



COVID-19 Guidelines and Procedures for Fall 2020

This document outlines the Genesis Centre processes and procedures for the Fall 2020 season.

Masks

As outlined in the COVID-19 Face Coverings Bylaw, we require all patrons to wear a mask in indoor public areas. This requirement applies to adults and children aged 2+. People engaging in athletic or fitness activities are exempt from this requirement. For more information about the Face Coverings Bylaw, please visit:

Cleaning court/field between bookings

Cleaning will happen between each game/booking using the 55 minute rule. FAs/Custodial will disinfect door handles, players boxes/benches, and score clock console after teams have left the field/court. This will be completed within the 5 minutes allotted, then the next team will enter the field/court.

Change rooms

Change rooms are available for use by teams or 'cohorts'. We will be applying a 20/20/20 Rule – teams will have 20 minutes to vacate after their game, Genesis Centre custodians will have 20 minutes to clean, and then the next team will have access to the room 20 minutes before their game.

Split-field games (U8 and U6) will not have access to the changerooms. Players must arrive dressed and ready to play.

Capacity

The maximum capacity for a court/field is 50 people.

The maximum capacity for a changeroom is limited to a single team/cohort, maximum 25 players and 5 coaches.

Spectators

Spectators must wear a mask while spectating. Spectatorship cannot exceed 10 people per team. Encourage teams to limit their audience, and practice physical distancing by maintaining 6ft. (2m) distance between spectators. No food or beverage can be consumed in the spectator area.

Screening before games

All team members and players must be screened before entering the facility. Teams must gather/meet outside, where coach/team manager must ask screening questions to each member. Any members who do not pass screening should be asked to leave the premises. The coach/team manager must then check in at Guest Services and let Genesis Centre staff know that screening has been completed. Teams must enter together as one group and adequately document who has attended the game for contact tracing purposes. Spectators will also be required to sign in at Guest Services and complete a screening process.

In case of a Team Member with a positive result or an outbreak:

OUTBREAK definition by CDC:

- During (and because of) a case investigation and contact tracing, two or more contacts are identified as having active COVID-19, regardless of their assigned priority.

or

- Two or more patients with COVID-19 are discovered to be linked, and the linkage is established outside of a case investigation and contact tracing (e.g., two patients who received a diagnosis of COVID-19 are found to work in the same office, and only one or neither of the them was listed as a contact to the other).

Genesis Centre is to be NOTIFIED:

As soon as there is a positive case. If it becomes an outbreak as described above we should be notified.

Teams affected by this will be OUT OF OUR FACILITY as follows:

- **1 positive case:** minimum of 10 days, all test results for the teams must be back and negative, all team members must still pass the screening process before being permitted into the facility.
- **Outbreak:** a minimum of 14 amount of days from the last positive test result and/or the last day of unwell symptoms being presented. All team members must have negative test results, be healthy and be subject to the daily screening process before being permitted into the facility.

These guidelines and procedures are subject to change as regulations continue to be added and/or changed.
