





2023 Indoor Nations Cup Draw Information

For the 2023 Nations Cup Tournament the following draw formats will be used for the different divisions.

Women's Division – 4 teams

- There will be a single pool of the 4 teams.
- Preliminary round will be a single round robin.
- There are no consolation games.
- The Championship will be decided on April 6th with 1st place playing 2nd place.

Men's Open Division – 20 teams

- There will be 5 pools of 4 teams.
- Preliminary round will be a single round robin.
- The 5 champions of each pool will advance along with the 3 top 2nd place teams.
- Should the tie breaker be needed the process will be applied following the final Open Division games on April 2nd.
- The draw for the seeding of the quarter finals will occur on April 2nd.
 - The top three 2nd place teams advancing will be drawn and placed on the schedule. No 2nd place team will play another 2nd place team.
 - The five 1st place teams will be drawn and placed on the schedule. No teams from the same pool will meet in the quarter finals. If a team is drawn that would be placed with a 2nd place team from its group, the 1st place team will be placed in the next opening on the draw. The next 1st place team drawn will then be placed in the first opening bracket on the draw.

Men's Master Division - 12 teams

- There will be 3 pools of 4 teams each.
- Preliminary round will be a single round robin.
- The 3 champions of each pool and the top 2nd place team will advance.
- There are no consolation games.
- Should the tie breaker be needed the process will be applied following the final Master Division games on April 2nd.
- The semifinals will be a drawn on Sunday, April 2nd.

TIE BREAKING RULE

- 5.2.1. If two (2) teams are initially tied on points, then the tournament tie breaking process will be used to decide the final standings.
 - 5.2.1.1. Results against each other.
 - 5.2.1.2. Goal difference in all group matches.
 - 5.2.1.3. Greatest number of goals scored in all group matches.
 - 5.2.1.4. Penalty Kicks or drawing of lots by the Tournament Committee
- 5.2.2. If two or more second place teams are equal, and the playoff round is not filled, their ranking shall be decided as follows:
 - 5.2.2.1. Greatest number of points in group matches.
 - 5.2.2.2. Goal difference resulting from the group matches.
 - 5.2.2.3. Most goals scored.
 - 5.2.2.4. Penalty Kicks or drawing of lots by the Tournament Committee.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Reminder that when each team was registered that your contact signed a Code of Conduct. That same Code will be signed by each player when they register. Sanctions for game infractions will be applied as outlined in the Code and will not be subject to an appeal. Ensure that your team is aware of the importance of the Code.

It is also important to remember that discipline from the Nations Cup can extend to regular league play.
