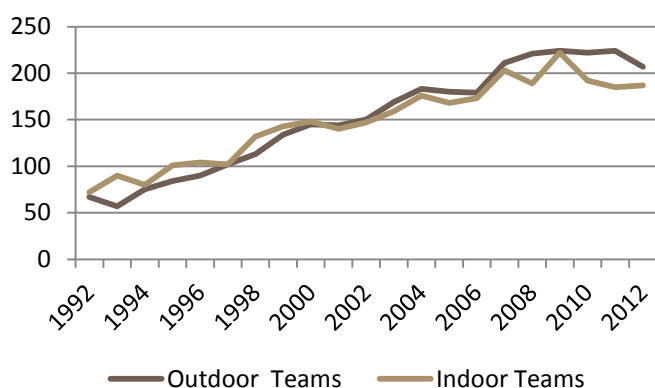

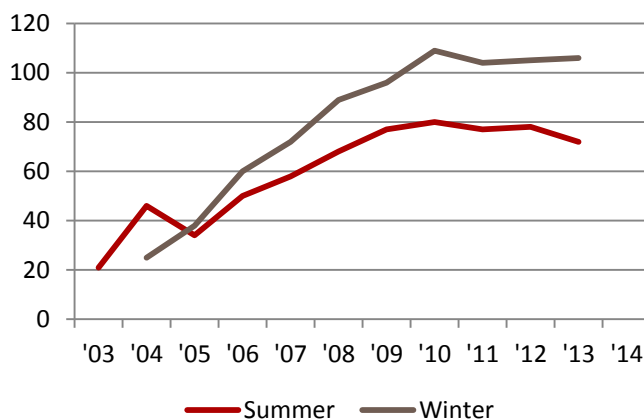

COED Program

The Calgary Indoor Co-Ed Rec Soccer (CO-ED) league started in the summer of 2002 using modified ASA Indoor Soccer rules which requires teams to have 2 males and 2 females on the field at all times. Popularity in the league has grown each season since the Soccer Centre started it as a program for off season revenue. Effective July 1, 2012 the program was transferred from Calgary Soccer Federation to CUSA. The 2013 AGM will be the first opportunity for the Coed Membership to participate at a league meeting.

Number of Teams



Fair Play is valued higher than a win in CO-ED. Teams are awarded a maximum of 10 Fair Play Points (FPP) by the referee after every game; a maximum of 5 FPP are counted towards the standings. A win in CO-ED could be worth up to 8 points, 3 points for the win and 5 points for the Fair Play. Similar to CUSA, teams who finish with the highest Fair Play Points win a monetary prize at the end of the season.

CO-ED has brought in several initiatives to promote Fair Play amongst teams and players. Teams are expected to earn a minimum number of FPP over the course of a season. Failure to achieve the minimum FPP may result in, but is not limited to, the team having performance sanctions for future seasons or removal of players from the roster.

Similar to CUSA, teams are awarded bonus FPP when they complete the Referee Evaluation form within two weeks of their game. Players are required to sign a "Fair Play" agreement when they register each season. This agreement goes over many of the principles outlined in the "My Game is Fair Play" initiative started by FIFA, including sportsmanship, fair competition and equality.

The average FPP teams have earned over the course of the season has increased by about 10 FPP since these initiatives have been introduced.

CO-ED does not limit play to only League play, but also runs several tournaments during the year. The Kick the Winter Blues tournament was run in February and in September, the 9th Annual Boxers Bras and Beerfest tournament was held.

Currently, CO-ED offers two Indoor Soccer seasons throughout the year, winter and summer. The League has been developing rules for Outdoor Soccer to use in various tournaments and League play during the summer months.



Member Awards

Annually CUSA recognizes the contributions of its members to the organization. As one of the largest senior soccer organizations in Canada, the Association has several members who work tirelessly for the sport and the game.

A & J Buckler Trophy: This is the most prestigious Calgary Soccer trophy awarded annually to an individual for the most outstanding contribution to the sport of soccer within Calgary and area. In 2013 this was awarded to **Chris Baker**. Chris has been a dedicated supporter and promoter of Calgary soccer. In addition to his involvement with the Villains Elite in the AMSL, Chris was instrumental in the organization and management of the Calgary United FC. He is also active with the Elbow Valley Villains youth program.



President's Award

This is given to an individual who has displayed a dedication in their support and contribution towards the programs of the Calgary United Soccer Association. In 2013, this was awarded to **Angus Smith**. Angus has represented CUSA on the CSF Board for numerous years and currently serves as the CSF President. He has dedicated tremendous hours working with various partners and agencies to increase the number of facilities dedicated to the sport of soccer in and around the City of Calgary. In his spare time, he can also be found on the field as an official.



Kieran McGarrigle Award:

The Senior Leagues in Calgary announced the establishment of the Kieran McGarrigle Award in 2012 in honor of the dedication and outstanding contribution of Kieran McGarrigle, a long serving member of the refereeing community and national level referee, who lost his battle with cancer in 2010.

The 2013 recipient of this award is **Richard Sansregret**. Richard is, and has been, a senior instructor for several years. He provides additional referee training through the CDRSA program. Richard has sat on our Discipline panel as a referee representative and has been a member of our ad hoc committee on CUSA Discipline Code review. He has been one of our officials who we can contact when needing a greater understanding of a rule, a proposed rule or how to interpret a rule (or misconduct report). He will be delivering training again this summer not only through the CDRSA programs but to those instructors identified by CSA and ASA as future candidates for the National program.

And last but not least – he has earned at least one red card in CUSA - deserved or not.



Lifetime Achievement Award

This is presented to an individual for years of outstanding contribution and unselfish effort towards the growth of the Calgary United Soccer Association. In 2013, this was awarded to **Steve Hill**. Steve has been a long-time member of CUSA playing within the Fish Creek Club.

Awards of Merit: This award is presented to individuals for time and services rendered in support of the Calgary United Soccer Association and its members. In 2013, three Awards of Merit were presented.

John Talerico. CUSA is pleased to present an Award of Merit to an individual who has also been a long-time member of the League as a player, coach, and club official. In addition, he has dedicated his time within his Club to grow the youth program and to serve as an Alberta Select Coach.

The Calgary Juventus Sports Club has continued to grow under the guidance of John Talerico with CJSC again participating in the top open League divisions and teams within Masters and Over 45. John's involvement in the game within Calgary exceeds 15 years of dedication and for that we are pleased to present to him an Award of Merit.



Celest Herauf and Mike McMahon are both long time members of the Calgary Lads Club and were be part of that club's contingent to Italy for the 2013 World Master's Games.



In addition to their leadership on the field of play, both of these individuals have dedicated numerous evenings to sit as members of the CUSA Discipline Committee and the CUSA Master's/O45 Competition Committee.

The success of the CUSA Discipline Committee is a direct result of the combination of having a Chair, referee representative and a member representative. Both Celeste and Mike provide a strong understanding from a member's perspective of on-field actions – both acceptable and not.



It is rare that a CUSA Planning Meeting will be held without one or the other in attendance and providing suggestions and recommendations on how the League can continue to grow and improve the quality of the program.

For their long-serving efforts within League, CUSA is pleased to recognize both individuals with an Award of Merit.



Player of the Month

Commencing in 2011 12 Indoor Ric's Grill and CUSA partnered to introduce the Player of the Month Award. Each team was asked to nominate a player from their respective team that they felt had an outstanding month of soccer. The selection criteria included soccer stats; leadership qualities on and off the field; volunteerism within the soccer community and sportsmanship. Two winners were selected each month, one from an open division team and one from a Master's or Over 45 team. Recipients received gift certificates to Ric's Grill and a Certificate.

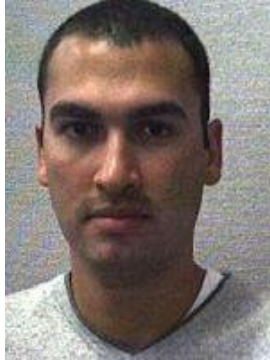

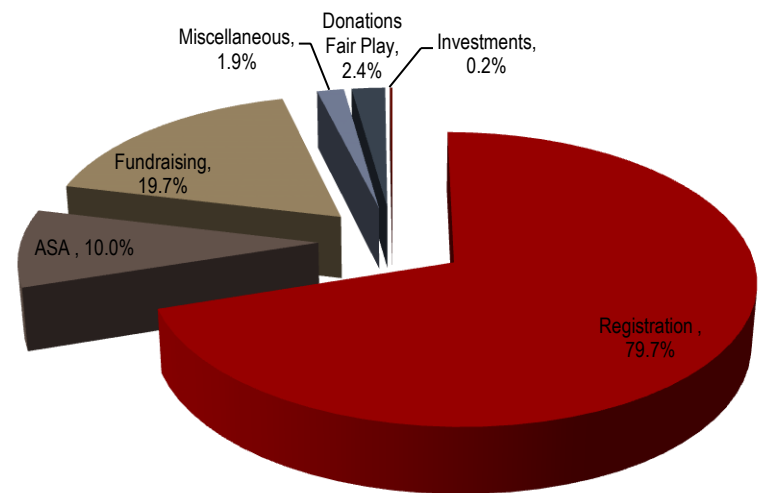

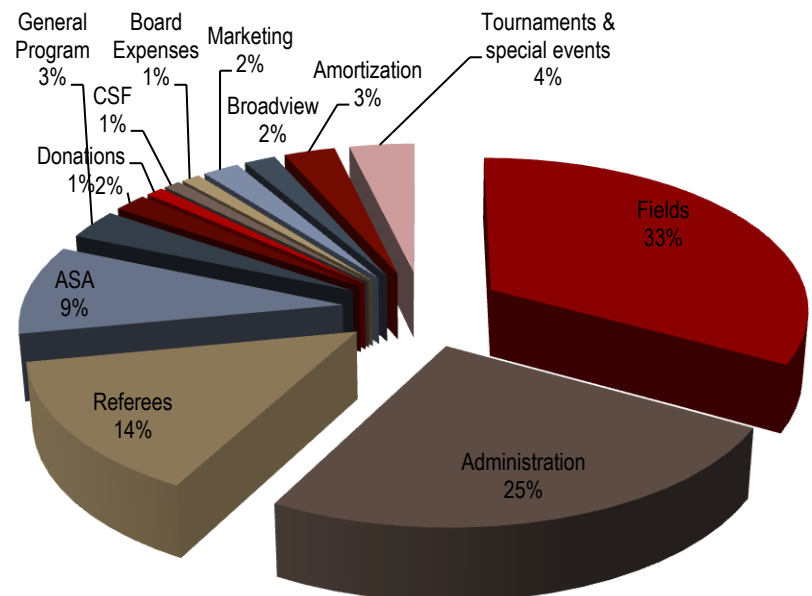

Mike Metcalfe 30 Hour Soccer Marathon



The Mike Metcalfe 30-Hour Soccer Marathon typically sees up to 1,100 participants and is open to players of all ages and levels.

The 10th annual Mike Metcalfe 30 Hour Soccer Marathon for Cancer will be taking place on November 1-2, 2013 at the Calgary Soccer Centre. In 2004, Mike hosted his first 30 Hour Soccer Marathon for Cancer after being diagnosed with testicular cancer. After enduring more than 500 hours of chemotherapy and cancer treatment, Mike's friends decided it was time to take a kick at cancer together. Because he is an avid soccer player, Mike and his friends decided a soccer marathon was a fitting way to raise money for cancer.



"Without the support of my friends and family, this event would not happen," says Mike. "They organize it, they participate in it, they volunteer for it, they donate money to it, they are the marketing engine that drives the success of it every year, and I am forever indebted to them for the successes we have celebrated for the past nine years."

Proceeds from this year's event will go to Calgary Health Trust to purchase equipment for Foothills Hospital.



Since its beginning, the Mike Metcalfe 30 Hour Soccer Marathon has:

- raised over \$450,000 for the Calgary Health Trust towards the purchase of cancer-related diagnostic and treatment equipment for the Foothills Hospital,
- welcomed over 5,400 participants,
- played over 210 hours of soccer!

The fundraising goal is \$80,000+ for 2013.

CUSA Membership continues to support this program. "One hundred per cent of the funds raised goes to something material and tangible that will affect cancer patients right away" said Metcalfe.

KidSport™ Sponsorship



The KidSport™ Society of Calgary has been providing assistance to children in need for the past 15 years. KidSport works closely with families and local sport clubs to help pay registration fees and distribute the necessary equipment that allows low-income kids to get active and engaged in sports. Since 1995, KidSport Calgary has distributed more than \$3.1 million in support of over 15,000 kids in Calgary and the surrounding communities. Help KidSport™ Calgary continue to motivate kids to play, because healthy kids make healthy adults.

Soccer represents one of the largest sport segments funded through the KidSport™ Calgary program each year, contributing to approximately one-third of the annual funding distribution. With the support of local teams, the Calgary United Soccer Association helps raise integral funding to support low-income kids in soccer programs, and has provided positive sport experiences to local kids.

In 2011, 6,409 Alberta children and local schools were supported through KidSport™, enabling them to pursue their dreams in sport. Within Calgary \$594,741 was distributed to 2,414 deserving children and youth. However, despite these successes there are many more kids who need our help.



Our Process

Throughout the year, we held soccer practices every Wednesday and Sunday at the St. Angela's School yard in Bridgeland. We consistently had between 10-25 participants per practice and we were happy to see a returning 'core group' of players who showed up each and every session. A unique thing happened this year whereby a group of dedicated players wanted even more training and as a result ended up showing up on Fridays to train by themselves. This was extremely gratifying for us as this is a large step in rehabilitation – if our players can show that kind of dedication to our program, then they can translate that dedication into their everyday lives and it will give them the confidence they need to achieve their goals.

The players that show the most dedication to our program (and in CSS dedication means regular attendance and demonstrating a positive attitude) will be selected to participate in a Western Canadian Homeless Soccer Tournament. This year's tournament was held in Comox, British Columbia. Furthermore, if a player continues to demonstrate a high level of dedication to the program and has shown signs of being on the path to rehabilitation, then they are eligible to be selected to represent Canada at the Homeless World Cup. This year's tournament was held in Poznan, Poland and we are very proud that one of our CSS's players was selected to participate on the Canadian team.

To raise awareness we have built a website, www.calgarystreetsoccer.com, and will be updating it within the coming months.



Calgary Street Soccer



Calgary Street Soccer (CSS) had another successful year thanks to all of our volunteers and sponsors. Our goals for 2013 were to continue to help Calgary's homeless rehabilitate their lives through soccer and build a platform to raise awareness within the community.

Corporate Soccer Tournament

In order to continue to raise awareness of the program and raise funds for CSS, we held our first annual corporate soccer tournament. We held the event at McMahon Stadium and had great response



from corporate Calgary. In total we had 12 teams participate with between 10-15 participants per team resulting in approximately 180 local community members supporting and helping raise money for CSS. CTV graciously covered the event and helped create publicity for our organization. We had over 20 volunteers that helped with the event and in total CSS raised over \$6,000. Thank you to everyone that participated and helped out with the event. The second annual tournament will take place in May 2014 and we hope to build on the success of the 2013 tournament.

Western Canadian Soccer Tournament – Comox, BC

At the end of June we selected a team of 8 players to participate in the Western Canadian Soccer tournament in Comox, British Columbia. CSS rented a van and took the team to BC where they were able to showcase what they had learned in the program. This gave the players an opportunity to work together as a team but more importantly it taught them all that teamwork has to offer and how



to adapt in a competitive situation. The experience was a valuable life lesson for the players and we are proud to say that our team finished in second place – an outstanding achievement!

Homeless World Cup – Poznan, Poland

Every year a World Cup soccer tournament takes place – www.homelessworldcup.org – this year's tournament was in Poznan, Poland. We are proud to announce that CSS sent one player and our coach to help represent Canada in this year's homeless world cup. This CSS player has been living at the Salvation Army for over a year and has adhered to their policies of no substance abuse and a strict curfew. He has maintained the same job for over a year and has been one of CSS most dedicated players. The individual has practiced with the team for over a year and half and has displayed an exemplary attitude. We were very pleased that he was selected for the Canadian team.

There were 48 participating countries and 64 teams (a mixture of men's and women's teams) in the tournament. The team participated in the opening ceremonies,



watched a professional soccer match and had the opportunity of a lifetime to visit another country.

When our player joined the rest of the Canadians, (there were 6 in total) they went straight to work, practicing every morning and playing in more than 15 games throughout the week. The sense of pride that we witnessed and dedication to the team, made all the hard work seem worthwhile. It was a very physically and mentally demanding week for the players, they had to stay focused, listen to the coach and perform each day. Player's continuously mentioned how the tournament was a positive life changing experience and there was a new sense of determination to succeed in every day life. Building confidence in these individuals and creating a drive for success is exactly what CSS is all about. We are very pleased.

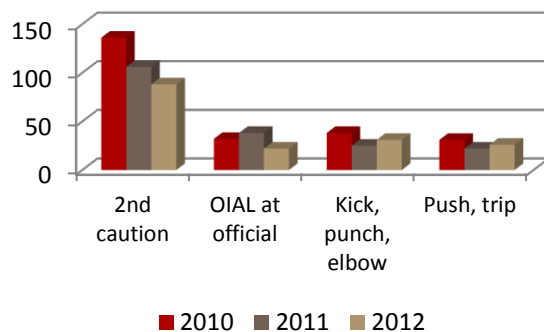

The member-at-large provides the player with a representative of their peers at each meeting.

PLAYER OFFENCES

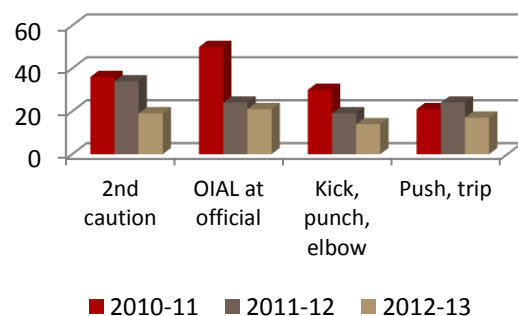
From 2010 Outdoor to 2012 Outdoor the number of players receiving disciplinary action decreased from 331 to 303.

From Indoor 2010-2011 to 2012-13, the number of players receiving disciplinary measures decreased 37% from 252 to 159. Two players were referred to ASA in 2012 Outdoor for alleged contact with an official, while 4 players were referred in the 2012-13 Indoor season.

Indoor Statistics



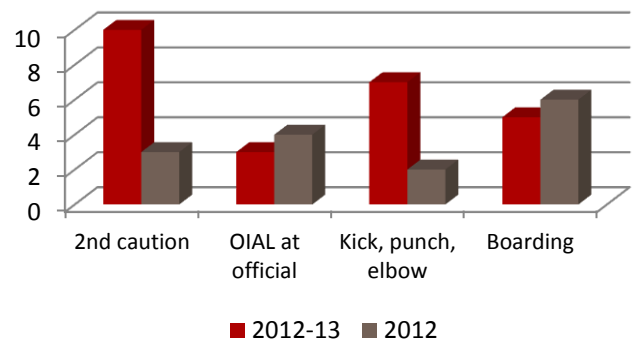
TEAM OFFENCES

CALGARY NATIONS CUP

Davinder Singh Kajla Memorial Trophy



The Calgary Nations Cup tournament started in Calgary, Alberta in 2006 in memory of the late Davinder Singh Kajla. It has since been held annually with great success.

This tournament provides a unique concept of grouping players based on their ethnic backgrounds and/or countries of origin, creating an exciting atmosphere that provides a platform for people throughout the community to express their ethnic pride.

Teams are comprised of quality players from Calgary to compete for the coveted *Davinder Singh Kajla Memorial Cup*. With hundreds of spectators coming out each year, this tournament is the must see soccer event of the summer. In addition to furthering cultural awareness, the goal behind the tournament is to expand knowledge and excitement around soccer and to keep young adults engaged to help build a community that recognizes diversity and works together. 2013 saw the tournament grow to 20 teams.

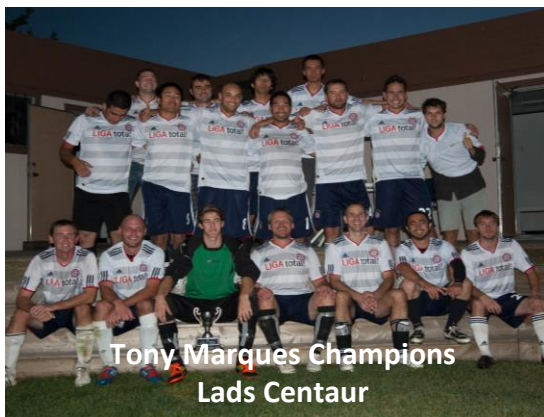

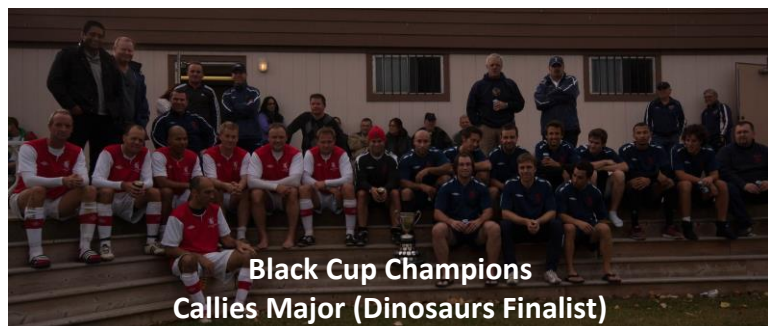

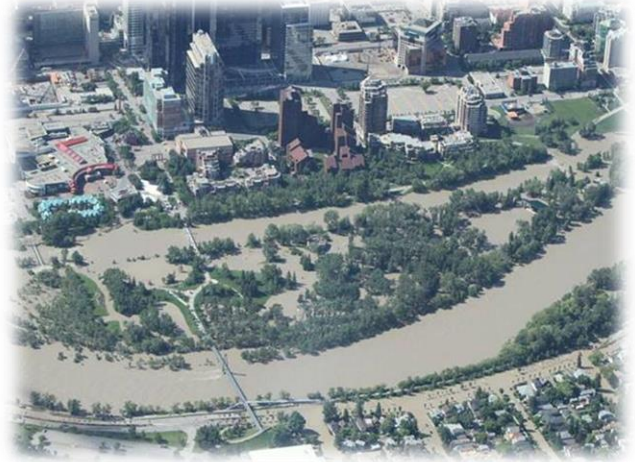
