Letter from the President

Dear friends of Calgary United Soccer Association,

Looking back at the past year, we had a successful year as we returned to normal soccer for both Outdoor 2022 and Indoor 2022-23 seasons. Our programs are growing in terms of players and teams as we recover to pre-pandemic levels.

The Outdoor 2022 season saw the return of regular season and the return of Provincial Championships. We had 231 teams participate in our Co-ed and Men's programs. This was an increase of 62 teams from the Outdoor 2021 season. This past outdoor season also saw a return of CUSA's cup competitions including the Black Cup which is one of the oldest amateur soccer trophies in Canada. The Black Cup was first awarded in 1914. Broadview Park was the site of the Cup Final day that saw multiple cups being awarded with some amazing action on the pitch.



The Indoor 2022-23 season also saw growth in our programs as the number of teams competing increased by 37 to 228 teams participating all our programs. The trend of teams shifting to the 7v7 program continued. CUSA offered Co-ed, Women's and Men's Futsal, Men's 7v7 and boarded programs.

CUSA once again hosted the Indoor Nations Cup and for the first time had a Women's division in this showcase tournament along with the Men's Open, Over 35 and Over 45 division. The Nations Cup has become the premier amateur event on the Calgary soccer calendar year. Building on the success of the 2022 Nations Cup, the fans turned out in record numbers that attracted local media attention. This tournament highlights and celebrates the rich diversity of Calgary which was on display over the two weeks. CUSA's commitment to giving back to the community was on display as we teamed up with Umoja Community Mosaic to run a food drive centered around ethnic foods. The Calgary soccer community showed their spirit of giving by donating an extra-ordinary amount of food. CUSA is looking forward to making next year's Nations Cup an even bigger event and growing the Women's division to showcase the top amateur soccer talent we are so fortunate to have in Calgary.

CUSA has led the way in development of futsal in Alberta and this was recognized by Canada Soccer as CUSA with our partner Sport Tourism Calgary were awarded the hosting of the 2023 Futsal Canadian Championship. We and fortunate our members should be very proud of this historical achievement as it was the first time Canada Soccer awarded the Championship to someone outside Ontario and Quebec. It was also an historical tournament as it was the first time there was a futsal national championship for women as this was an important part of our bid to showcase the strength of the women's futsal programs. The 2023 Futsal Canadian Championship was also the first edition to be hosted on treaty land as we worked with the Tsuut'ina Nation to play the Championship at the world-class Seven Chiefs Sportsplex. The event was an amazing success with the help of soccer community volunteering their time. Both Alberta teams represented Alberta and Calgary very well. Callies FC repeated as the bronze medal winners in the men's Futsal Championship.

We have continued to lead the way to our commitment to diversity, equality, and inclusion on and off the pitch. CUSA knows the work in this area never stops and we continue to work with all our partners withing the soccer community and the community in general. We continue to support KidSport Calgary and Soccer Without Boundaries (Umoja Community Mosaic) through donations on behalf of the membership. CUSA is also very proud to be the very first soccer association to be accepted in the Calgary Pride Parade in the 2022 edition. CUSA strongly believes that everyone should be able to play the beautiful game and sport is a method of bringing people together no matter their background.

2022 also saw the grand opening of the new fieldhouse at Broadview Park with a celebration of matches that represented all CUSA's different programs as well as matches to celebrate Calgary Women's Soccer Association and a celebration of the youth game. The new fieldhouse at Broadview Park was developed to preserve the past and protect the future of the beautiful game. Broadview will be a beacon for the soccer community coming together by becoming the premier amateur soccer facility in our city.

With our partners and membership, CUSA will always work to promote the game of soccer and lead by example. Together, for the love of the game we will build a stronger community.






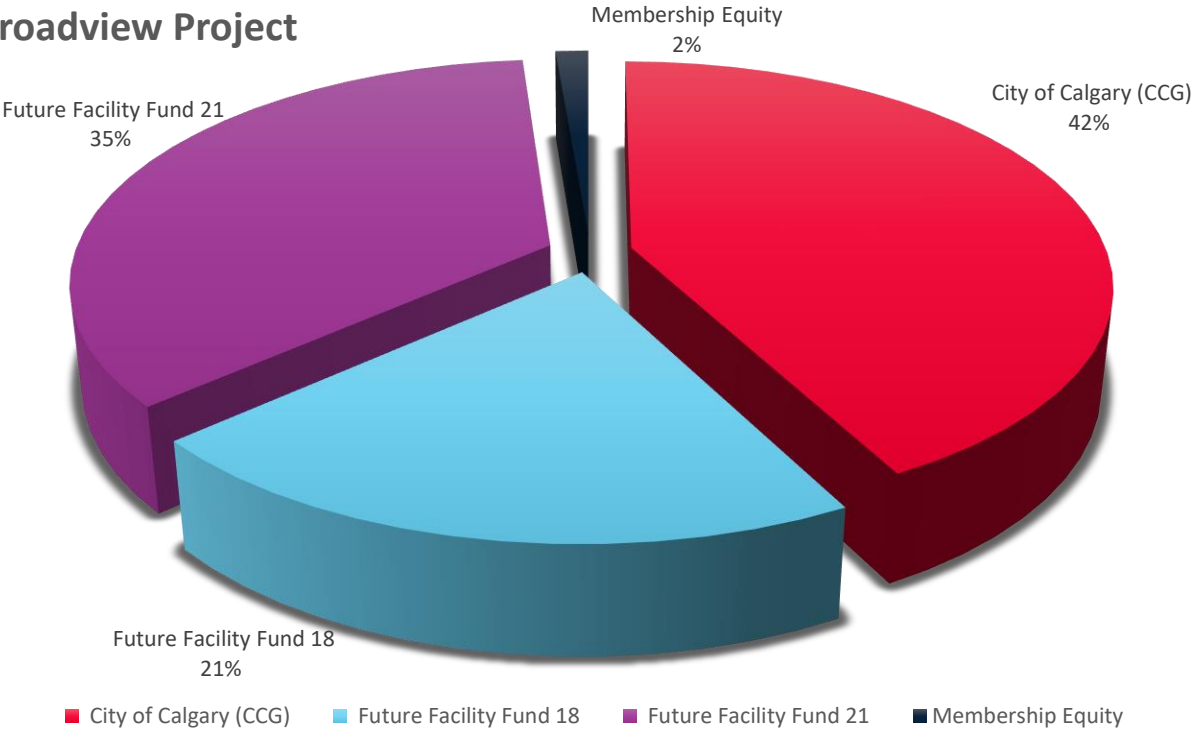


Executive Summary

CUSA was able to return to regular programming and offer a full slate of programs for both Seasons in the 2022 23 reporting period. This was a welcomed changed following the past two seasons of interruptions and cancellations.

The Capital build at Broadview was completed in December of 2022. Project exceeded original timelines and budget, both impacted by the pandemic. CUSA Membership were invited to attend the Official Re-Opening May 28, 2022. Since that time teams, officials and spectators have benefited from the improvements to the facility.

Broadview Project



CUSA commenced work in 2022 on the next five-year Strategic Plan for the Association. Emerging from the pandemic, with a strong financial position, allows the association to look forward with the ability to build for future growth.

2023 Accomplishments

Strong Communications and Brand Awareness

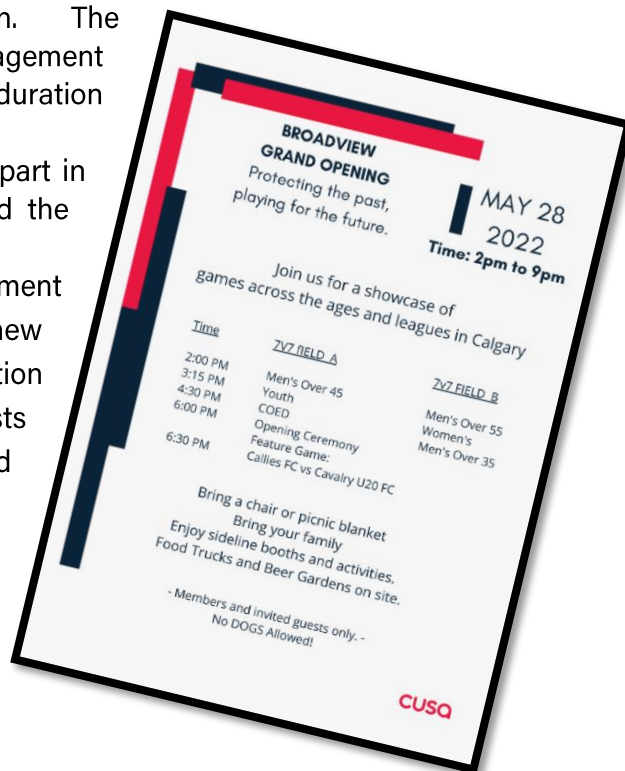
- The 2022 Outdoor season saw play return to familiar programming with strong registration numbers for the Men's Outdoor 11v11 and increased interest in the Outdoor 7v7 program for both Men's and Coed teams. Outdoor Provincial competitions resumed, the first time since 2019.
- Working directly with Calgary Sport Tourism CUSA submitted a host bid for the 2023 Canadian Futsal National Championships. The bid was successful with the event being held April 13 to 16, 2023 at Seven Chiefs Sportsplex Tsuu T'ina.
- CUSA became the first soccer association to take part in the Calgary Pride Parade September 4, 2022.

Grow and Diversify Services

- Growth in the 7v7 Indoor program continues to be strong. 2022 23 Indoor Season saw the introduction of a third boardless facility come on stream with the city opening Encana Bubble mid-November for league play.
- The 2023 Indoor Nations Cup was the largest competition yet. We welcomed 42 teams, 23 nations and 4 divisions of play – including the first women's division.

Strengthen Association

- Auditors returned an unqualified audit opinion. The Association received *Good* rating for financial management from City of Calgary for 10th consecutive year, entire duration of the City's review program.
- Members of CUSA Board and administration took part in ASA provided programs on Good Governance and the importance of EDII work in sport.
- Successfully complete the Broadview Trailer Replacement Project. The first games on the field and using the new facility occurred in May. A Celebration of the completion was held May 28th. CUSA Members and invited guests were able to take part in a day of games and reminiscence of matches and championships from days gone by.

Structure of Men's League – Outdoor

The Men's Programs offer competitive league play for players as young as 16 years of age. The Program also offers age restricted divisions for older players to solely play with others of their age. The minimum age in the Open Division is 16 years of age, players in the Master's Division must be at least 35, and CUSA offers divisions for Over 45 and 55 age groups as well.

CUSA offers a comprehensive range of leagues and competitions to provide a platform for players of all ages, 16 and above, and of all skill levels. On top of our existing leagues - Open-aged from AMSL through to Division 6, Masters (Over 35), Over 45, Over 55.

The league structure is based on promotion and relegation. Teams earn their way into higher divisions through the previous season results. Top performing

teams from the Premier, 1st, 2nd and 3rd divisions of the Men's Open League and of the Master's Premier division qualify to compete in the provincial championships. Provincial Champions from the AMSL and Master's Elite Divisions qualify for the Canada Soccer National Club Championships. Introduced in 2022 was the option for teams to play 7v7 Outdoors, in addition to the 11v11 game. A division of O45 was offered in this format at the Calgary Soccer Center.

Outdoor 2022 was marred with challenges for game schedules due to increased days of high Air Quality Health Index followed by days of extreme heat.

Promotional Challenges

Initially CUSA had received notice of Promotional Challenges for Divisions 1 through 3. By September when the games were to be played most teams had retracted their intent.

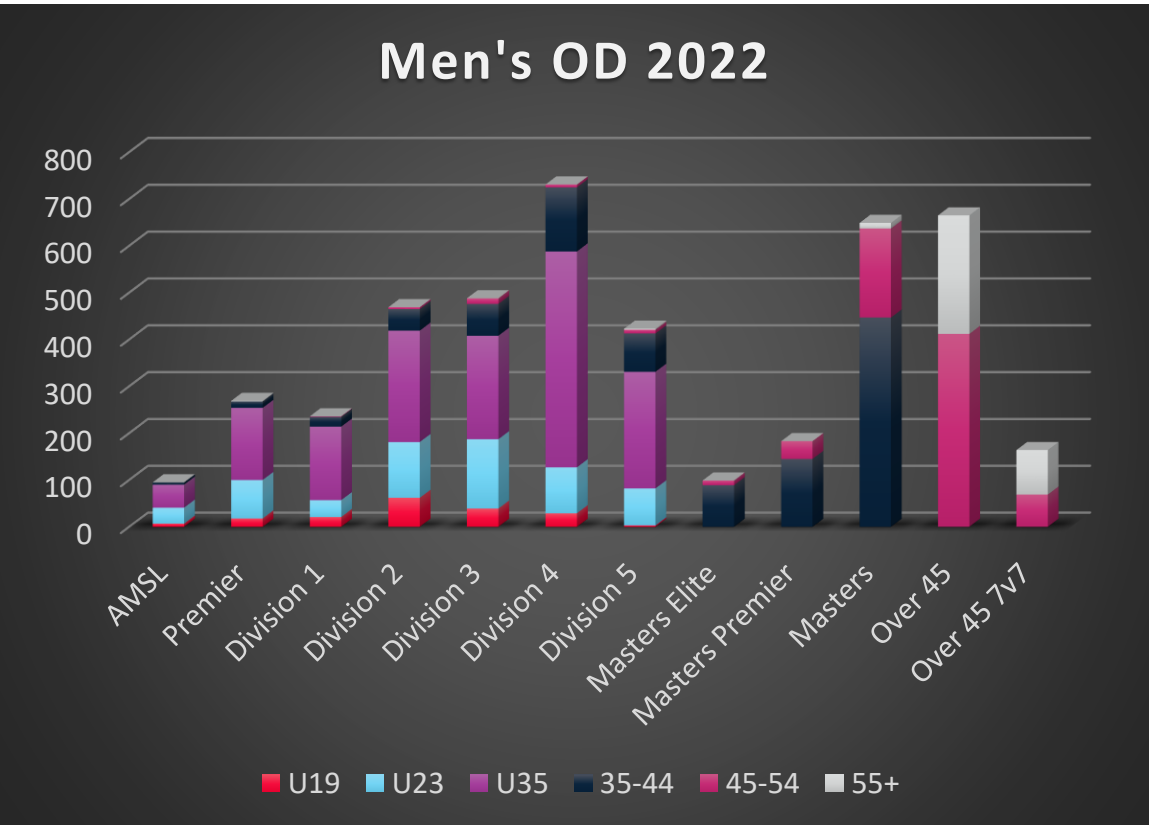
Final Results: Oromo FC awarded Division 2 for the 2023 Outdoor Program.

With Division 2 being twinned for the Outdoor program the league used the cross over games between 2A and 2B first and second place teams as both the determination as to who would represent CUSA at Tier 2 Provincials and who would be eligible for promotion into Division 1 for the 2023 Outdoor Season.

Final Results: Aces FC (2A) and CJSC Cruzeiro (2B) both earned promotion and the opportunity to represent CUSA at Tier 2 Provincials.

Age Demographics – Outdoor

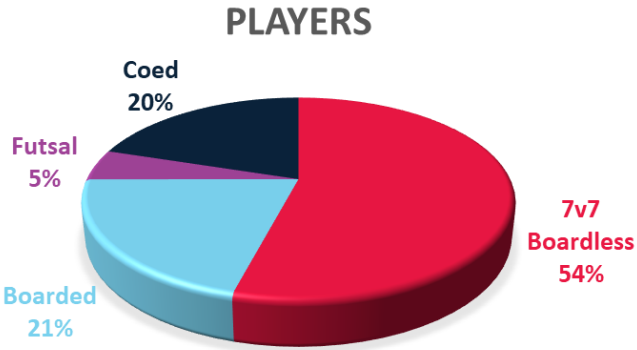
The chart below demonstrates the distribution of the players throughout the league by age groups. Not unexpected the largest portion of the membership (34%) is within the 24 to 34 age brackets.



Structure of Men's League - Indoor

The Indoor Program is slightly more diverse than what is offered for Outdoor. Players can choose between three different versions of the Indoor Game: 7v7 or Boardless, Boarded, or Futsal. They also have the option of playing within more than one program.

The growth in interest for the 7v7 program (54% of membership) can also be attributed to the increase in venues. November 2022 saw the City of Calgary open the Encana Bubble, a partnership between City, Greater Calgary Football and Calgary Blizzards. After a rough start CUSA had to reschedule 180 games when the city changed its operational model, we

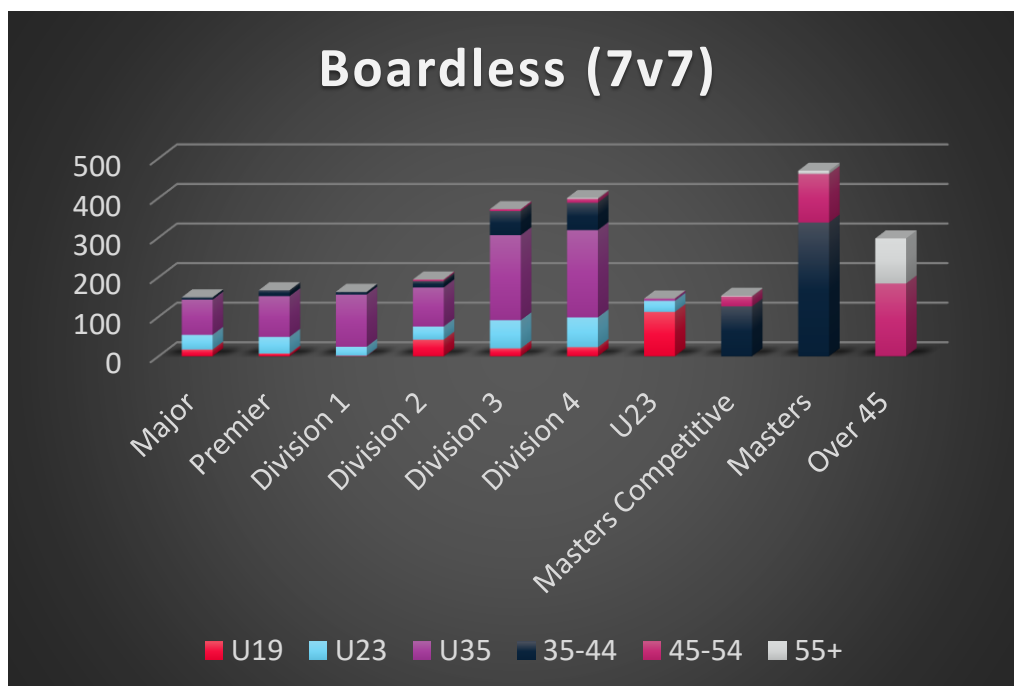


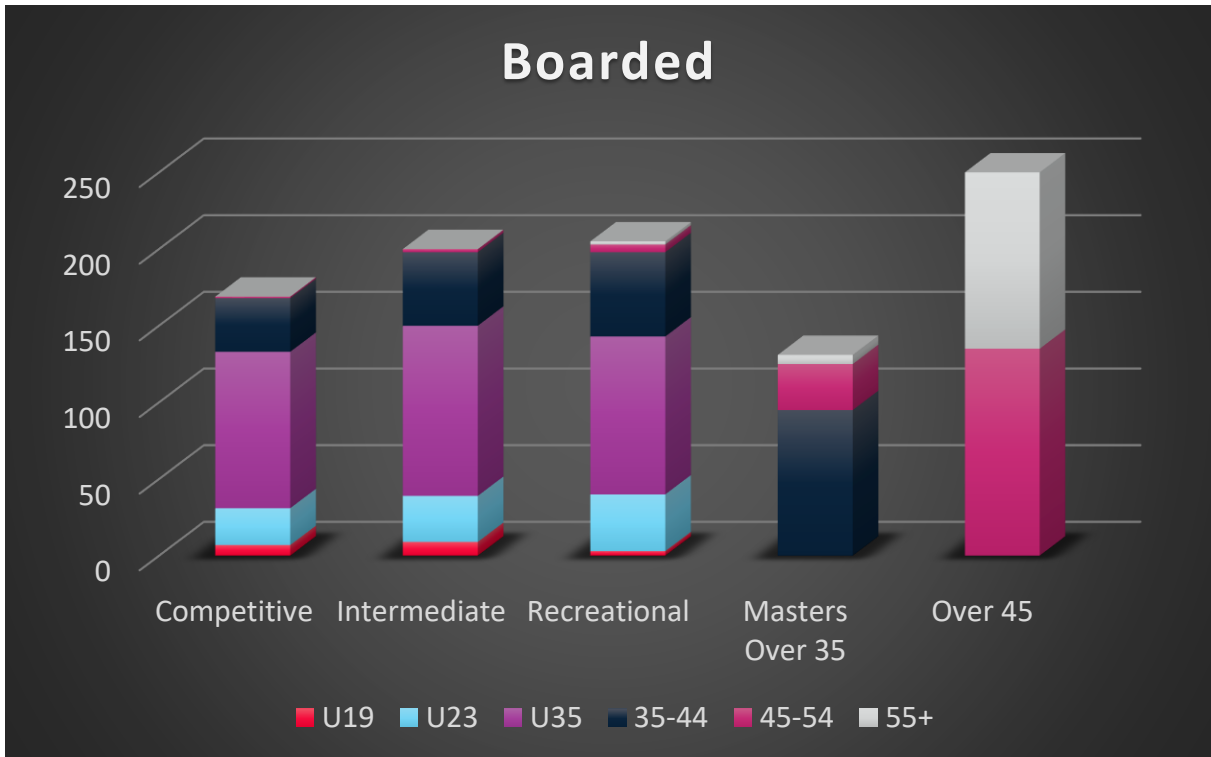
were able to access fields and provide a third venue for its membership to play in. Within the next 18 months two additional full sized indoor fields will be constructed that will further increase the opportunities for field access for the 7v7 game.

Continuing in 2022 – 23 Boardless Program was the U23 Program. This program provided U23 teams with an opportunity to participate half the season in a mixed division with the Open Men's teams and the second half of the season in a designated U23 Division. The goal behind the program was to offer an introduction into the Men's game and yet allow those graduating, or near graduating youth players an opportunity to learn what the next level of play will involve.

Coed Program

Calgary Coed strives for adult players to have fun on and off the field and creates a social atmosphere for players to have fun and learn the game of soccer. It remains the only Alberta Soccer Association (ASA) sanctioned Coed Soccer league in Calgary and the only league with CSA certified officials.

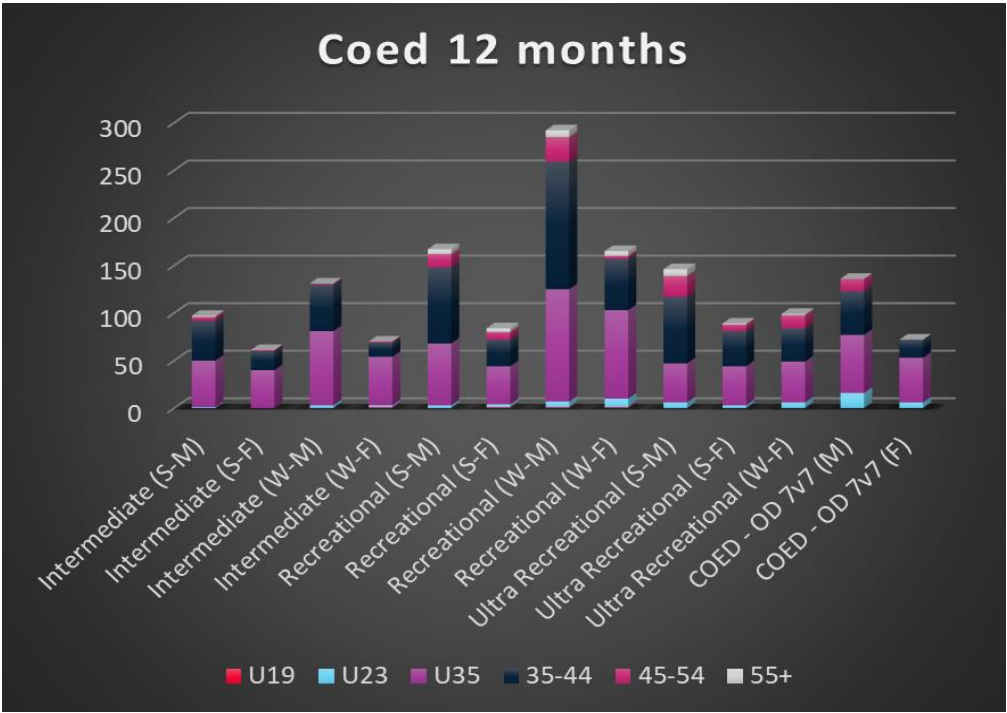
Calgary Coed Rec Soccer Recently added the Outdoor 7v7 program in 2015, where teams compete at the Calgary Soccer Centre on half or cross court artificial turf fields. At the end of each season, the top team within the group wins the divisional finalist and the team with the best Fair Play is awarded the Fair Play winner.

Structure of Coed League

As the primary intention for Coed is social and Fair Play the league is structured for participants with similar goals. In recent seasons the Competitive Division has gone away, and the program has grown for Recreational and Ultra Recreational players.

In 2022 the Fairness Model was introduced. It is applied to the highest division. The intent is that should a team be dominating their opponent, score is a 7-point difference, then the team leading is reduced by a single player. If the difference is reduced to 5 goals, then the teams return to even strength. Throughout this process the gender ratio of the players must be maintained.

Age Demographics



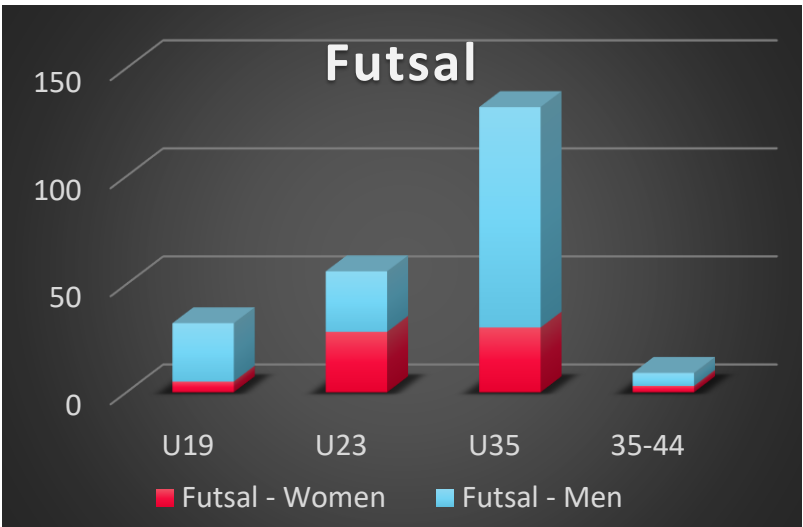
Futsal Program

Interest in the futsal program remains stable, 2022 saw a return to an offering of a female division again. Venue change was also completed for the Men's program to 7 Chief's Sportsplex. This move allowed the program to offer the game on a full-sized futsal pitch with the proper surface. The goal was to help prepare the teams for the competition that would be experienced at the Canadian Futsal Club Nationals.

The venue met expectations and was chosen by Canada Soccer to be the host site for the 2023 Canadian Futsal Club Championship, April 13-16, 2023. In addition, CSA also announced that the 2023 competition would include a women's division for the first time. The winner from the men's division will go onto represent Canada at the CONCACAF Club Futsal Championships.

Special Events, Tournaments and Cups

City Cups

Each outdoor season CUSA offers the opportunity for the membership to take part in six different City Cup competitions. The extra competitions offer teams the opportunity to meet different opponents than those within the league division. In several of the Cup Competitions a variety of teams from lower league divisions will challenge opponents from those higher divisions for bragging rights. Teams can also participate in more than one competition in any one year.



Black Cup - Est.1913

The Black Cup is the oldest soccer trophy in Calgary. The first competition for the Black Cup was held in 1914. The Calgary Caledonian Soccer Club has been the most successful club in the tournament, winning the trophy 25 times throughout the tournament's history.

The tournament format is a single-elimination format and is held in September following the completion of Provincials. This tournament is the only opportunity for AMSL, Premier and Division 1 teams to compete for a City Cup which makes this competition one of the toughest to win. Any registered Outdoor team in Calgary United Soccer is eligible to participate.



2022 Champions – Callies FC



Calgary Cup - Est.1999

The Calgary Cup gives a second and final opportunity for Division 2, Division 3 and Master's Elite teams to win a City Cup. The Cup is a single-elimination format and is traditionally held in September.

Any registered Outdoor team in Calgary United Soccer in Division 2 and lower are eligible to participate.





Tony Marques Memorial Cup - Est.1997

The Tony Marques Memorial Cup has traditionally been a one weekend single-elimination tournament held during the last weekend in May. It is open to non-provincial teams in the Open, Master's, Over 45 and Over 55 divisions, as well as the Master's Premier division. Games are shortened to two-25-minute halves which creates a fury of action throughout the weekend.

The competition is named after a past Calgary United Soccer President, the first elected following the amalgamation of Calgary Soccer and United Soccer. Tony played with Juventus in the Men's Open Premier Division and later in the Master's Division with many from the same team. Tragically Tony passed away while in Mexico in October 1996.



2022 Champions – Super Eagles



John Burns Memorial Cup - Est.1999

The Airdrie United John Burns. The competition is held annually for Master's teams, except Master's Elite, and Over 45 and Over 55 teams. The tournament uses a single-elimination format throughout the Outdoor season. The Chinooks Blackstars have been the most successful team in the John Burns Memorial Cup, winning the trophy 3 times from 2007 to 2012.

The original tournament was held in a *family, friendly manner*. For each foul or knockdown the player was required to stop and assist his opponent back to his feet.

Teams that participate in Master's Premier and lower are eligible to participate, including all those registered in Over 45 and Over 55 Divisions.





Nations Cup 2023

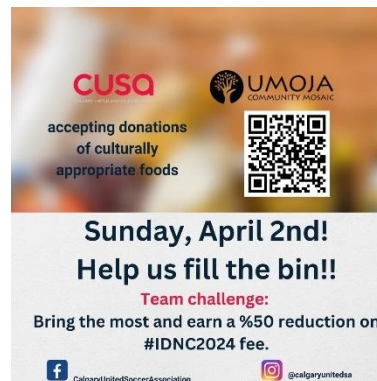
March 27 to April 6, 2023

The Indoor Nations Cup was introduced in 2015 and is held annually as a competition to bridge the gap between Indoor and Outdoor seasons. It is an opportunity to recognize the cultural diversity that exists locally within the sport of soccer. This tournament provides a unique concept of grouping players based on their ethnic backgrounds and countries of origin, creating an exciting atmosphere that provides a stage for people throughout the community to express their pride in their heritage.



The 2023 Tournament was the largest yet with 43 teams representing 25 different nations competing in 4 different categories. For the first time a four team Women's Competition was held.

CUSA continues to work with a variety of partners to help make the event successful. Our friends at Cavalry FC again graciously provided the championship teams with team tickets to a match, Umoja Community Mosaic was present to provide information on their programs and to collect Foodbank donations. For the stuff the bin team challenges Team Italy came through in full force with their donations, earning the club 50% off one team's registration for Nations Cup 2024.



The final matches were also livestreamed.

The success of the competition continues to be demonstrated through the passion by which the players participate and the amazing community support from the local fans. 2023 was no exception with crowds filling the stands from opening night to the finals.

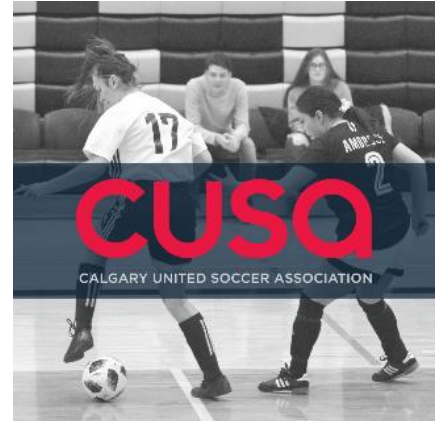

Financials

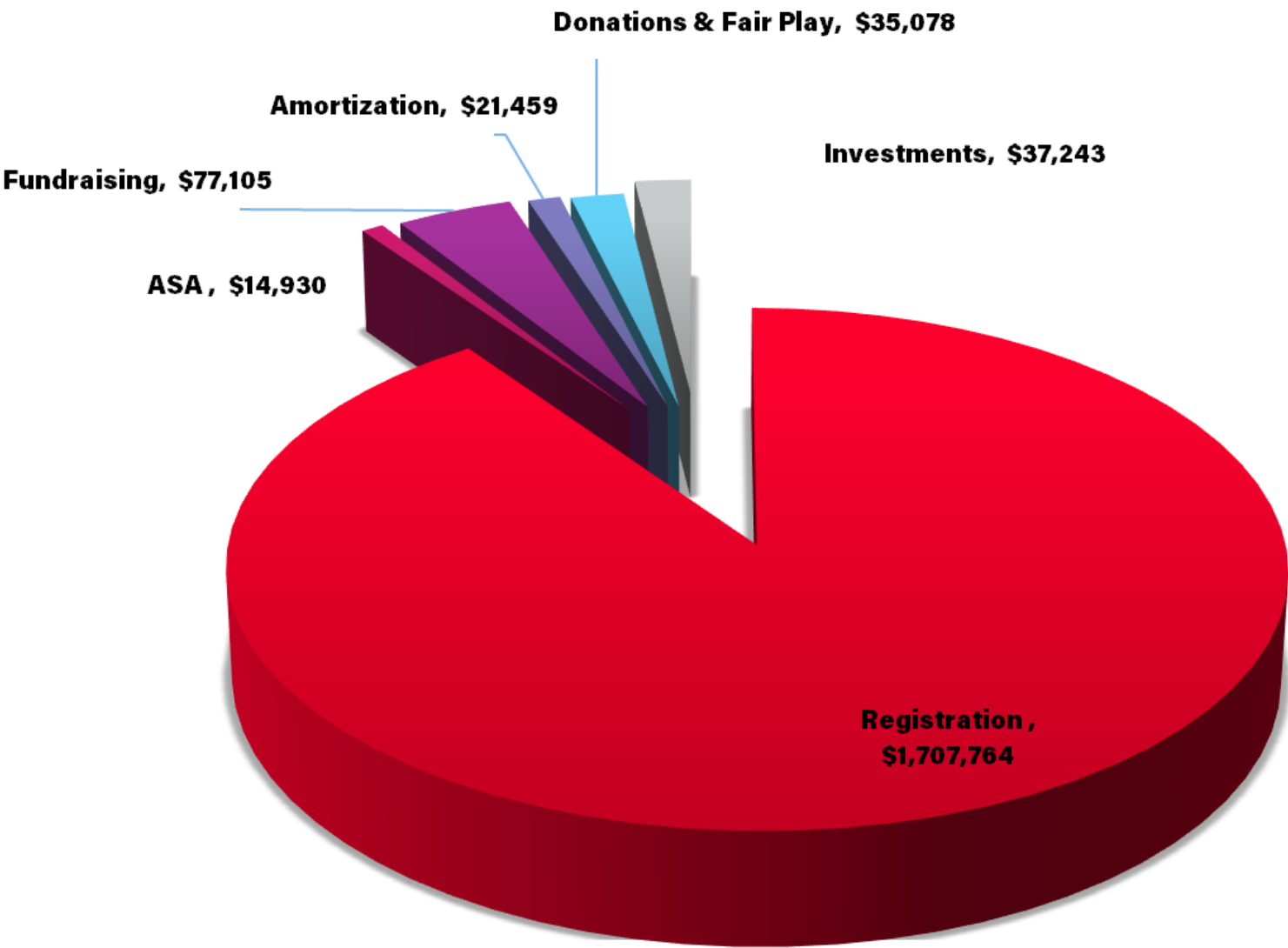
For the year ended March 31, 2023, the staff and the board worked very hard to ensure the financial health continued. This fiscal year was the first return to *normal* budgets with no COVID subsidies received. Repayment of the \$40,000.00 Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) remains due December 31, 2023.

- Steady growth in capital reserves enables CUSA to take advantage of more favorable rates, a 131% percentage increase of interest income over 2022 (2022-\$7,826, 2023 \$37,243).
- Broadview rooftop viewing deck sponsorships available, opportunity for team and club logos to be displayed for minimum 5 years, commitment is \$750-\$1,500 depending on location.
- Referee no show credits issued as game sheets are received.
- ASA player fee – now paid annually and direct to ASA, benefits the players no limit in number of programs they can play in.
- Broadview building opened and following a depreciation schedule over the estimated life span of the building which is 25 years.
- Qualify for a Casino licence every 16-18 months, CUSA fully expensed casino funds on field rentals and official fees.
- KidSport team donations over 15 years \$126,110.
- Umoja Community Mosaic - Soccer Without Boundaries team donations over 7 years \$24,724, inaugural team playing 2023 Outdoor as SWB FC.
- Remain committed to best banking practices, annual review resulted in reduced processing fees, transaction fees.
- Continue to devote its use of funds to on-field activities, with over 64% disbursed directly to on-field expenses excluding administrative items.
- Fun fact: 2023 CUSA expensed \$9.6k on team incentives COED's full season sign-up discount, league free team fee draw.
- 10th consecutive year CUSA has received a low-risk rating on overall organizational sustainability as a leaseholder with the City of Calgary

Once again, the team at CUSA, both staff and the Board has shown our dedication to being fiscal stewards for your association.

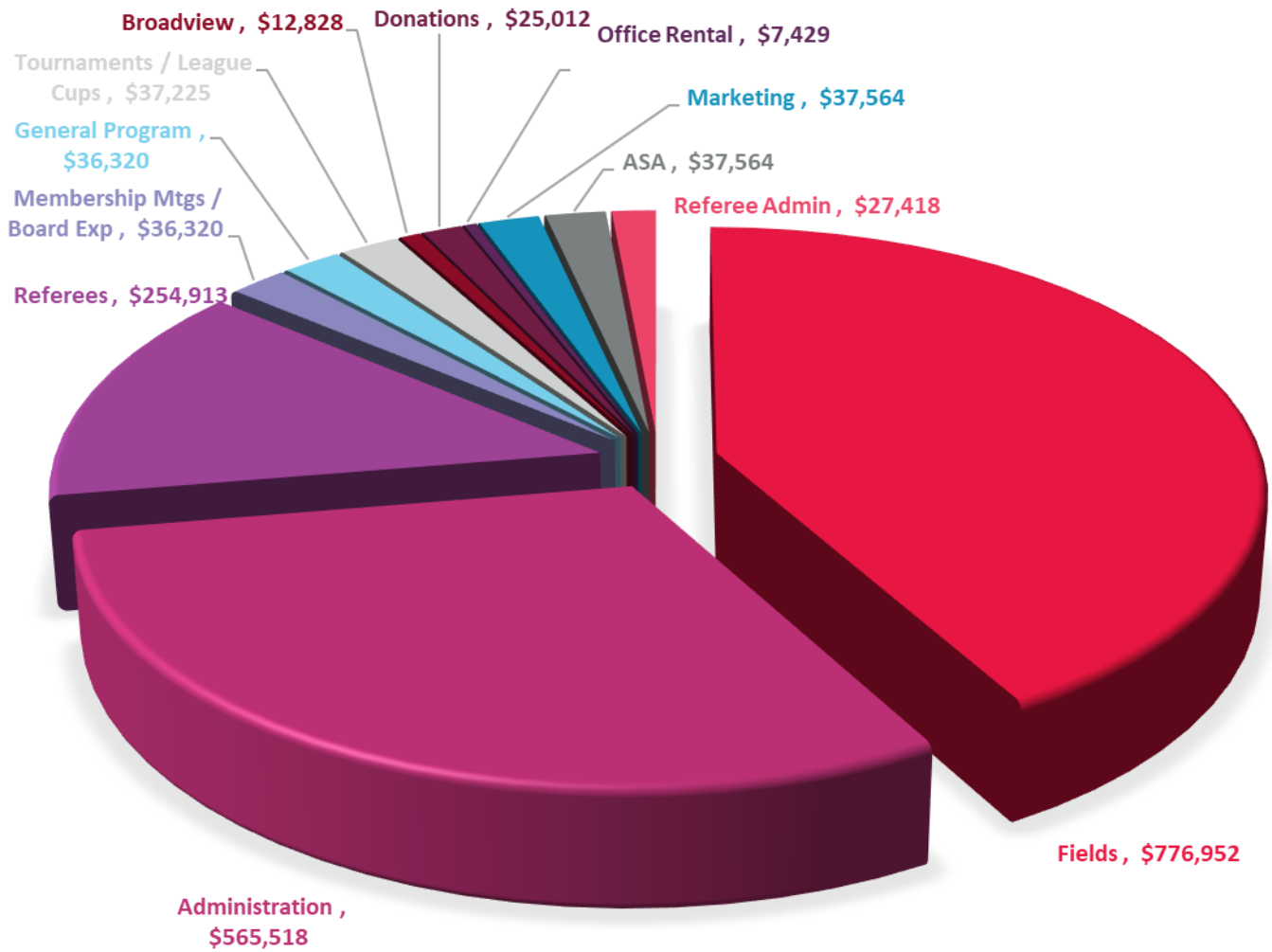
Revenue Sources

Soccer without Boundaries

Under the guidance of Jean Claude Munyezamu, innovative multicultural outreach programs are aimed at integrating new Canadians into their community. Our support of Umoja Community Mosaic speaks volumes to the impact that our communities can have if we work together building community both on and off the field. Together we can create opportunities that build belonging through sport, music, art, and learning and everyone belongs here.

Umoja Community Mosaic started in 2010 as a drop-in soccer club. We host soccer outdoors in the summer months and indoors in the winter months where we focus on inclusion, emotional regulation, conflict resolution, and community building. We also work with competitive soccer clubs to insert talented players into teams across Calgary.

Umoja’s soccer program builds teamwork and leadership skills. Many Umoja athletes become coaches and all participants stay in school. Many have gone on to post-secondary institutions (some on soccer scholarships) and join the workplace in a range of careers. In addition to their sport program, they also offer a Culturally Appropriate Food Program, Community Based Tutoring and After School Programming.



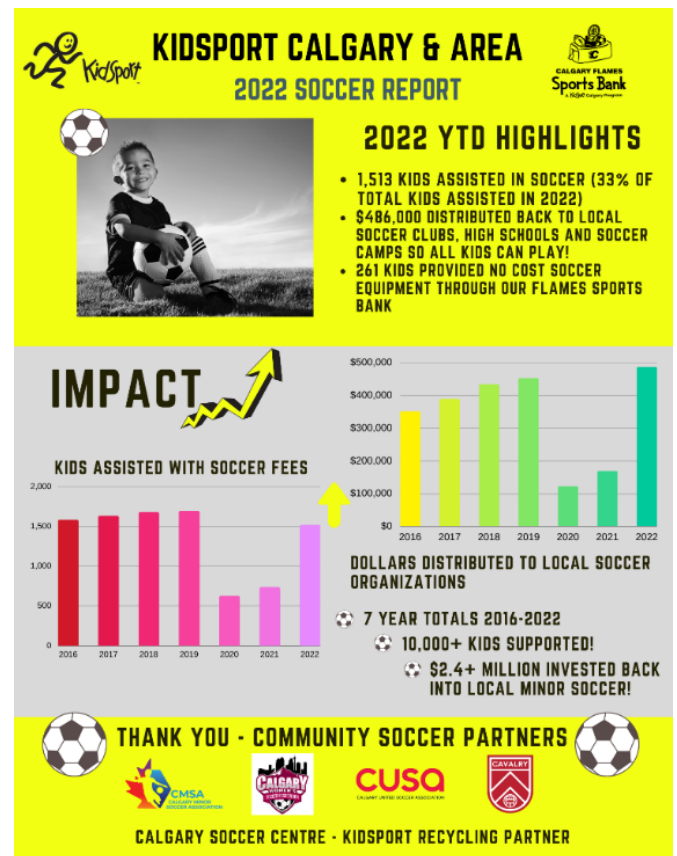
KidSport Calgary & Area

CUSA and KidSport celebrate a 15-year partnership in 2023. With the donation in June 2023 the partnership has seen CUSA Members donate over \$130,691 to support KidSport and its programs.

KidSport provides grants to help cover the costs of registration fees, as well as providing no-cost equipment so that all kids aged 18 and under in Calgary & Area can play a season of sport.

The Calgary chapter accepts applications and administers grants of up to \$500 per child/year, for kids who live in Calgary & Area.

By February 27, 2023 Calgary KidSport had already assisted 1,000 kids with funding to play sport. In 2019, pre-pandemic, KidSport Calgary had funded just 821 kids as of the same date, proving how important the return to sport has been to families as life returns to some semblance of normalcy.



CUSA Membership - Draw for Free Fees



To assist CUSA Membership with their return to play following the pandemic Teams that had paid their deposit and balance of fees within the timelines advertised were eligible to have their name entered into the draw for Indoor 2022 23 Free Fees. The first team to be drawn was **Eri Star**, a new CUSA Member for the season.

Within the Coed League those teams for the Indoor Season that signed up to play the entire 18 game season received a 5% discount for the season long commitment. Teams that participated in 9-week programs were not eligible for the same discount. In total, \$9,600 of team fees were discounted.

Scholarship Awards

At CUSA, we strongly believe in our commitment to giving back to the community. On our 40th anniversary, we introduced our scholarship program as another way to give back to the soccer community. We believe the future of not just the soccer community, but the community of Calgary is in great hands.

CUSA is very committed to being a leader in amateur organized sport, by building on our rich heritage, and being inclusive to all, we help build an improved community on and off the pitch. Together, CUSA, and its members will continue our and soccer's growth while having a positive social impact in our city.

The annual award was created to encourage and financially aid soccer players, coaches, or officials in the pursuit of their academic and athletic careers. Awarded to students with satisfactory academic standing, entering, or continuing in an undergraduate or graduate degree program who are members of, or whose parent(s) are members of Calgary United Soccer Association.

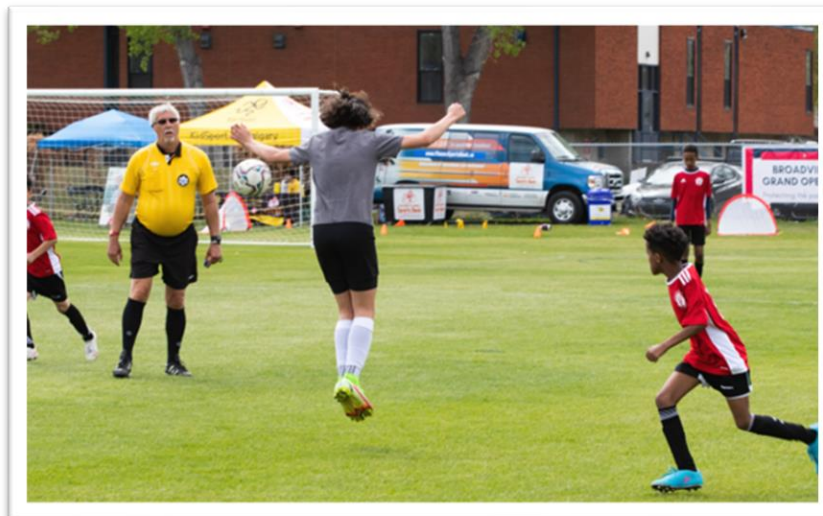
