### **Facility Reminders**

#### Teams are to use rooms assigned

### **Conduct within Facilities**

Incidents whereby staff identify unruly team/player conduct.

#### **Unruly** defined as:

including, but is not limited to; spectator conduct, swearing in public areas, alcohol consumption, staff harassment, etc...

#### Guidelines given to staff:

- To request that the Team Representative (Coach or Manager) identify themselves
- Team Representative will be point of contact between staff the individual(s) involved
- Team Representative will relay instructions of staff.
- If a Team Representative does not follow instructions of facility staff, further action will be taken up to and including the activation of CPS and/or Corporate Security.

Players who are sent off are often emotionally charged. Once these individuals have left the field of play, they will be considered members of the public. If a Team Representative must escort a sent-off player to the locker room (or away from the pitch) in order to ensure their player behaves, then that should be done.

### Rescheduling

The City of Calgary field return policy is a minimum of 30 days notice. This includes indoor and outdoor venues.

This means that the league must return an unused field more than 30 days prior to the permit date otherwise the league is charged for the field's usage.

As a result, the Rescheduling Policy and Procedure, Reschedule Charges and Forfeiture Fines have been updated to reflect these changes:

More than 30 Days – No Charge

Less than 30 Days but More than 3 Business Days - \$150.00

- Less than 3 Business Days - \$300.00

#### INCLEMENT WEATHER TRAVEL PROCEDURE

#### Overview

Teams participating in Calgary United Soccer Association (CUSA) are expected to play all of their games; however it is not required nor expected of our teams to travel on highways inside or outside of the City of Calgary during extreme winter weather conditions. CUSA does not want to put any Coach, Player, or fan in a situation where they do not feel safe driving to a game and we encourage teams to use their best judgement when evaluating road safety. We encourage coaches to use road condition updates provided by the Government of Alberta along with Travel Advisories issued by local police and RCMP as resources when determining if travel is safe.

#### 2) Process for Road Closures and Travel Advisories


- a. The Alberta Road Report can be found at <u>www.511.alberta.ca</u>. If the major highway is listed as closed or a travel advisory is announced within 4 hours of the game time, the game will be cancelled/postponed. Best efforts will be made by the league to have the game rescheduled; however field availability and timing in the season may prevent the game from being played.

### Insurance

Alberta Soccer covers its Members with Commercial General Liability, Sport Accident and Excess Travel (out-of-country is now a mandatory purchase) Insurance protection.





### **Travelling to A Tournament?**



#### Travel Sanctioning

Anytime a team travels outside of Alberta to compete in a tournament or attend a training camp, they must complete a travel permit application.

#### Travel permits serve three main purposes:

- They provide protection to the traveling team. Travel permits are only approved if the tournament is sanctioned by the associated Provincial, State or National Soccer
  Association. Restricting travel to tournaments not affiliated with a parent body reduces the risk to teams, as they know they are travelling to a real tournament with universal
  standards.
- They provide protection to the tournament. By requiring a travel permit, tournament organizers know who will attend their event. Travel permits reduce the risk to tournament organizers ensuring the team and players are properly registered and in good standing with their league.
- They provide protection to the players. All players and team officials attending a sanctioned event in Alberta are covered under Alberta Soccer's (ASA) insurance policy. Travel
  permits extend this coverage beyond Alberta's borders for the duration of the tournament

### **Player Indebtedness**

The time period that a club/team can hold a player accountable for past fees, while allowing the player to continue to play, is the **past season**. **No Forced Loyalty**

- Club must have a written record between club & player on amount of fees & payment agreement.
- A verbal agreement is not sufficient
- Agreement to be renewed each season of play.
- For a player's registration or transfer to be blocked due to indebtedness to a club the indebted club must provide the league with a list of the players to be locked prior to the commencement of the registration period for that season.
- When a player account is locked it can no longer be for a player to sign with the club that requested the lock unless
  - Past fees are paid in full
  - Payment plan has been reached
  - Outstanding debt has been forgiven

### JERSEYS (KIT)

Every team is responsible for having two kits.



#### **Proper Kits**

- •2<sup>nd</sup> set of jerseys in opposite color from primary set. i.e. black and white.
- All jerseys are numbered
- Each player has their own kit





#### **Unacceptable Kit**

- 2<sup>nd</sup> set of jerseys do not have numbers
- Pinnies, duct tape
- Players sharing jerseys with subs
- Jersey's worn inside out

### **Fair Play Points**

The Fair Play Team Award is intended to foster the spirit of fair play for the competition. A team includes all players, coaches, and other team officials on the team roster.

All teams start off the game with a Fair Play Score of 10.

Demerits can range from -2 to -25 depending on infraction.

Teams may earn merit by submitting a referee evaluation within two weeks of the date of a game.

Teams who receive more than 90 demerits in the season will have to meet with the discipline committee to determine what action needs to be taken to improve this and to determine their eligibility to play in the league.

At the completion of the season, the 2 teams with the top fair play score for their division split (65/35) the Fair Play Pool for their division.

### **Guest Player**

#### **Boarded Program**

- Open Division Club Players
- Provincial Division registered player Provincial Division guest.
- CMSA players 16+ may guest 6 times per team, Open Division.
- Masters 6 times per team.
- Over 45 unlimited.

#### 8v8 Program

- No intra divisional guest playing
- NOT Club Tied (currently)
- Masters Competitive cannot guest into Open Recreational.
- CUSA registered players in Coed, Boarded or Futsal may guest 3 X
- CMSA players 16+ may guest 6 times per team, Open Division.

#### **Futsal**

- No intra divisional guest playing
- CUSA players registered to Indoor Boarded, Coed or 8v8 may guest a maximum of 3 times.
- CMSA players 16+ may guest 6 times per team.
- CWSA players are not eligible to guest into Futsal.

#### Coed

- Guest players are only permitted from other teams in their same grouping.
  - Competitive Division may use a guest player from Intermediate Division up to 6 times in total for the season.
- Players may be a guest player 6 times per team only in a season.
  - Competitive Division player may guest player to another Competitive Division team no more than 2 times per team to a maximum of 8 games in the season.
  - Competitive Division teams may use up to 4 Intermediate Division guest players per game. The total guest
    players cannot exceed 4 in total regardless of the combination of Competitive and Intermediate Division players
    used.
- CMSA players are not eligible to guest
- All players must be 18+

### **Registration Process**

New players must come in person to the office with at least one government issued photo ID **and** their registration form (available online or in office).

Returning individuals can <u>register online</u> or email registration in.

Returning individuals changing teams with their photo on file may have someone else pick up their new card.

Teams are responsible to ensure that the team name is correct on the ID Card. NO CARD. NO PLAY. NO EXCEPTION! This includes Coaches & Team Officials!



If your player received a release from Canadian Soccer to train or play internationally then they need a release back to Canada before resuming play here.


### Team Manager - Player Registration

- 1. Log in under Member log in.
  - Use the same log in information you created when registering the team for the season. If you forgot your
     PW, click reset



#### 2. Go to Manage Team

Option 1 Give the players the Invite Code.



Option 2 Enter the players email and send invite to them

### Player Registration Steps

- 1. Log in to Member Account
- 2. Register to a Team
- 3. If using the invite code enter code and your team will show up
- 4. New players will need to create an account (Add Family Member), returning players can update any change of address, email or phone numbers.
- 5. Review waivers and sign at the bottom
- 6. Click submit and the process is don.

Players can still submit waivers in the office.

First time registrations will need to come to office with photo ID to complete registration before their first game.

Players must register for each program they are participating in.

### **Player Cards**

- All players and team officials <u>must</u> have a CUSA issued ID card to present at the field for each game they appear on the game sheet. To be at the team bench an ID card <u>must</u> be presented to the match officials prior to KO.
- Should a player who is also a team official choose to have only one card and receives a suspension that player/coach will not be eligible to get an additional card until the suspension is served. (existing rule).
- Players or coaches who are registering in more than one program, if identifying it at time of purchase, will get cards for additional programs at a discounted price. No refunds will be issued on purchases where this was not disclosed.

### **Rule Changes - 8v8 Program**

- The offside rule which was previously used is no longer in effect. NO offside.
- Goalkeepers can play the ball out in whichever way they want, including punting/drop-kicking.
- Goal kicks may now first-bounce anywhere on the field, no restrictions
- If a player is sent off, their team is not reduced in numbers on the field, but the player takes no further part in the game and is subject to sanctions as per the CUSA Discipline Code. Teams who receive more than 2 red cards in the same game will mandatorily appear at a Discipline Hearing and could face further sanctions.



### Discipline

- A suspended player would serve their suspension in the program area in which it was earned unless the Discipline Committee deems it an All of Soccer suspension.
- Any infractions against a match official will be considered an All of Soccer suspension.
- Players or coaches who are not in good standing in one program area may not be eligible to register in another program until the suspension is completed.
- Players or coaches that accumulate 3 or more red cards across two or more program areas may be invited to attend a discipline hearing to discuss their actions. Does not include those dismissals for double cautions or DOGSO.

### **Discipline Records**





- Tracking of accumulation of Yellow cards remain with the team/player to be aware.
- Cards are posted on the website as the game sheets arrive in the office.

### **GAME SHEET INFORMATION**

After a game is over it is up to the Coach, Manager or Captain to ensure that the information on the copy you receive back is correct. The Game Sheets are Official once they are signed by the official and leave the field.

#### This includes:

- Who received a yellow/red card in the game
- Who scored the goals in the game
- Who played/Who did not play
- Who were guest players
- If an opposing team has challenged the identity of a player
- Who can be on the team bench as a Team Official



### **Promotional Challenge**

Teams who wish to participate within CUSA's Promotional Challenge must submit a letter of intent by January 31<sup>st</sup>. To be eligible you must finish first in your division.

The first non-relegated teams in Division 1, 2, and 3 are required to participate if a challenge takes place. Promotional challenge games will be played in late March and early April. Challenging teams are responsible for the costs of the Promotional Challenge games.



### **Coaching Qualifications**



#### n Provincial Divisions:

- All team staff must have a District Photo ID.
- All team staff listed on a Provincial Championship roster are required to obtain Criminal Record Check Clearance (every three years)
- One staff member must fulfill the coaching requirement for the appropriate level as per the chart below:

Competition	Coaching Requirement
Men/Women Major	Full Community Coach Certificate OR Soccer for Life + MED
Masters/Classics Major	Full Community Coach Certificate OR Soccer for Life + MED
Premier and Lower	NONE

ASA removed from rosters all team officials who did not meet this requirement for the Indoor Provincials.

#### Men's Futsal Teams - Provincial Division

At least one member of your team staff must have completed the CCES E-learning (www.cces.ca). A copy of the CCES certificate for the courses will be required to be submitted along with your team registration for the CSA Competition.

True Sport Clean 101 and the Role of Athlete Support Personnel Course. The team that qualifies will need to have their captain also complete the course prior to the championship.

January 31, 2020 is the deadline for:







