This year, on September 15, 2020, we celebrated the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of our Association. CUSA was founded as an amalgamation of Calgary Men's Soccer League and Calgary United Soccer. In its inaugural season, CUSA operated leagues for approximately 30 teams and 600 players. We should all be proud of the strength of our Association and of our growth.



This past year is a year we will remember for a very long time as our lives and society had to face something, we never even could have imagined with the shutdown due to COVID-19. It meant that our 2019-20 Indoor Season ended abruptly and the suspension of the 2020 Outdoor. As we wait to resume full operations, it was great to see all our members respect the situation and follow the guidelines while patiently waiting a return to the pitch.

CUSA is always looking for new ways to give back to the community and especially within the soccer community in our city as soccer can be used as a positive social change. We also were able to provide some kids of this great program the opportunity to escort the finalists at both the Indoor and Outdoor Nations Cup.

We are very proud to work with the Drop-In Centre and the Calgary Police Service in presenting the Goodwill Match at our Indoor Nations Cup. The Goodwill Match started September 16, 2017 on a field in Bridgeland and has become a must-see event at the Indoor Nations Cup with hundreds of fans to cheer on the teams. CUSA is also a proud supporter of the Woodall Cup that took place in June 2019 between the Edmonton Police Service and the Calgary Police Service in remembrance of Constable Daniel Woodall who lost his life in the line of duty. We are looking forward to continuing our support of the above matches and for new opportunities to give back to the community.

As we celebrate the year ahead and our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary we look forward to the transformation of the new building at the Broadview field reflecting the status of Broadview being the best pitch in the city. The building will be barrier free, sporting a high quality design and clean attractive look while offering our members upgraded dressing rooms and showers, an officials room, and family friendly public washrooms. It is our hope that our members will embrace this facility as a long term hub to be active, connect and develop a shared sense of belonging. We will build on each season as opportunities and AHS/ASA guidelines allow. We will always have a home for our membership choosing to take some time away from sport. # 2020 Accomplishments

## Strong Communication and Brand Awareness

- The Association launched an updated, mobile friendly website in April 2019.
- CUSA was successful in receiving a Digital Strategy for Youth Grant that enabled the league to hire a Social Media and Marketing Interim. The Association launched an Instagram page (Oct 2019) and developed an overall Social Media strategy and presence.
- Completed audit of CUSA branded materials to ensure alignment with Brand Guidelines.
- Continued strong focus on infrastructure and facilities planning.
- Participated in MRU Career Fair promoting Association, Student Employment and opportunities for officiating and playing.
- The 2019 AGM in June was sponsored by Chartwell Retirement Facilities.

## Grow and Diversify Services

- The format of Coed League was changed to combine teams of similar skill within larger divisions: Competitive, Intermediate; Recreational and Ultra Recreational.
- CUSA continued to support local training of officials through the provision of Broadview for on field work.
- 8v8 Indoor program grew from 34 to 55 teams in its second full season. CUSA worked closely with ASA to enhance the quality of the game through the provision of two officials.
- Calgary player, Nico Gonzales, was invited to the National Futsal camps in 2019.
- Internazionale FC captured their first Futsal Provincial Championship March 9<sup>th</sup> just 4 days prior to CSA suspension of all soccer programs in Canada.
- Nations Cup Tournaments remain popular with strong representation from a diverse range of teams for the competition. The 2020 Indoor Nations Cup was cancelled after 34 teams had registered for the event. The Outdoor Tournament could not be offered with COVID restrictions in place.

## Strengthen Association

- Government compliance requirements and other key obligations effectively met.
- Auditors returned an unqualified audit opinion. The Association received *Good* rating for financial management from City of Calgary for 8<sup>th</sup> consecutive year.
- CUSA recognizes the valuable contribution post secondary students can provide to Calgary's amateur athletic scene. We are committed playing a role in this development; as such providing jobs over the past 15 plus years playing key roles with operational support, event coordination and marketing of our programs and services.



# 2021 Areas of Focus

## Strong Communication and Brand Awareness

- Continue to work with web developer for additional features and enhancement to platform.
- Focus on provision of timely and current updates in the evolving world of COVID and the impacts to the sport and league.

## Grow and Diversify Services

- Implementation of the Modified Return to Play program for CUSA Membership.
- Demand for facilities is greater than supply capacity. This emphasizes the need to optimize use of existing facilities, and strategically plan and invest in future sporting facility developments and renewal of existing facilities. To ensure that future decisions are made through fact based business case CMSA, CWSA and CUSA will launch a city wide survey of Calgary community on soccer and its future needs and demands.

## Strengthen Association

- Assess internal needs to strengthen connection to and support of existing CUSA Community.
- Celebrate 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of CUSA through the announcement of four \$1000 Scholarships.
- Review of sport governance best practices and documentation.
- Further develop workforce skills and capabilities.
- Continue to offer training for new officials, mentorship for existing and strive to increase the pool of strong, qualified officials.

# Programs

## Men's Program



Alberta Major Soccer  
League

The Men's Programs offer competitive league play for players as young as 16 years of age. The Program also offers age restricted divisions for older players to solely play with others of their age. The minimum age in the Open Division is 16 years of age, players in the Master's Division must be at least 35, and CUSA offers divisions for Over 45 and 55 age groups as well.

CUSA offers a comprehensive range of leagues and competitions to provide a platform for players of all ages, 16 and above, and of all skill levels. On top of our existing leagues - Open-aged from AMSL through to Division 6, Masters (Over 35), Over 45, Over 55, we followed a successful return to CUSA's running of a Men's Futsal league with an increased division size, while also introducing a competitive Women's Futsal league for the first time.

The league structure is based on promotion and relegation. Teams earn their way into higher divisions through the previous season results. Top performing teams from the Premier, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> divisions of the Men's Open League and of the Masters Premier division qualify to compete in the provincial championships. Provincial Champions from the AMSL and Master's Elite Divisions qualify for the Canada Soccer National Club Championships.

In total we had teams competing in 25 Outdoor Divisions, 19 Indoor Divisions and 8 different City Cup competitions throughout the year. We continue to work with our teams to be flexible and forward-thinking by providing as many opportunities as possible for them to play soccer. Non-Boarded 8v8 league was

introduced in 2018, 34 teams across 5 divisions..

Newly registered teams in the Open Division are required to start in the lowest division. Those demonstrating strong performance during the season have the option to participate in the league's Promotional Challenge held at the end of each season. An undefeated team from Division 6 has the ability, through a series of challenge games, to earn a position in Division 3 for the following season. Teams from all other divisions have the ability to move up two divisions based on results from challenge games, i.e. from Division 4 to Division 2.

2019 saw the addition of the two CPL Reserve teams in Alberta, Cavalry FC Reserves and FC Edmonton Reserves, into the AMSL. The CPL Reserve Teams are excluded from the opportunity to attend Club Nationals and their addition to the league added more depth and competition to Alberta's highest level of amateur soccer.

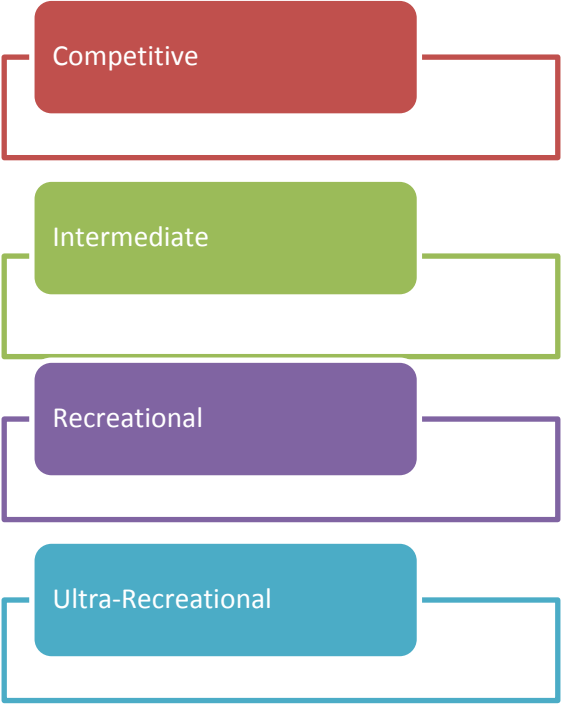




# Calgary COED Soccer Program

Calgary Coed Rec Soccer was first introduced by the Calgary Soccer Federation (CSF) in the summer of 2002. During this time, the break between the Indoor and Outdoor month's left unused Indoor field space throughout the city of Calgary and allowed for the Introduction of COED soccer during the summer months. Creating the Coed program allowed for adults (18+) to learn and enjoy the game of soccer in a fun, social and recreational environment

As part of the rebranding process the COED league is represented solely under the CUSA banner and website. In 2019 four separate divisions were offered. CUSA supported 43 teams in the 2019 COED Boarded season and 64 teams during the 2019-2020 COED Boarded Indoor season.



# Futsal Program

## Men's Division

This was the 4<sup>th</sup> successful season that Futsal has been incorporated into the CUSA programs. The program was previously known as the COPA Futsal league which became an Associate Member within CUSA prior to the Indoor 2016/17 season.

With the opportunity for a trip to Kingston to compete for a National Title the Men's Division in 2019-20 was contested by 8 competitive teams.

Ambrose University continued to be the main site for CUSA Futsal Games on Sunday and Monday nights while the Blue Gym at Vivo hosted Futsal Games on Saturday nights.



Provincial competition which ran from Mar 1- Mar 9, 2020 saw 6 teams battle for the right to represent CUSA and the province of Alberta at the Canadian Futsal National Championships in Kingston, Ontario. After capturing their third consecutive league title, Callies Progressive FC encountered a strong willed Internazionale team in the Provincial Championship final. Internazionale captured the Provincial title with a dramatic last second winner and would have represented Alberta at the Canadian Futsal National Championships, however due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the competition was unfortunately cancelled.

## National Exposure

In October and December 2019, Nicolas Gonzalez (Internazionale) was called up to the Canadian Futsal National team to participate in 2 three day training camps in Laval + Montreal, Quebec. The purpose of the training camps was to evaluate talent and prepare the national team for the 2020 Concacaf Futsal Championships to be contested in May 2020, with the top 4 teams advancing to the FIFA Futsal World Cup Lithuania 2020.

## Women's Division

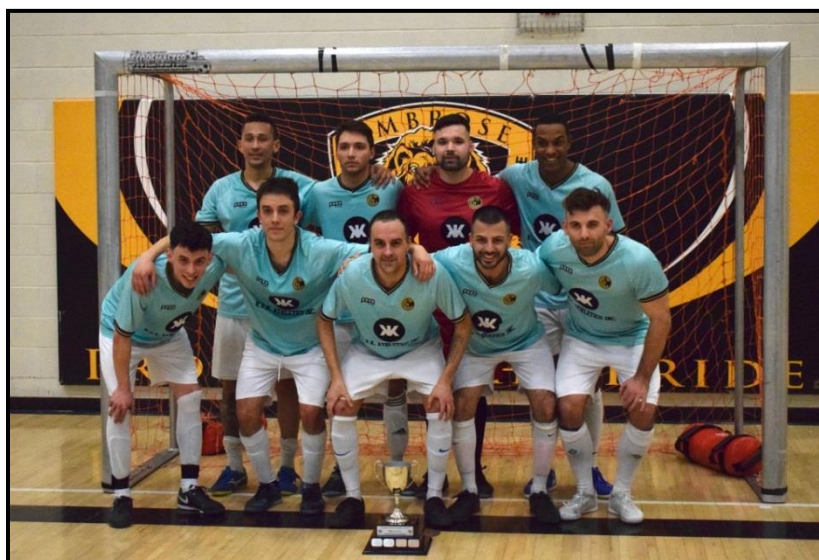

In a very closely contested final the CSJC Old Lady Trojans beat the SAIT Women's team in overtime, thereby denying SAIT a chance at a three-peat.

# Cups, Tournaments & Special Events

## Alberta Major League



The Alberta Major Soccer League (AMSLS) started as an idea from Adrian Newman, Bill Malone and Mike Traficante to start a provincial-wide league to help Alberta teams prepare and compete at Provincial and National Championships. The men's program started play in 1992 and the women's program began in 1993. The top teams from Calgary, Edmonton, Red Deer and Lethbridge compete for the chance to represent Alberta at Canada Soccer Association's National Club Championships.

Alberta has captured 17 National Championships, between the men's and women's leagues, including 7 men's championships. The AMSLS league play season runs from May to September with the Provincial Championships held as the marquee event in Alberta Soccer's Senior Soccer Fest over the September Long Weekend.

## COED Tournament

### BOXERS, BRAS AND BEERFEST

The 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Boxers, Bras and Beerfest (BBB) Tournament was held on the weekend of September 27-28, 2019 at the Calgary Soccer Centre.

The Boxers, Bras and Beerfest is best known for it's long tradition of players, referees and coaches wearing boxers and/or bras over their uniforms throughout the tournament. The team that dresses the best during the tournament is awarded the "Best Dressed Team" award.

Originally, when the BBB was first introduced to the Coed program in 2004, it was limited to the first 16 teams to register with Calgary Coed, due to limits on field availability. Throughout the years the 16 team maximum was eliminated and extended to unlimited registration due to field availability and the growing interest in the tournament.

During the 2019 tournament, a total of 8 teams took part in the event. Teams were randomly divided into two groups of 4. Each team played in a total of 4 games over the two day event with 2 games on Friday, September 27<sup>th</sup> and 2 games (including finals) Saturday the 28<sup>th</sup>. During the event we saw some unique team outfits such as Captain Underpants and a team dressed as "Man Chest Hair"

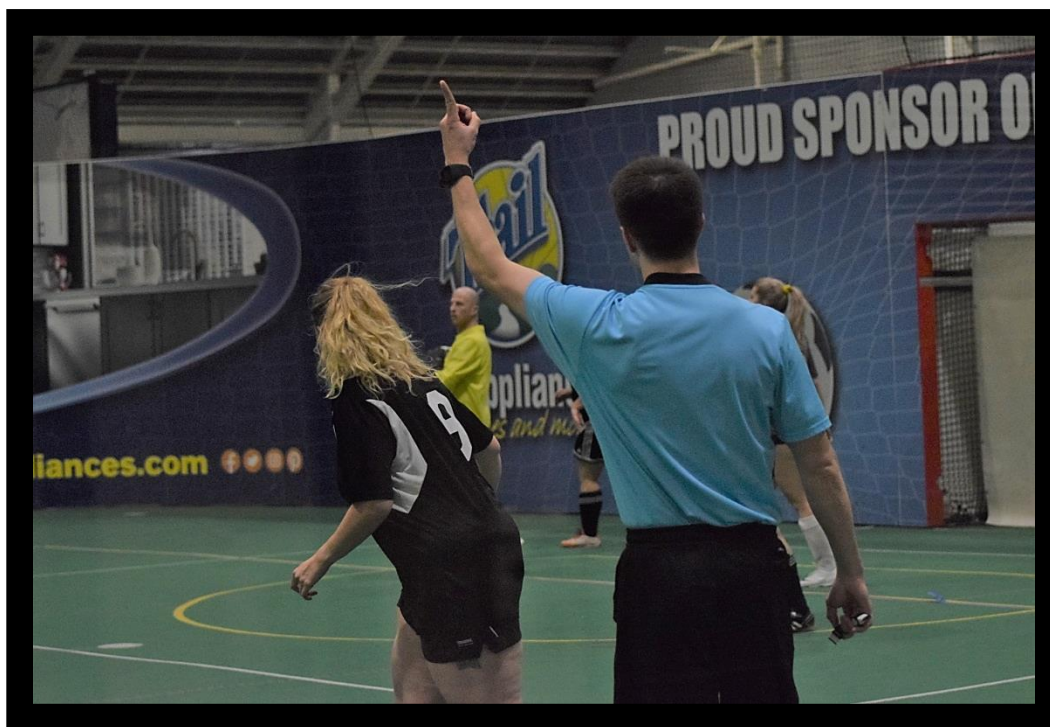
# 2020 Discipline Report

We respect our membership's right to appeal against a decision that they disagree with. We offer a weekly opportunity to attend a Discipline Hearing so that a player/coach/team is given the chance to voice their opinion. They appear before a Discipline Committee comprised of 3 volunteers, who give up their time to determine the appropriate outcome for the betterment of our Association.

We saw decreases across the board in comparison to last years' figures. Boarding saw a reduction, but a large part of that was due to more 8v8 games being played in the Indoor season, and there are no Boards to contend with in 8v8. Pleasing to see was less 'Offensive, Insulting, Abusive Language' red cards and only 4 Outdoor cases and zero Indoor cases which were sent to ASA, which are usually reserved for severe cases of being verbally or physically abusive of a referee. So hopefully that upward trend that we strive for towards more respect of officials continues.

### Referee Management Operations Committee

The Referee Management Operations Committee (RMOC) is an operational, joint committee of the Calgary soccer associations (CMSA, CWSA and CUSA).

RMOC are also driven by Seven Core Values in order to deliver a Referee service to the 3 Leagues in Calgary.

- Respect
- Empathy
- Fitness
- Evaluation
- Reliability
- Education
- Excellence

RMOC, the Scheduler and representatives from the 3 Leagues meet on a monthly basis to discuss and action any matters to help improve the officiating and communication between the leagues.

Tasks that we have accomplished during 2019 and early part of 2020:

### Referee Ratings

Referees ratings were reviewed with the use of :

- Mentorships
- Assessments
- Referees who are registered in the ASA Upgrade Program considerations were taken into account as they have to pass ASA written exams, Assessments and Fitness tests.
- League Referee Evaluations were reviewed on every game that referee was evaluated on and the scores were added up and then averaged out to come up with a percentage to assist the committee as to determine if the referee should have a rating upgrade, stay at level or downgraded.



## League & Team complaints & concerns

All of the concerns and complaints from the 3 Leagues were investigated by RMOC. There are a few ways the complaints were dealt with in accordance to the severity. Face to face meeting, ASA involvement, not scheduled for games for a certain league or all leagues, Rating downgrade, spot check or regular mentoring last of all removal from the schedule.

## Fitness Tests

In the past only ASA have run the Fitness Tests where it is mandatory for Regional and Provincial to pass the test in order to keep their ASA rating. The Fitness Test is not mandatory for District referees. For the first time ever ASA requested the District Referee Assistants to run Fitness tests as well. RMOC offered two sessions where 30 referees took part for mainly District referees in order for us to get a feel for that level as well. All of the results were entered into an RMOC data base and sent to ASA.

## Mentorships

114 Mentorships were completed during the 2019 Outdoor and Indoor season. The results of the Mentorship assists in the ratings procedure, helps build confidence and growth, supports referees who are entering an upgrade program it also concentrates on one on one training to an individual referee needs. We have had positive feedback from the teams when they see a Mentor at the game mentoring referees.

## Education

RMOC listed an Education curriculum where the topics meet the requirements of the Leagues.

- 8v8 implementation to referees with on field training

## Refresher courses

RMOC attended all the courses to update referees on league initiatives. CUSA's main initiative was the 8v8 implementation to referees with on field training

## Tournaments

Referee lists for tournaments were adjusted for referees showing potential, who were given the opportunity to referee in a Tournament(s)

## 3 Strike letters

Letters are sent out to referees as a notification when they are in breach of the 3 Strike policy. There are 19 infractions that are listed as requiring disciplinary action.

- **First Offense** – results in a warning letter from RMOC
- **Second Offense** – results in an restricted amount or level of games from the schedule
- **Third Offense** – results in an immediate, permanent removal from the schedule

3 Strike letters were sent out to individual referees for various infractions.



# Communications

The goal of our Social Media communications is to share information with CUSA membership and create a sense of community. With consideration to our rebranding, all updates are made with CUSA colours and logos as a launch point. Currently our community is connected with Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram. All information shared to our membership with these platforms is designed to deliver a sense of community through sharing game photos, CUSA stories, CUSA heritage and user generated content; and to keep members informed through timely updates.

Facebook serves our membership with information and association updates. In conjunction with our rebranding all communications occur under one page, and the decision to remove the COED stand alone page has been made. All stakeholders in the soccer community from the Canada Soccer Association, to Alberta Soccer Association and many others have a presence on Facebook which we collaborate with and share informational content to our membership.

Twitter serves to share our message to the local sports community, and while it isn't our focus we maintain a general presence there to be connected to sports, and the soccer community in Calgary.

Instagram - our main source of engagement with members – daily posts communicate membership updates, time lines of importance, office updates, and items of interest. Over time the membership has grown to trust Instagram as a source of communication, and engagement with CUSA. Members seek information from this source, and easily reach out to us with questions, or support us with our information sharing in the typical ways of liking, and sharing our content.

Brand presence has been reinforced in pictures and visuals using our branded colours, fonts, and story telling pictures. A file of branded pictures has been created for use to tell our story or share pertinent information. In addition, the use of the specific hashtags: #lovethethegameyyc, and #cusayyc accompany each post made on all our social media platforms. Recently #footyFriday as been used in our Instagram Stories to share items of humour, and random soccer related content. The purpose is to generate relatable and fun content our membership can count on each Friday.

Using Social Media enhances our presence in the local community of sport and soccer in a way which our members are accessing daily. We continue to increase followers on these platforms, and are known as trusted point of sharing appropriate information with our membership.

# Giving Back

CUSA 2019 Contribution: \$4,712

**Soccer Without Boundaries** is a grassroots volunteer group has grown into an innovative multicultural outreach program aimed at integrating new Canadians into their community. Soccer is something they all share, regardless of their culture, creed or nationality, and Soccer Without Boundaries is designed to bring them together. It breaks down barriers and lets children feel that they belong. It allows them to build self-esteem, develop leadership skills and strengthen social relationships through team work, fair play, and conflict resolution. It also provides their parents and families with a means to volunteer and get involved.

The program runs all year, in-door and outdoor, on the strength of its wonderful volunteers: coaches, assistant coaches, helpers and donated soccer gear (shin guards, shoes, balls). To help engage the program with CUSA Members the kids escorted the two finalists onto the pitch for the Championship Match for Nations Cup.

**KidSport Calgary** is the largest of the 178 KidSport chapters working across Canada. Its mission is to make sure no child is on the sidelines because they cannot afford sport registration fees. According to a 2014 CIBC national survey, a third of Canadian children cannot afford to participate in organized sports due to high registration fees. Alberta has the highest costs of children's sport in Canada; on average, Alberta parents spend \$1,428 per child each year to participate in sports.

The Calgary chapter of KidSport was founded in 1995 and is an amateur athletic association rather than a registered charity. It is eligible to issue donation receipts.





# Financial Review

On August 26, 2020 the independent external auditors of Lockhart LLP carried out the audit on Calgary United Soccer Association for the year ended March 31, 2020 in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

On March 13, 2020 the COVID-19 pandemic caused the cancellation of all soccer activities. At this time CUSA was forced to suspend the 2020 Outdoor season, refund any deposits received and issued refunds to our 2019-2020 Indoor season teams for an incomplete season.

Although the current economic climate in Calgary and Alberta is challenging, CUSA has maintained a strong financial position and is focusing its efforts on continued financial stability in these trying times. As diligent stewards of the funds and resources our members provided us, CUSA will continue to deliver exceptional programs to Calgarians.

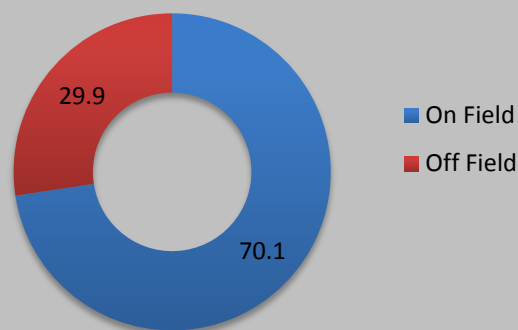
## Financial Highlights

### Total Revenue – 2.3M

There is a strong focus on meeting the operational needs of The Association while continuing to provide resources for the growth of the sport by reinvesting future surpluses in the development of infrastructure, officials and coaches to deliver a diverse array of affordable programs to its members.

- CUSA's main source of revenue is from team registration fees. Attracting third party partnership revenues remain a goal of the association. CUSA engages in partnerships to increase value to our members, create and sustain a vibrant, healthy and complete soccer community. We have established corporate partnership with Fishers Soccer Shack that provides discounted products and services to our members.
- CUSA has consistently demonstrated leadership, diversity and accessibility forging strategic relationships with community partners. Chartwell Retirement Residences was CUSA's named 2019 Annual General Meeting sponsor reducing the cost of hosting this event.
- Striving to sustain operations, the Association has taken a number of steps to access emergency funding including applications to the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy, Canada Emergency Business Account, Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance program and City of Calgary COVID relief funding.
- CUSA recognizes the valuable contribution post secondary students can provide to Calgary's amateur athletic scene. We are committed playing a role in this development; as such providing jobs over the past 15 plus years playing key roles with operational support, event coordination and marketing of our programs and services.
- Ability to leverage a growing principal on long term investment certificates into better rates of return.

Membership Fee Allocation

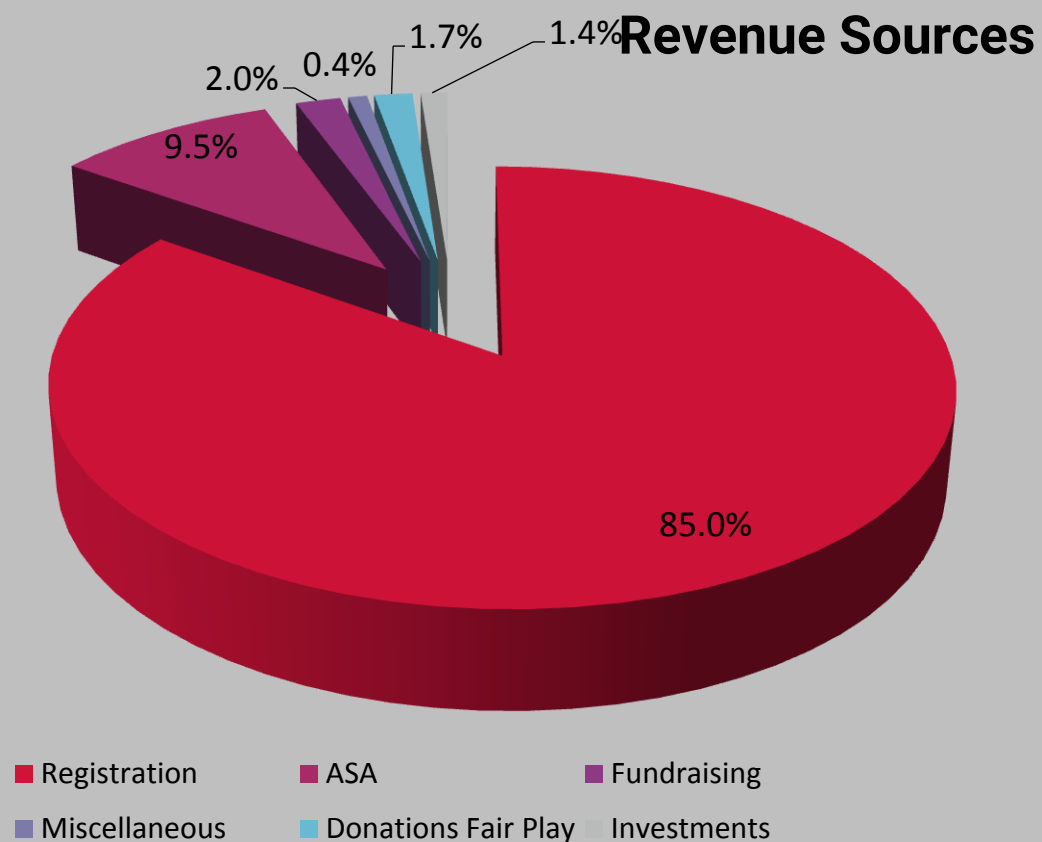


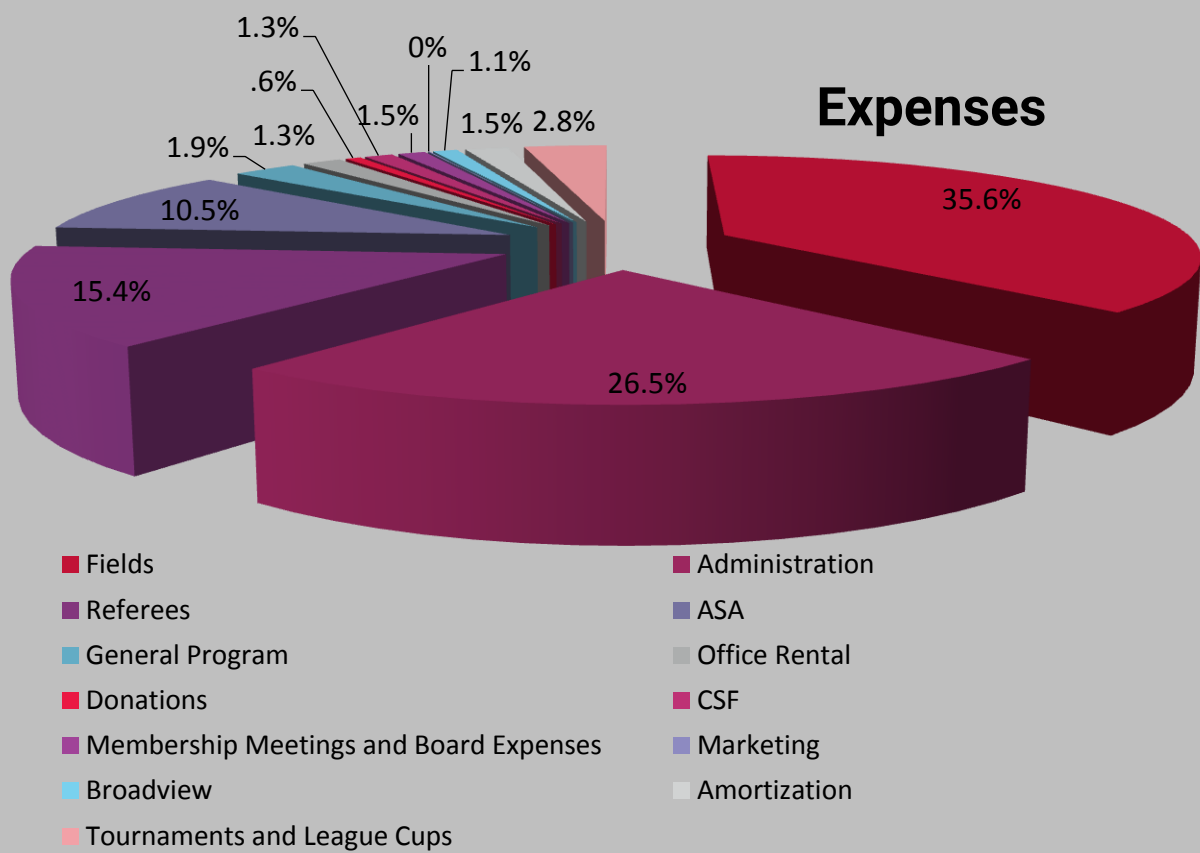
- On September 3, 2020 the Government of Alberta announced Casinos were permitted to fully re-open and CUSA is scheduled to hold an event in Q1 of 2021. This is a significant fundraiser for our members as revenues fund on-field expenses and up to 10% of revenues are returned directly to members in the form of team credits for their 300 plus hours working at the two day event.

### Total Expenses – 2.2M

The major expenditure categories for CUSA are field rentals and officials. CUSA continues to devote its use of funds to on-field activities, with over 70% of all expenditures disbursed directly to on-field expenses excluding administrative items.

- 2020 was an opportunity for CUSA to transition over to digital payments for our vendors. This has resulted in a reduction of operational expenses, increased the speed of payment and overall satisfaction.
- Further cost savings were realized by replacing credit card payment processors, group benefit providers and eliminating redundancies on its IT contracts.
- CUSA is in year 2 of 6 of a negotiated office lease contract resulting in annual savings to the Association of 38.5%.
- CUSA continues to run the district's officials certification courses increasing access, cost control and service delivery to our members.

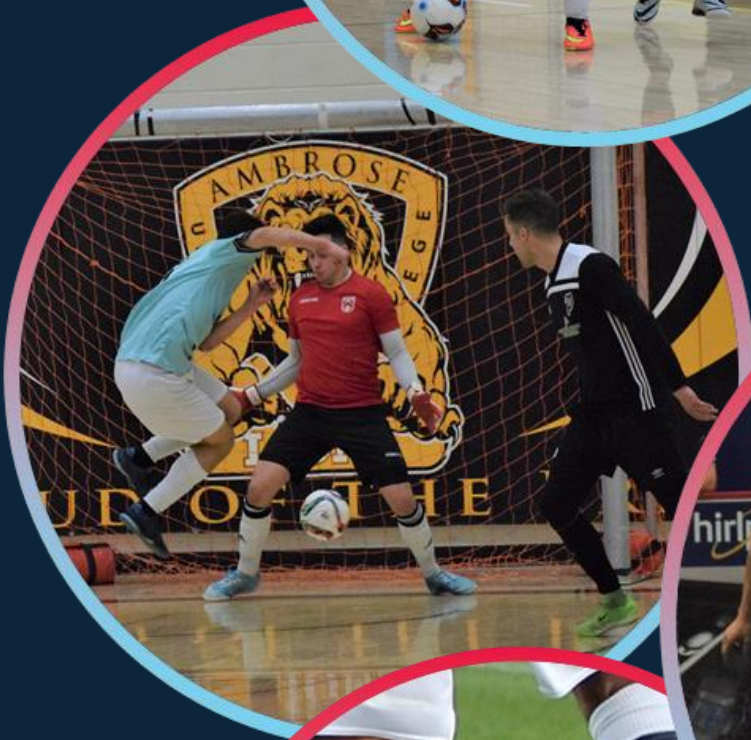
