I thought that two of the younger players on the Rangers side were pushing the envelope a little bit and were getting under the skin of the _____ players. In these kind of games the older players just want to play and go home without being hurt. Perhaps a quiet word in the ear of players like this would calm them down.</p> <p>I don't want to appear to be overly critical as you had a good game, with no problems and your calls were good and consistent. I am just trying to point out small details to help you improve.</p> <p>The players on the whole liked and respected your calls and you had a decent rapport with them.</p>
