **Mr. Randall** are both well known for their accomplishments at the BMO National Championships, Mr. Brown with the Edmonton Angels (Jubilee Trophy champions) and **Mr. Randall** with the Calgary Callies (Challenge Trophy champions). As for Mr. Traficante, he has been an executive member with both the Alberta Soccer Association and Canadian Soccer Association.

MEMBERSHIP SUPPORT



KID SPORT SPONSORSHIP

The KidSport Society of Calgary has been providing assistance to children in need for the past 13 years. They work closely with families and local sport clubs to help pay registration fees and distribute the necessary equipment that allows low-income kids to get active and engaged in sports. Since 1995, KidSport Calgary has distributed more than \$2.6 million in support of kids in Calgary and the surrounding communities. Help KidSport Calgary continue to motivate kids to play, because healthy kids make healthy adults.

Within Alberta over 1,071 soccer players received assistance through Kid Sport, the largest sport group in the province. Within Calgary support was provided to 528 local kids to allow them the opportunity to participate in the sport of soccer.

MIKE METCALFE 30 HOUR SOCCER MARATHON

The Mike Metcalfe 30 Hour Soccer Marathon began in the fall of 2004 after Mike was diagnosed with testicular cancer. Friends of Mike came together to make a difference after watching him endure over 500 hours of chemotherapy and treatment for his cancer. Since Mike is an avid soccer player, the concept of a 30 hour soccer marathon seemed fitting.

To date, over \$280,000 has been raised for the purchase of equipment for the cancer units at Foothills Medical Centre.

The 2009 Soccer Marathon was the biggest ever! The goal is to raise \$85,000 for the Calgary Health Trust towards the purchase of equipment to assist with the purchase of the Apheresis System.

HOMELESS WORLD CUP OF SOCCER

Four cities from across Canada, including a team from Calgary, came together in Toronto in June of this year in a spirit of celebration and competition to vie for the 2009 Canadian Street Soccer National Championship with an aim to selecting the players to represent Canada in the 7th Homeless World Cup in Milan, Italy, September 6-13, 2009. Although Team Calgary lost in penalty shots to the 'winners' from Team Vancouver, everyone had a great time including the chance to meet and talk with an inspirational Dick Howard, journalist, broadcaster and former Canadian national team member and coach.

In Milan, Team Canada had one of its strongest showings in years finishing a respectable 28th place out of 48 countries. The level of play continues to increase each year as does the show of camaraderie and goodwill. In 2010, Team Calgary will welcome the addition of a former player from the 2007 HWC, Roland, who will assist with coaching. CUSA continues to be the main sponsor of Team Calgary and without their support; we would not be able to continue to run this valuable program that, since inception in 2006, has helped several players successfully transition from the Calgary Drop-In Centre.

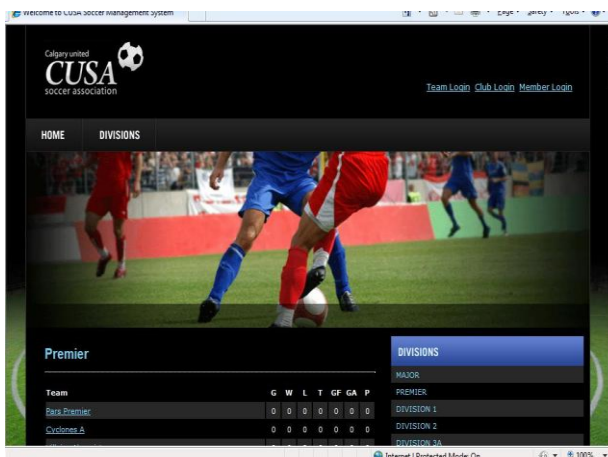
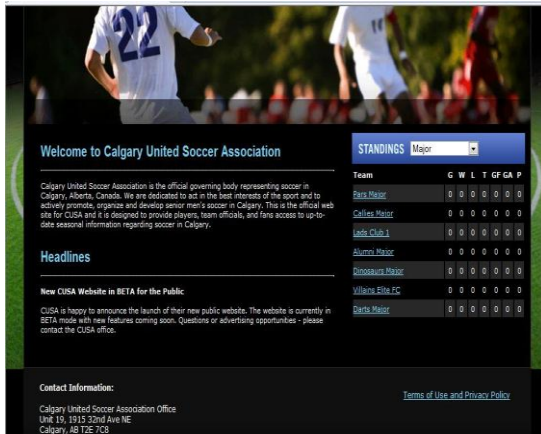


CUSA DATA MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Continuing on the path of improved and increased communication with its members, CUSA embarked on a project web site. Early on in this process it became apparent that to improve the web site content and operations the entire data management program for the league needed to be revised and upgraded.

FACILITIES COMMITTEE

Within Calgary numerous facility projects remain at various stages of planning and development. In the past 12 months the profile for outdoor fields has risen within Calgary.

The Calgary Sport Council along with the City of Calgary has formed a Rectangular Field Users Advisory Committee which within its mandate includes reviewing field allocation policies and procedures, field maintenance and construction standards.

This group was activity involved in the development and formation of the recommendations contained within the City Report to Council *Strategic Plan for Investment in Outdoor Athletic Turf Fields in Calgary*. It is this Plan that supports the development of Artificial Turf Fields at the SUBWAY Soccer Centre and recommends to City Council that they invest in these fields. Confirmation of the value of the investment is expected by the end of November 2009.

Indoor Facility development continues with the beginning steps for Regional Recreation Centres in the Northwest and Southeast commencing. Currently soccer is one of the potential tenants in both facilities. As these are still on the horizon work will continue to ensure that soccer has a presence.

BROADVIEW UPDATE

2009 saw the completion of the exterior repairs to the change rooms at Broadview along with completion of the deck replacing the old stairs.

Following the completion of league play in October the irrigation contractor commenced work and anticipates the installation of a first class irrigation system to be completed by the end of November. The system will not only improve the quality of the field irrigation but will decrease the water consumption through a significantly more effective process. The actual irrigation heads have been installed in several fields throughout the world utilized by professional teams. The units were selected with player safety in mind.

The provincial and federal governments, City of Calgary, YMCA, North East Centre of Community Society and other organizations have all contributed funds that will assist with the construction of the new Genesis Centre in northeast Calgary.

This \$120M project has solid support from the community and the public and private sector:

- The City of Calgary contributed \$70M.
- The Government of Canada contributed \$15M.
- The Government of Alberta contributed \$10M.
- The North East Centre of Communities Society has risen \$12.5M.
- YMCA Calgary has risen \$12.5M.

"This idea of a facility where citizens in northeast Calgary can go for recreation, to socialize and to learn has been a dream for the last 15 years," said Culture and Community Spirit Minister Lindsay Blackett. "This project shows that a common dream and co-operation between groups and individuals can have amazing results."

Once completed, the new centre will house the YMCA, a branch of the Calgary Public Library, a community services hub and the North East Centre of Community Society. Funds provided will assist in the construction of a full fitness centre, large gymnasium, indoor track, aquatic centre, daycare and pre-school, community gathering places, meeting rooms and two indoor soccer/multi-sport fields.

The CSF \$1 million contribution is part of the NECCS \$15 million "Completing the Dream Together" community campaign.

Key Milestones in this project were met in the past 12 months. They included:

- Feb 18th \$15M Federal Government funding announcement.
- March 4th \$10M Provincial Government funding announcement
- May 19th Open House @ Crossing Park School
- June 23rd Ground Breaking Ceremony @ NECCS Genesis Centre Site
- Oct 15th Official signing of Construction Contracts

First games in new facility anticipated September 2011. Soccer has access to 80% of the field time guaranteed.

PROJECT UPDATE:

The current expansion of the number of playing fields at the Calgary Rugby Union's current facility is temporarily being put on hold. Due to the recent global economic downturn, the CRU finds itself short of the required funds and it has also been denied access to critical funding support from the Provincial Government (through the MCFP grant program – program cancelled), to complete the work required to adequately finish the two fields previously approved for expansion. Due to this roadblock, the CRU will find itself in a "state of construction renovation" for the remainder of 2009 and, quite possibly, a good part of 2010 until the required funds are arranged to complete the planned work.



As the CRU does not control the ultimate timing and completion of the expansion plans initiated, the CRU does have the best interests of each and every one of its members, other user groups and/or social participants in mind for every aspect of its development.

CUSA continues to support the efforts of the CRU with their plans of expansion and development that will ultimately provide a park with additional grass surfaces that will be available for use by soccer. The park will, with the completion of the SE LRT line also be mass transit accessible a feature that will be welcomed for major competitions.

While CUSA remains committed to this project, among others, to help address the need for quality outdoor pitches there has not been a financial ask or commitment by the Association to the project.

SHOULDICE ATHLETIC PARK

PROJECT UPDATE:



The development of three artificial turf fields at Shouldice Athletic Park has been a long term project and goal of the Greater Calgary Amateur Football Association. Greg Peterson, President of GCAFA, says that his group is close to completing an eye-opening football facility. The project has already exceeded \$10M. The three artificial turf fields, stands and lighting completed in 2009 with the plaza, press box and road work remaining in 2010.



Once the project is completed, all high school and minor football will be played on these three fields at Shouldice. In addition soccer and lacrosse teams will have access to rent the venues.

PROJECT STATUS

Design & Construction Update

- Athletica Sport and Recreation Design from Vancouver selected as prime consultant for the project.
- The Design Committee, Athletica and the City of Calgary are proceeding with the Development Permit to produce construction-ready drawings for the project.
- RFP's for product and civil work have been completed and are awaiting finalization and financing before going to tender.
- Our goal is to have all fields built by the summer of 2010.



Fundraising Update

- The Calgary soccer community has contributed \$1 million toward the goal to raise \$13 million.
- The City of Calgary has given their support in principle with a grant of \$4.5 million toward the project.
- A team of community volunteers and representatives from three soccer associations and the SUBWAY Soccer Centre has been assembled.
- CSF is presently seeking support from all three levels of government

DISCIPLINE

CUSA REPRESENTATIVES:

The league discipline is managed through a committee comprised of two rotating chairs representing the Board of Directors, a member at large and a referee.

Each season individuals are sought to fill the various positions on the committee. It allows those individuals who attend the hearing to have a representation of their peers determine what the appropriate penalty for their actions will be.

In the past year a disturbing trend has been noticed with a marked increase in Team discipline resulting from spectator interference.

REFEREE DEVELOPMENT

CUSA REPRESENTATIVE:

LAURIE STEIN, BILL MALONE

Within the past year there have been a number of significant changes noticed locally within the referee program. Demand for courses offered throughout the year has been consistently high resulting in several new officials joining the CSF pool.

Along with the increase in new officials the training program has been modified to include additional practical time in the course, an increase in the utilization of available technology and change the course from a static book learning process to the use of video clips. All these steps help ensure that the course participant is better prepared for their role as a game official.

Beginning in the summer of 2009 and continuing in the Indoor season CWSA and CUSA jointly introduced a Referee Mentorship Program. The intention is to provide new officials with an opportunity to have individualized feedback on their performance and a chance to ask questions directly related to the game that they have officiated. While this will be a long term investment into the development of the officials the benefits will be seen through both an increase in quality and quantity.

The Referee Evaluations that each team is encouraged to complete following each league game does impact the development of the referees. Those evaluations are both reviewed and considered when officials are both upgraded and demoted in their ratings for games. Your comments are also used as

teaching tools to help officials improve their skills and correct errors that could be occurring. In the same light the complements on a good game are also positive reinforcement to the officials. From your comments an official may be identified for the mentorship program as well.

Teams are encouraged to do their part in recruiting individuals to become officials, respecting those that do officiate and ensure that when asked provided the required support to those that do volunteer to officiate or be your linesmen.

Referee Courses are offered year round. Contact the league office for more details on how you can become involved.

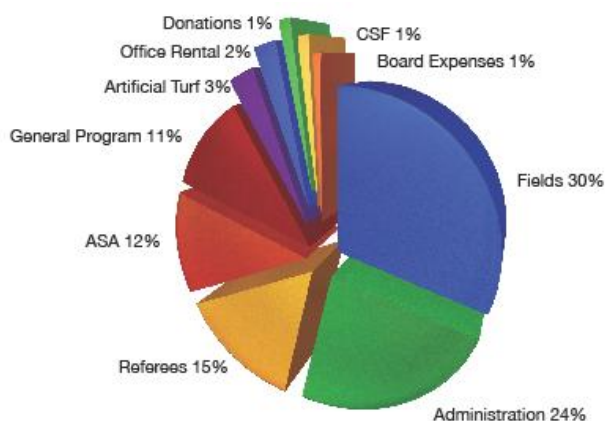

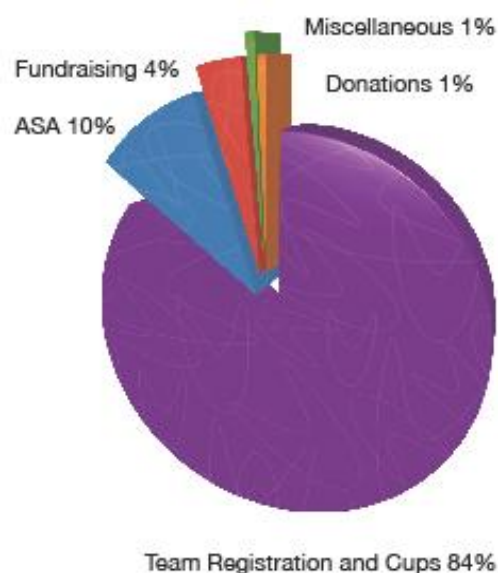

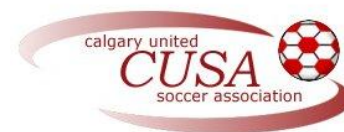
