About Calgary United Soccer Association (CUSA):

Organized soccer in Calgary dates back to 1898 when the Calgary Association Football League held its inaugural season with 6 teams and 140 players. Many iterations and 82 years later, CUSA was founded as an amalgamation of Calgary Men's Soccer League and Calgary United Soccer. In its inaugural season, CUSA operated leagues for approximately 30 teams and 600 players. Over the past 35 years the association has grown dramatically today consisting of over 310 teams and 9,000+ registered players and coaches. CUSA offers its members two seasons of play annually (indoor and outdoor) in men's, women's and co-ed programs.

The Board decided this year to better align the reporting cycle and relevant seasons by holding the AGM within 90 days of CUSA's year end. It is our plan for this policy to continue in future years.

Jack Buckler Award

2016 Recipient: Tommy Wheeldon Jr.

Awarded for the most outstanding contribution to the sport of soccer within Calgary and area.

Tommy has been with the Foothills Soccer Club since 2007, taking over the Technical Director position in 2008, and has completed many coaching certifications, including the UEFA A License and CSA Advanced Coaching Course. He is currently the Assistant Coach with the U17 Men's Nations Team and the Head Coach with the Foothills U23 PDL Men's team.

He was instrumental in bringing a USL PDL franchise to Calgary. The team has brought soccer to the forefront of the Calgary community after the team's Cinderella run to the PDL Finals in only their second season. Tommy also brought a United Women's Soccer (UWS) team to the Foothills Club and Calgary for the Outdoor 2017 season.



Award of Merit

2016 Recipient: Ron Stephenson

Awarded to individuals for time and services rendered in support of Calgary United Soccer Association and its members.

Ron has been a fixture in the Calgary soccer community for several years as both a player and an official. His calm, relaxed manner has been demonstrated on the field with his team and especially on the pitch as an official. Ron has always been willing to take on a challenge. Garth has been a referee and a referee instructor for over 30 years. He has been a member of CUSA, a parent to CUSA Members and a long time Calgary Referee. In recent years he has added instructor and assessor to his portfolio. As a national instructor Garth has had a positive impact on many referees, not only in Calgary but across the country. Garth has taken on the responsibility of running Futsal leagues, instructing Futsal referees and assigning Futsal referees.

Garth is a current member of the Referee Development Committee for South Alberta to which he is the assignments chair and the assessment chair. It is too difficult to quantify the value of knowledge that people who have learned from Garth have brought to the soccer community in Calgary. Garth is indeed a dedicated and in demand individual for referee training.

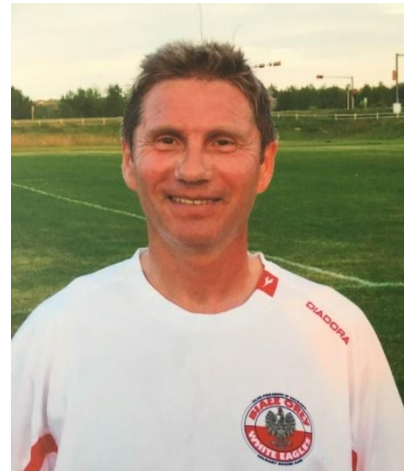
Award of Merit

2017 Recipient : Janusz Dobrowolski

Presented to those who've displayed great achievements and brought pride to soccer in the past year. Selected by the ASA Board of Directors.



Janusz has been a seasoned soccer player for more than 35 years. He was in the Junior Euro Cup under 21 in 1982' in Finland placing fourth place, in the Junior World Cup under 21 in 1983' in Mexico where they won bronze, and for 15 years he played in the Professional Prime League in Poland for both Stal Mielec and Slask Wroclaw. Since 1991 he has played and coached the Polish soccer team, The White Eagles, here in Calgary; so Soccer has not only been his passion, it's in his blood.



While playing in Alberta Janusz has been a member of the White Eagles Soccer Club, first in the Open Men's Division, later in both the Masters and Over 45 divisions. He has participated in numerous Alberta Soccer Provincial Championships and earned the respect of his team mates and opponents alike for his skill and competitive nature. In recent years he has been a member of the coaching team for the White Eagles youth program, working to develop the next generation of players in the Calgary area.

On July 18, 2016 Janusz, endured a terrible accident. He fell off a ladder and ended up in Intensive Care Unit at the hospital with brain and spine injuries. He was in a coma and the doctors only gave him a few hours to live. Miraculously he came out of that coma and started responding to the team of doctors and nurses. Because of the intensity of the fall he shattered his spine and had to undergo spinal surgery. Metal rods had to be placed in order to rebuild what was left with the bones and vertebrae to regain his posture. Neurologically he is pretty much back to his old self, speaking, making jokes; something that seemed impossible immediately following the accident. The team at the hospital have been calling him a 'Miracle' and his progression day by day, has been nothing more than incredible. He is now in the rehabilitation unit where physiotherapists are teaching him to maneuver from wheelchair to bed to help him regain his independence. Unfortunately Doctors have only given him a 5% chance that the he will walk again, but a CHANCE is all he needs.

Family, friends, the Calgary Polish community and the Calgary soccer community have shown their support and respect for Janusz through not only their moral support but by their generous financial contributions to his rehabilitation. Janusz has previously used his skill and competitive determination to be a champion on the field; he is now applying that same focus to his recovery. His journey through this adversity will be one that will enable all to remember the value of determination, focus and dedication to a goal and last but not least, the importance of community support. We wish him well and can't wait to see him at the pitch again soon.

Structure of Soccer in Alberta

Calgary United Soccer Association is one of 19 members within Alberta Soccer Association, the governing body of soccer within the province. Through CUSA, teams and players have a direct link to FIFA, through the provincial governing body and Canada Soccer.

Along with CUSA, Calgary Minor Soccer Association (CMSA) and Calgary Women's Soccer Association (CWSA), these 3 organizations make up District 4 within Alberta Soccer.

Alberta Soccer helps set directions that many leagues use as guidelines, such as rules and regulations, and referee and coach development. However, each league operates separately. For example, the league structures and rules in Edmonton are similar but vastly different than what is used in Lethbridge.

Alberta Soccer hosts all provincial competitions between the minor and senior organizations. Teams that compete and earn the Provincial Championship title in the Challenge Cup and Youth

Tier One Championships become the provincial representative at the various National Championships. Alberta Soccer sets out the rules for Provincial Competitions along with recommendations from the district members to set out competition guidelines that are fair for each qualified team.

Soccer remains the largest sport by participation in Alberta with over 82,000 registered players throughout the province. Within Alberta the majority of the Alberta Soccer registrations are from youth soccer. Senior soccer is comprised of approximately 30% of the total membership with Edmonton and Calgary representing over 80 of all registered senior players in the province. Calgary United Soccer league membership numbers exceeds total registrations in 6 provinces including that of Manitoba!

Alberta Major Soccer League

The Men's Program offers competitive league play for players from 16 years of age and older. Teams move within the league through a promotion and relegation structure based upon final divisional standings. While the league has divisions with age restrictions, players are able to register to a division of choice providing they meet the minimum age restriction.

The league qualifies teams in the AMSL/Major, Premier to Division 3, Masters Elite and Masters Premier for post-season play in the ASA Provincial Championships. In the outdoor season the champions from the AMSL and Masters Elite earn the opportunity to participate in Canadian Soccer Championships.

Calgary United Soccer was the first league in Alberta to offer an Over 55 division. It started as a fall tournament, the Kaiser Cup, and has evolved into a division where the majority of each team are 55 years of age or older.

Men's soccer in Calgary continues to show growth at both ends of the league's spectrum. Players are remaining in the league as demonstrated by the growth in the Masters, O45 and O55 divisions and new teams are forming as players graduate from youth soccer or move into Calgary.

Teams may participate in both the indoor and outdoor seasons, although their placement within the league can vary between the two. Newly registered teams in the Open Division are required to start in the lowest division. Those demonstrating strong performance during the season have the option to participate in the league's Promotional Challenge held at the end of each season. An undefeated team from Division 6 has the ability, through a series of challenge games, to earn a position in Division 3 for the following season. Teams from all other divisions have the ability to move up two divisions based on results from challenge games, i.e. from Division 4 to Division 2.

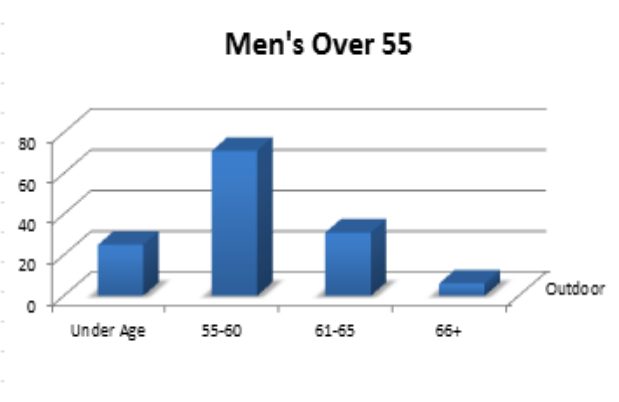
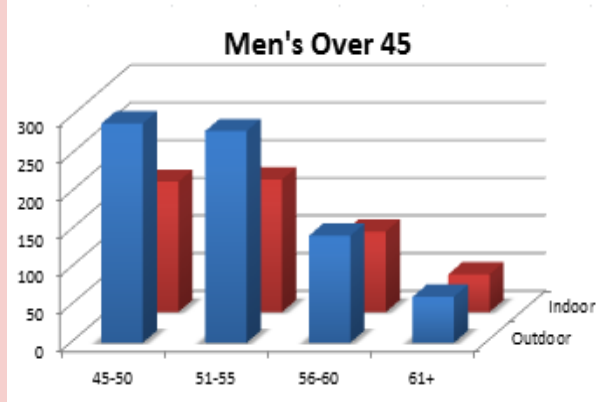
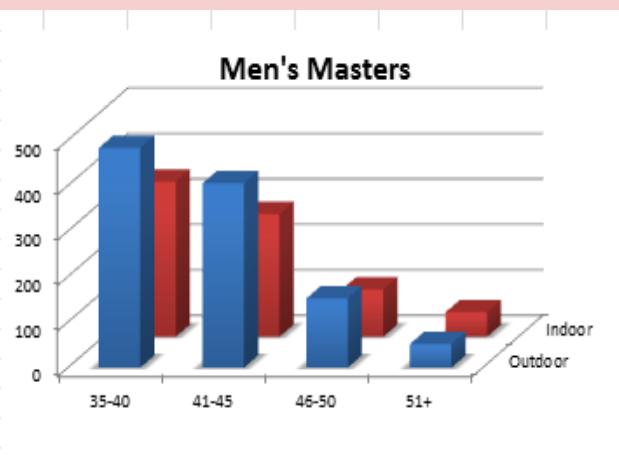
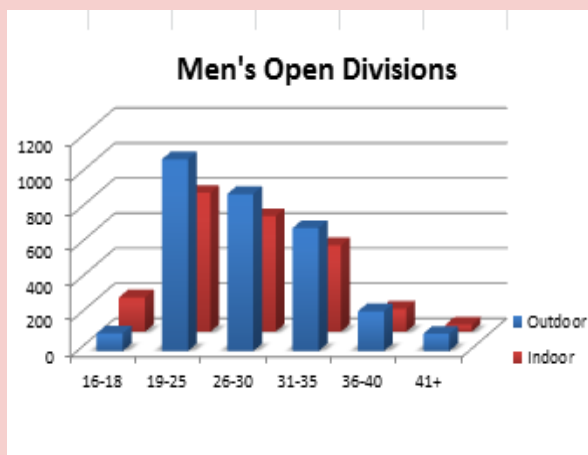
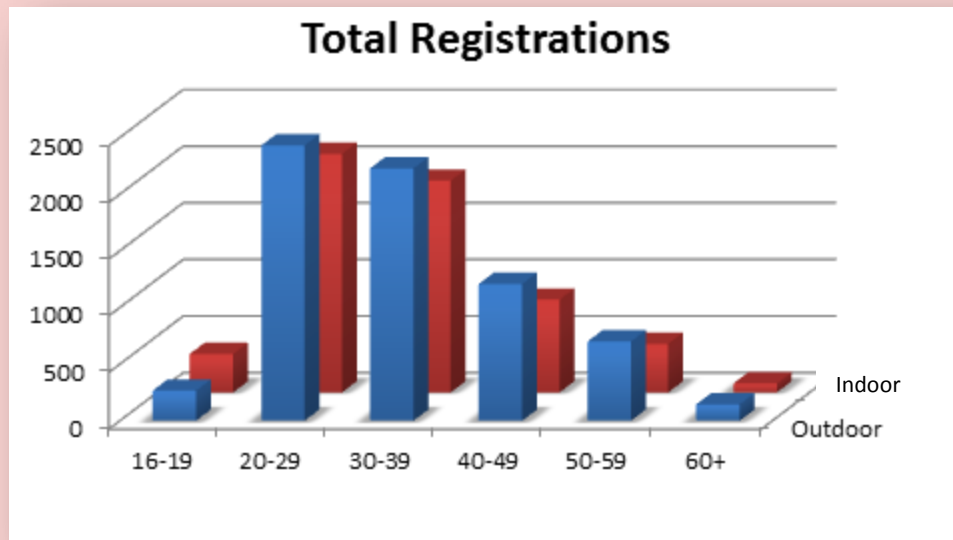
Age Demographics of the Men's Program

When making the move from youth soccer to adult programs players are also making the move from age based programs to those based upon prior performance. Within youth programs players and teams move within age groups, with the potential of under aged players playing into older age categories. Within adult programs players are not required to move playing categories as they age and often teams will be comprised of a diverse age range. Graduating U18 Tier 1 teams are predominantly comprised of 18 year olds. Within the AMSL the average player age in the men's division was 26 in 2012. Teams in adult programs will often supplement their roster with new players however; rarely will an entire team change over between seasons.

While the greatest majority of U19 players start in lower divisions in CUSA, U19 aged players did comprise 7.5% of Division 1 in 2015 with 21 registered players between 10 teams. This is in contrast to the U23 players comprising 40% of the AMSL membership, 31% of Premier and 25% of Division 1. This would be consistent with the time referenced as being required to adjust to the style of adult game and the required physical size to compete. Add to the fact that within U18 the entire program averages 30 teams over the past few years. CUSA Open Men's Division ranges between 123 to 140 teams, all of which have the opportunity to register U19 players.

Co-Ed Program – *Just for Kicks*

Calgary Co-Ed Rec Soccer was first introduced by the Calgary Soccer Federation (CSF) in the summer of 2002. During this time, the break between the Indoor and Outdoor month's left unused Indoor field space throughout the city of Calgary and allowed for the Introduction of Co-Ed soccer during the summer months. Creating the Co-Ed program allowed for adults (18+) to learn and enjoy the game of soccer in a fun, social and recreational environment.

Calgary United Soccer Association (CUSA) launched its inaugural winter season in 2009 with a total of 75 teams participating. In 2012, CUSA completed its full amalgamation of the Co-Ed program and as a result has grown to 160 teams annually combined between the winter and summer indoor and outdoor programs offered.

We strive for adult players to have fun on and off the field and creates a social atmosphere for players to have fun and learn the game of soccer. It remains the only Alberta Soccer Association (ASA) sanctioned Co-Ed Soccer league in Calgary and the only league with CSA certified officials.

Calgary Co-Ed recently added the Outdoor 7v7 program in 2015, where teams compete at the Calgary Soccer Centre on smaller artificial turf fields with field dimensions and nets similar to what is offered to the youth Under-12 program offered by Calgary Minor Soccer Association. At the end of each season, the top team within the group wins the divisional finalist and the team with the best Fair Play is awarded the Fair Play winner.

Recently introduced to the Summer and Winter Indoor programs was the promotion and relegation format, similar to what is offered by CUSA to its Men's and Women's program. The top 2 teams in each division are promoted to the next higher division, while the bottom 2 teams within each division are relegated to the next lowest division.

During the season, teams compete in a regular season format, while finishing off the season with 2 play-off games. The top 4 teams in each division compete for the divisional winner, while the bottom teams participate in 2 friendly matches based on their rankings within the season. The team in each division with the best Fair Play wins the Fair Play award. A unique feature to the Indoor program is that each division title is named after countries from around the world.

Co-Ed Fair Play – *My Game is Fair Play*

Fair play is a fundamental part of the game of soccer. It represents the positive benefits of playing by the rules, using common sense and respecting fellow players, referees, opponents and fans. FIFA created the "My Game is Fair Play" slogan to promote playing by the rules, being sportsmanlike, and showing respect for referees, teammates, opponents and fans. It is an easy to remember slogan that all players should abide by, on and off the field of play.

Calgary Co-Ed followed in the footsteps of Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) to promote the famous "My Game Is Fair Play" slogan by creating the Fair Play Award. The Fair Play Award is awarded to the team with the highest Fair Play points in each division that represents playing by the rules, being sportsmanlike, showing respect to opponents, referees and teammates. Winner of this award are based on their total points accumulated throughout the season + half of their total Fair Play Points.

Fair Play Points are earned during each game rated by the referee on a scale from zero (0) to ten (10). Factors throughout the season such as yellow or red cards received by team officials/players, forfeitures may affect overall Fair Play ratings. Teams are expected to earn at least 7 Fair Play Points per game over the course of the season.

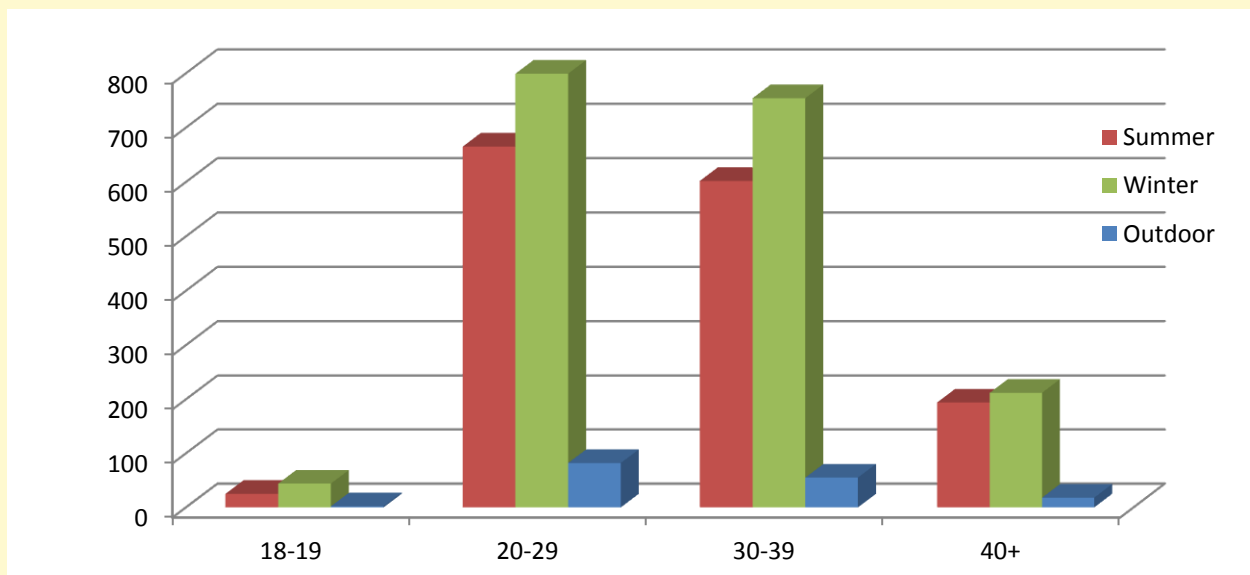

For the first time since 2009, CUSA ran a Futsal program as the Copa Futsal Program became full members of the Association. With this change the league can qualify to send an Alberta representative to the National Championship. Although many of the registered teams showed interest in attending the Championships, the Futsal organizing committee decided to not send any teams, citing the unknown skill levels. After an exciting season, this decision will be re considered for future seasons.

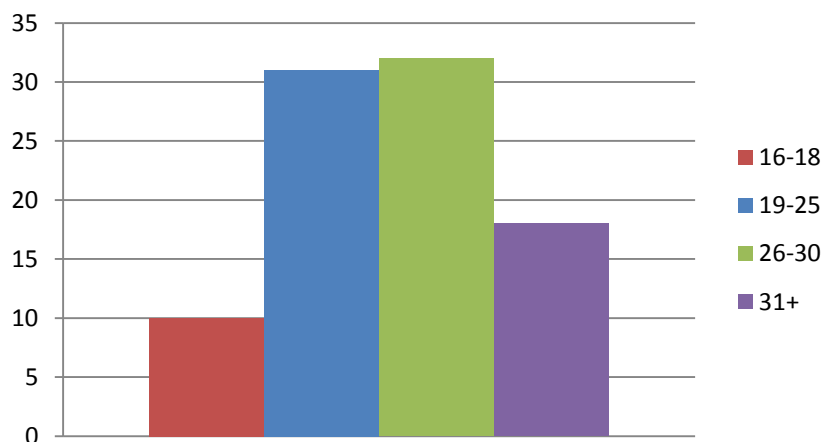
Futsal is similar to soccer but vastly different. The ball is smaller and has less of a bounce which helps players work on their ball control skills. The game is played with 5 players, including the goalkeeper, and 23 minute halves. The last 2 minutes of the second half is stop time and teams get one-30 second time-out per half. Another major difference is that a goalkeeper may only touch the ball once per possession which creates helps create an offensive styled game.



The Canadian National Futsal Club Championships are played on hard courts, typically using basketball court sizes. To help prepare the competitive teams, league play in 2017-2018 was split between gymnasiums at the Genesis Centre and Ambrose University.

6 Men's teams registered for a 10 game regular season before playoffs. Footy FC became league champions after beating FC Smash Bros in a thrilling 9 to 7 final. The Futsal Program also set up exhibition games for Women's teams to try out Futsal and create interest for a program moving.

Age Demographics

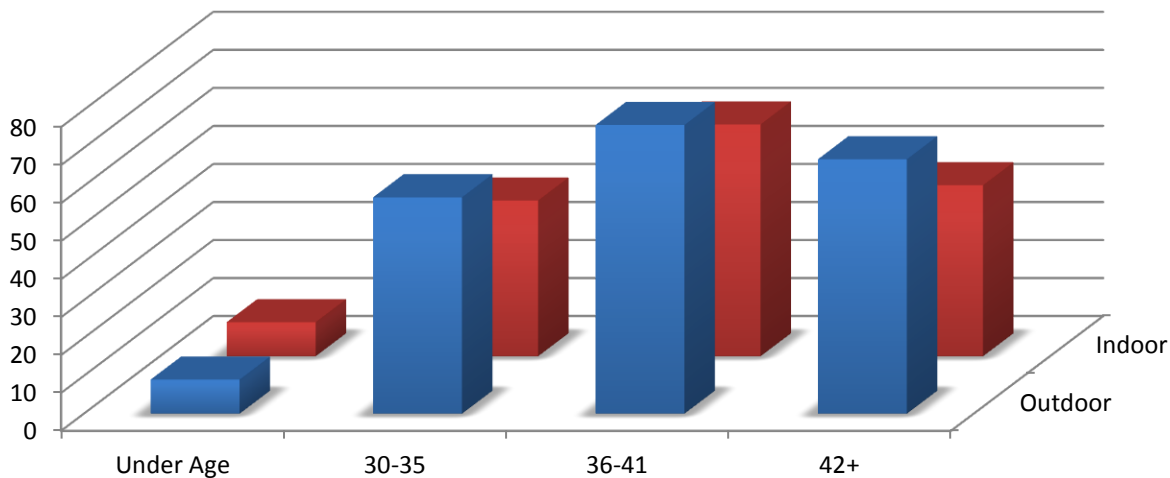


Women's Program

CUSA expanded their programs in the Outdoor 2016 season to include a Women's Classics (Over 30) division. The new program gave female players in Calgary and area a new league to play in. 9 Classics teams were entered into the new program in the Outdoor season and 8 teams made up the initial division in the Indoor 2016-2017 season.

CUSA offered divisions for the Open and Over 40 age groups. Although enough teams did register into the Open Division to make up a division, the skill level between the teams was considered too great to run a competitive league. Growth in these age groups is expected in future seasons.

CUSA has worked with the registered teams to help grow the program. One example is the grandfathering of underage players. It was requested that teams could register up to 2 underage players who are at least 27 years or older. This is similar to how the Over 45 division was started and how the Over 55 division currently is. Over the seasons, the minimum age will increase until the age is 30.



The Classics teams have had success at the Provincial level. CUSA has sent 5 teams to the Outdoor and Indoor competitions, and all 5 have returned with medals. Phoenix Rebels took Bronze and Silver in the top division, Classics Major. Alliance won a regional qualifier over a non-CUSA team before taking Gold in the Outdoor Classics Premier tier. Finally Revolution FC earned a Silver medal in both the Classics Premier Outdoor and Indoor competitions.

Alberta Major League

The Alberta Major Soccer League (AMSLS) started as an idea from Adrian Newman, Bill Malone and Mike Traficante to start a provincial-wide league to help Alberta teams prepare and compete at Provincial and National Championships. The league is now entering its 25th season. The men's program started play in 1992 and the women's program began in 1993. The top teams from Calgary, Edmonton, Red Deer and Lethbridge compete for the chance to represent Alberta at Canada Soccer Association's National Club Championships.

Alberta has captured 16 National Championships, between the men's and women's leagues, including 7 men's championships. In the past 10 years, Calgary men's teams have claimed 6 league titles and Callies Major won the National Championship in 2007 and 2008.

The AMSLS league play season runs from May to September with the Provincial Championships held as the marquee event in Alberta Soccer's Senior Soccer Fest over the September Long Weekend.

United Soccer League's Premier Development League (USL PDL)



The **Calgary Storm** entered the 2001 United Soccer Leagues Premier Development League (USL PDL) as apart of a three team expansion, bringing the number of teams to 44. The team took home the Regular Season title and finished runner-up to the league champions Westchester Flames after the playoffs.

The USL PDL was the 4th division within the USL and the Storm moved to the 4th division A-League. They played 3 more seasons, known as the **Mustangs** in their last season. The Storm only qualified for the playoffs once more, losing in the first round.



Calgary Foothills Football Club began in 2014 within the USL PDL. In only their second full season in the PDL **Calgary Foothills FC** have had a Cinderella season. They were voted to only have a 4% chance of winning the Northwestern division. A division that includes the Seattle Sounders U23 and Portland Timbers U23, whom they beat both in regular season play enroute to winning the Northwest division. **Foothills FC** then beat Seattle Sounders, for the third time in nine days, in the first round of play offs to qualify for the Western Conference finals.



They won the Western Conference beating FC Golden State and then powerhouse FC Tuscon, and made the final four. **Foothills FC** moved on to beat the Ocean City Nor'Easters in New Jersey, in the final four to make the PDL final. **Calgary Foothills FC** made the finals of the Premier Development League championship vs. Michigan Bucks in Pontiac, Michigan where they lost in an 3-2 heartbreak.

The Black Cup is the oldest soccer trophy in Calgary. The first competition for the Black Cup was held in 1914. The Calgary Caledonian Soccer Club has been the most successful club in the tournament, winning the trophy 25 times throughout the tournament's history.

The tournament format is a single-elimination format and is held in September following the completion of Provincials. This tournament is the only opportunity for AMSL, Premier and Division 1 teams to compete for a City Cup which makes this competition one of the toughest to win. Any registered Outdoor team in Calgary United Soccer is eligible to participate.

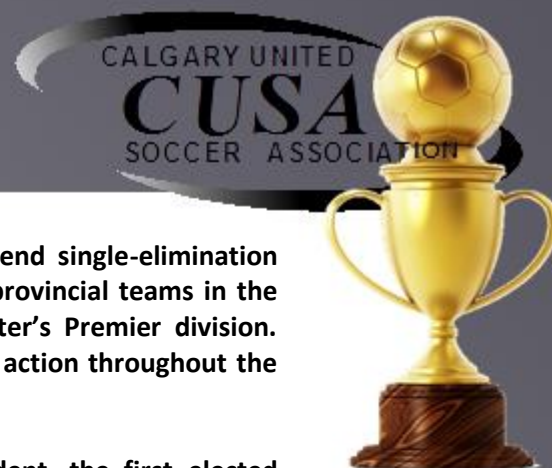

The competition is named after a past Calgary United Soccer President, the first elected following the amalgamation of Calgary Soccer and United Soccer. Tony played with Juventus in the Men's Open Premier Division and later in the Master's Division with many from the same team. Tragically Tony passed away while in Mexico in October 1996.

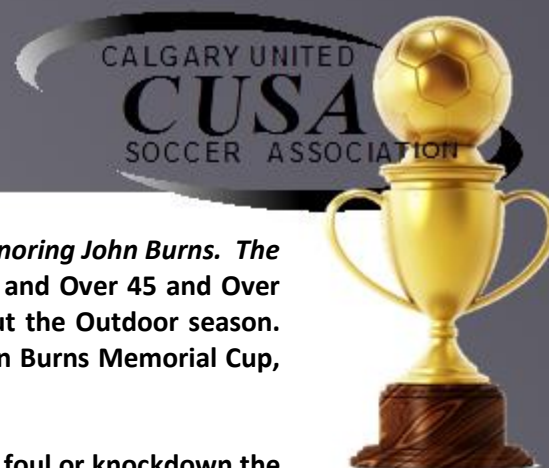

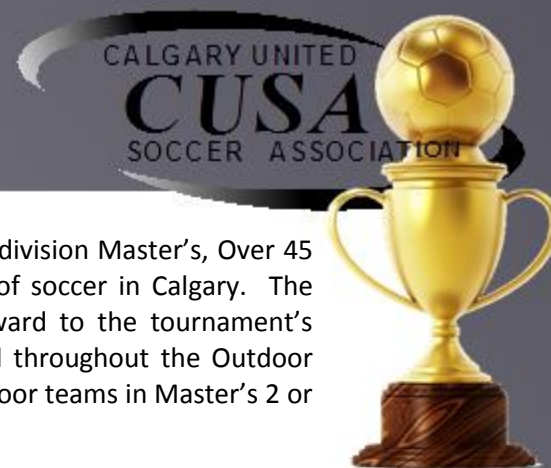

The Kaiser Cup started in 2008 as an Over 55 tournament in recognition for Bernie Kaiser, who, at the time, was CUSA's oldest active player. Bernie last played in the tournament in 2012. The competition, prior to 2014, was open for Over 55 players in the Over 45 divisions to register a team to vie for the trophy. The 2012 and 2013 editions of the tournament used a round robin format and the team with the most points won the Kaiser Cup. Due to the Calgary floods, the 2013 tournament was cancelled mid-season and no champion was determined.

The Kaiser Cup was only offered to registered Over 55 league play teams after CUSA started offering a division in 2014. Once league play had finished, the top teams in the standings competed for the coveted Kaiser Cup. Southside Rangers O55 became the first Over 55 team to win the Kaiser Cup, followed by Selects O55 in 2015.

The Calgary Nations Cup Tournament began in 2006 in memory of the late Davinder Singh Kajla. This annual tournament has seen 36 different nations compete for the *Davinder Singh Kajla Memorial Cup*. Competing teams will represent nations, and building their rosters with players who are from those nations or have heritage ties back to their grandparents. The goal behind the tournament is to expand knowledge and excitement around soccer and to keep young adults engaged in building a community that recognizes diversity and works together.

This tournament has become the must see soccer event of the summer and highlights diversity, cultural awareness and sportsmanship amongst players, fans and nations. The Nations Cup has also had a global span outside of Calgary and Alberta. A Fijian newspaper ran a story about the tournament after Team Fiji claimed their first Nations Cup victory in 2013.

Over the years, the Nations Cup has offered four different divisions. The Open Division allows for players aged 16 and older to compete, and showcases some of the best soccer talent in the area. The Players aged 35 and older can sign up for the Master's Division and shows the legacy of many nations. The Over 45 Division highlights that age is not an issue when representing your country. The Women's Division displays the growth of premier female soccer. Co-Ed and Over 55 divisions could also be offered in the future to align with all the programs CUSA currently offers.

Indoor Nations Cup

The Boxers, Bras and Beerfest is best known for its long tradition of players, referees and coaches wearing boxers and/or bras over their uniforms throughout the tournament. The team that dresses the best during the tournament is awarded the “Best Dressed Team” award.



Originally, when the BBB was first introduced to the Co-Ed program in 2004, it was limited to the first 16 teams to register with Calgary Co-ed, due to limits on field availability. Throughout the years the 16 team maximum was eliminated and extended to unlimited registration due to field availability and the growing interest in the tournament.

During the 2016 tournament, a total of 16 teams took part in the event. Teams were divided into the following categories based on their skill level and/or registered league play team

Each team played in a total of 4 games over the two day event with 2 games on Friday, September 30th and 2 games (including finals) Saturday October 1st. During the event we saw some unique team outfits such as a tie dye completed uniforms, tutus, and a full team of smurf players with matching hats.

The 13th Annual Boxers, Bras and Beerfest will be held on Friday, September 29th to Saturday, September 30th at the Calgary Soccer Centre.

Discipline Report

CUSA is committed to delivering a competitive, fun and SAFE soccer experience for its members. This means striking a balance between ensuring that players are able to compete in the programs within the laws of the game and application of sanctions that are sufficient to deter undesirable actions on or around the pitch.



Discipline Committee:

Over the course of 2016 so far we held 21 discipline committee hearing evenings. This is when players dispute the initial decision given out by the Discipline Coordinator, or sometimes in certain circumstances when players must attend a hearing as compulsory. Our committee is made up of three people who volunteer their time:

1. An experienced Chairperson, who is often still playing or involved in the game in some capacity.
2. An experienced referee/official, who can offer their insight from a referee's perspective.
3. A member at large; this can be any responsible individual from any club within our system.

We seek to make this committee as diverse as possible, so that it is mutually beneficial for both the player and the league. We continue to recruit new, responsible members the opportunity to sit on our Committee as a Member-at-Large so that they can help in the decision-making process as well as learning more about how we operate, in the hope that they can feedback to their clubs about the work we do and the standards we set. We had 19 different Discipline Committee members throughout the year, including 6 who hadn't appear on the committee before. We continue to have a proactive approach in engaging with teams and players which helps us to improve relationships.

We have also invited in several other teams to our committee in an unofficial capacity; for example when we see behavioral patterns emerging or when they are due to play a team against which there have been problems during previous games. The teams seem to have responded well to this pro-active approach; they are able to voice their views and our committee are able to impart advice to help the teams in their future conduct.

Referee Management Operations Committee

The Referee Management Operation Committee (RMOC), is an operational, joint committee of the Calgary soccer associations (CMSA, CWSA, and CUSA).

The mandate of RMOC is:

- To support the development of referees in Calgary
- To set game ratings and referee ratings for all referees assigned by the Calgary Referee Scheduler
- To set referee payment rates, subject to the approval of the Leagues, and facilitate remuneration of referees.
- To schedule referees
- To establish, manage, and monitor the contracts of the Referee Scheduler and Referee Payments Co-ordinator.
- To recommend to ASA appointments for the Referee Development Committee
- To recommend to ASA appointments for regional or national training

In the past twelve months the Referee Management Operations Committee has continued to develop certain areas:

- Recruited 2 new well-respected Referee Representatives
- Changed the Mentorship form to enable more in-depth mentoring
- Directing mentoring funds only to the Referees who need it.
- Amended the local procedure on game assignment and eliminated the trading of assignments between officials.
- Produced a database which we gather information on all Referees which will assist in the rating process.
- Had a detailed review of all referee ratings and adjusted them accordingly, completed between each season.
- Continued the mentoring program into the Outdoor 2016 season
- Continued to offer on-field education sessions in partnership with the Calgary District Soccer Referees Association (CDSRA)

RMOC reviews twice annually the local ratings assigned to officials along with the local game ratings. As part of this review process the team submissions for Referee Evaluations are taken into consideration. Without this feedback, be it for a good or a poor performance by the official, RMOC has only limited mentorship and assessment reports to consider as the determinant for a referee's rating.





The Calgary District Soccer Referees Association (CDSRA) is an organization for the development and improvement of referees. It is the only organization that regularly offers post entry level training of referees in District 4 (Calgary) and surrounding districts (Foothills, Airdrie Big Country). The CDSRA currently has approximately 100 members.

Twice in every month and year-round the CDSRA offers integrated referee training classes (IRT) in Calgary for its members. These classes are taught by ASA instructors and we are lucky enough to have 2 CSA National Instructors within our association who have access to the latest FIFA and CSA training modules. This gives our members the best possible training available to any referees worldwide and the better the referees we have in the soccer community, of course means the betterment of soccer in general for CUSA and its member teams. This IRT training is not just limited to CDSRA members, any referee who is registered to referee CUSA games can attend up to 2 sessions for free to see what it is all about before deciding to join!



The CDSRA is a non-profit organization and the biggest percentage of our modest membership fee goes into the cost of the IRT training. Our biggest challenge is arranging field time for the IRT classes. This is because of the cost and time slots available on suitable fields that are accessible for all referees. CUSA has been very supportive of the CDSRA in past years by kindly providing this field time free of charge from their own fields like Broadview or from spare time slots at the Calgary Soccer Centre – without this kind of support from CUSA, the IRT training sessions would not be able to be the success that they have been and for this, the CDSRA and all referees in Calgary that attend these sessions are truly grateful!!

The CDSRA would like to take this opportunity to thank CUSA for their support and look forward to working together for many future years for the development of Soccer in Calgary.

Giving Back

Calgary Street Soccer is a registered non-profit organization formed to help homeless men and women get their lives back on track through the power of sport, specifically soccer. The benefits of playing a team sport are physical, emotional and psychological.



The initiative started in 2006 and has led teams to the Homeless World Cup. Over 300 individuals have been apart of programs in Vancouver, Montreal, Toronto, and, of course, Calgary. The Homeless World Cup has been held annually since 2003. Canada first competed in 2004 but has never finished in the top 4 at any tournament. Calgary hosted the National Championship in 2008, which is used to select the individuals who represent Canada at the World Cup.

By providing the facilities, equipment, and structure for a relatively inexpensive team sport like soccer, the Calgary Street Soccer offers a positive, character building experience that players can carry into the rest of their lives.

CUSA members contribute \$10 from each team registration to this program.

KidSport Calgary is the largest of the 178 KidSport chapters working across Canada. Its mission is to make sure no child is on the sidelines because they cannot afford sport registration fees. According to a 2014 CIBC national survey, a third of Canadian children cannot afford to participate in organized sports due to high registration fees. Alberta has the highest costs of children's sport in Canada; on average, Alberta parents spend \$1,428 per child each year to participate in sports.

Soccer is the most supported sports, helping 1,574 kids and donating \$403,325 in 2015. Hockey is the next largest sport which KidSport supports with 485 kids in 2015.

The Calgary chapter of KidSport was founded in 1995 and is an amateur athletic association rather than a registered charity. It is eligible to issue donation receipts.

CUSA members contribute \$20 from each team registration to this program.



Financial Review

On June 5, 2017 the chartered accounting firm of Lockhart LLP completed an audit on Calgary United Soccer Association for the year ended March 31, 2017.

CUSA's financial decisions are based on building a strong foundation from which the league can invest into the development of infrastructure, officials and coaches to deliver a diverse array of affordable programs to its members. CUSA continues to devote its use of funds to on-field activities, with over 74% of all expenditures disbursed directly to on-field expenses excluding administrative items.

From planning to execution the Board oversees the annual preparation of the financial budget, financial controls, practices and policies. There is a strong focus on meeting the operational needs of the Association while continuing to provide the resources for the growth of the sport by reinvesting future surpluses in the development of soccer in our city.

We support automation in the delivery of its services and has seen success in eliminating redundancies and increasing efficiencies. For instance, CUSA's steadfast commitment to best banking practices has seen better than average returns on investment certificates and stronger results when combined with annual reviews and favorable reductions of credit card processing fees. 2016-2017 saw a significant one time event - revenues include a one time donation from the Calgary Soccer Federation in the amount of \$152,885.34.

CUSA remains committed to attain financial sustainability by using a well-managed financial system and through building alliances in the community. Obtaining increased third party partnership revenues remain a goal of the association. Past year results saw CUSA establishing partnerships with a growing number of companies that provide products and services to our members. Fishers Soccer Shack and

Sport plays a significant role in the economic, as well as the social life of communities, by providing jobs, boosting tourism in large and small communities alike, contributing to neighbourhood economic renewal and enhancing skills and productivity in the workplace. The Conference Board of Canada reports that Canadian households spent \$15.8 billion on sport in 2004, or 2.18 percent of total household spending which translates into \$1,963 in sport spending per Canadian household. Canada's sport sector employs 2% of all jobs in Canada,

The True Sport Report 2015

ProActive Health Group provide value added benefits for our membership. The past three summers CUSA has employed a summer student to assist with improving the delivery of competitions, this position is 75% grant funded. CUSA qualifies for a Casino license approximately every couple of years. With providing volunteers to work at the event, in turn, CUSA receives gaming funds that are disbursed directly to on-field expenses. Grants fund the Board's efforts on implementing the next phase of CUSA's Strategic Plan.

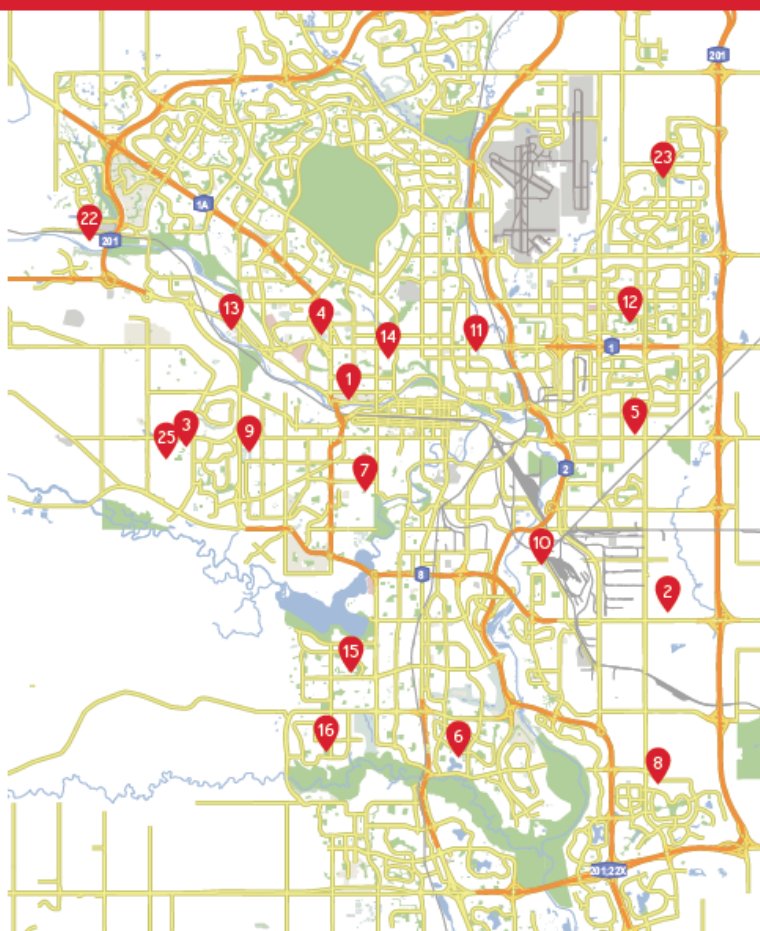

New Brighton Athletic Park

It features four turf fields, a baseball diamond, change rooms and playgrounds. Construction of New Brighton Athletic Park began in 2014 with funding from Alberta's Municipal Sustainability Initiative.

"This is the first outdoor athletic facility that we have built in the city of Calgary in 28 years, if you can believe it," Mayor Naheed Nenshi said.



The facility opened for use June 25th and after only a couple games closed until mid August. CUSA did play 40 games at the complex between August 17 and end of September. It has remained closed for the beginning of 2017 as various construction issues are addressed. The venue is scheduled to reopen July 1st, 2017.

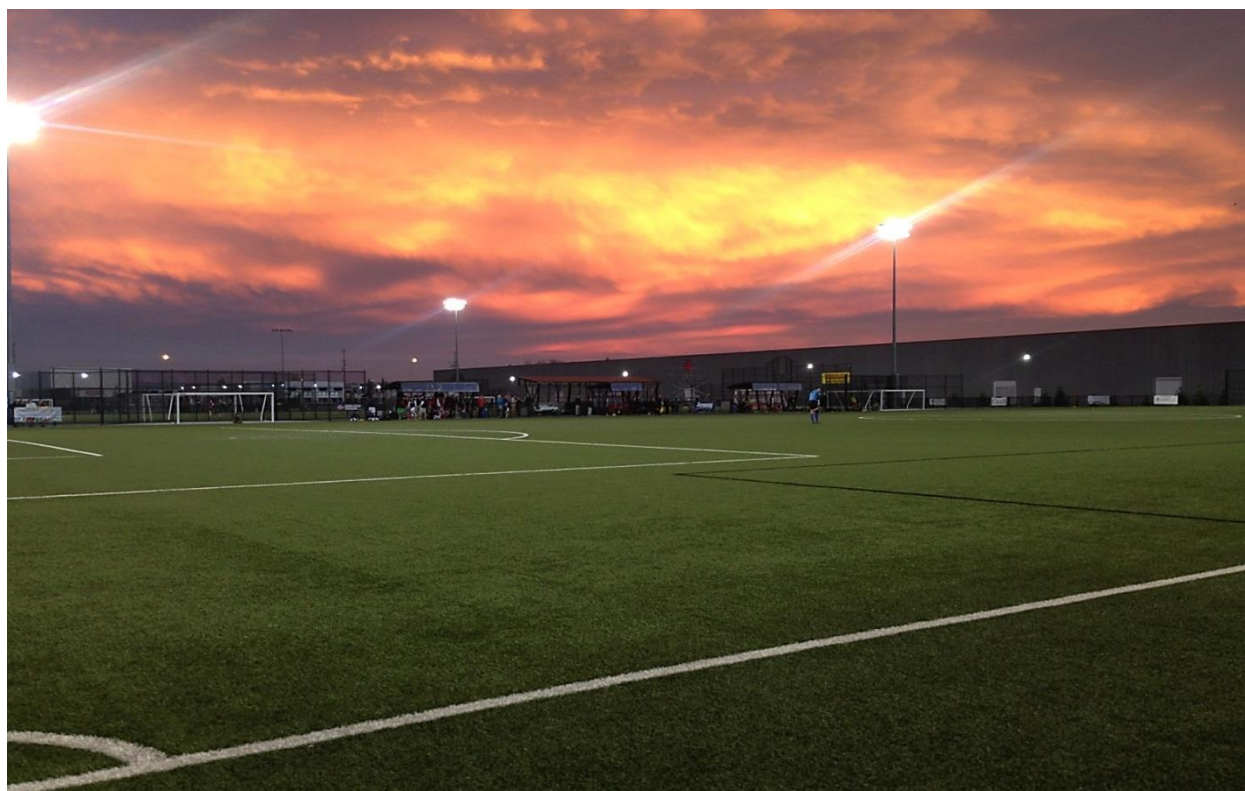
